1. Total number of questions will be four. First Question will be based on objective questions (True/False, Fill up the blanks, Multiple Choice, Matching etc.) carrying 7 Marks and Three more questions with 6 Marks each with internal choice format requiring comprehensive coverage of entire Unit 1 (Data Processing, Networking and Recent Trends in Computing) and Unit 5 (Database Management System (Theory)) and probably two questions from Unit 1 and one question from Unit 5.

2. The Practical based on Word Processing should be based on Formatting Document, Table & Shading, Bullets & Numbering for Document Preparation, Mail Merged Document, etc.
3. The Practical based on Presentations should include maximum 3 slides covering less text and focused on Numbering/Bullets, Clip Art, Picture, Animation, Transition, etc.
4. The worksheet functions for “Unit IV: Spreadsheet and its Business Applications” to be covered, should be based on the projects given in the syllabus i.e. Loan and Lease Statement; Ratio Analysis; Payroll Statements; Capital Budgeting; Constraint Optimization, Assignment Problems, Depreciation Accounting; Graphical Representation of Data; Frequency Distribution and its Statistical Parameters; Correlation and Regression Analysis. Use of correct worksheet functions with accuracy and generalization of the work sheet is must. Students are also required to use the proper format depending upon data used in the question.

5. The practical based on DBMS Software should cover Table creation with the field name conventions and choosing data type, setting field properties, setting relation, lookup properties, validation rule including constraints across fields and it must include creation of the Forms, Reports based on grouping, and Queries from multiple tables based on 2 to 3 conditions.
