#### 1. A Brief Introduction to the Department:

- Commerce, has taken prominence in recent years leaving no field of study and research left
  untouched. The discipline of Commerce is used throughout the world as an essential tool in

- The Department of Commerce was started in Kalindi College in the year 1977, with one section of B. Com (Prog.) and only one lecturer Ms. Manju Gambhir. The department kept expanding with time, with one more section of B.Com (Prog.) being introduced later, and subsequently more faculty members joined.
- In the year 1998, B.Com. (Hons.) was introduced in the college with one section. Many activities have been introduced in the Commerce Department since its inception. It has flourished in academic and cultural activities. Today it is considered as one of the well-established departments of the University of Delhi.
