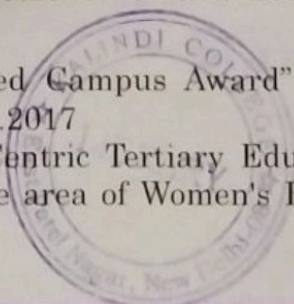

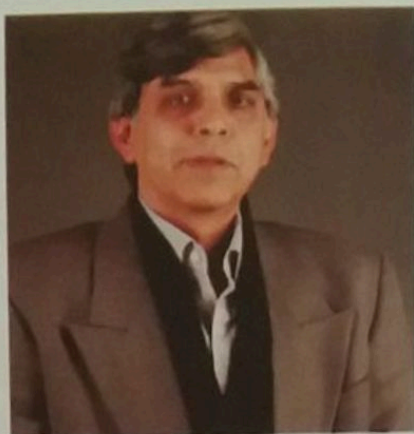

## Introduction : Chief Guest



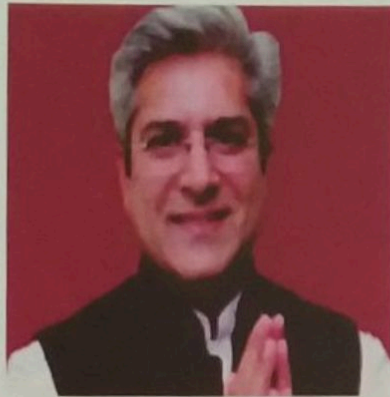
### Padam Shri (Prof.) Dinesh Singh

Prof. Dinesh Singh is the former Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi who has been conferred with the Padma Shri which is the fourth highest civilian award in India. Singh started his career as Lecturer at St. Stephen's College, University of Delhi in 1981. Thereafter he joined Department of Mathematics, University of Delhi in 1987. He was the Head, Department of Mathematics in University of Delhi from December, 2004 to September, 2005. He served the University of Delhi as a Director, South Campus from 2005-2010. He officiated briefly as Pro Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi, before being appointed Vice Chancellor on 29 October 2010.

He is also regarded as an innovator, radical thinker and inspirational leader who can mesmerise multitudes with his oratorical skills in English, Hindi and Urdu. He also speaks Gujarati fluently. Professor Dinesh Singh is also an avowed admirer of Mahatma Gandhi and an acclaimed painter as well as a passionate student of philosophy and history. No wonder then that some of his admirers have dubbed him the 'Renaissance Man' which is a compliment pertaining the academic stream of Humanities, although he academically belongs to the field of Mathematics. His areas of specialization include Functional analysis, Operator Theory, and Harmonic analysis.

He is adjunct professor at the University of Houston and has also taught at Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi and Indian Statistical Institute, Delhi. He is noted for being the founder of Cluster Innovation Centre at University of Delhi, an inter-disciplinary, first of its kind research centre particularly promoting undergraduate research. He is a rare combination of a man with visionary ideas which he transforms into reality with decisive and effective action. Hailed widely as a visionary leader and policy maker, Dinesh Singh has also been termed a 'rockstar Vice Chancellor' and an exceptional mathematician.

In 2002 Shri Gautam Ji was entrusted with the post of the National General Secretary of the Samata Sainik Dal which he diligently undertook for eight years. Due to the endeavours of Shri Gautam Ji, Samata Sainik Dal was awarded the Dr. Ambedkar Ratna Award by the Honorable President in the year 2017. Not only this, the Samata Sainik Dal had a special contribution in declaring 26-Alipur road as a national monument.

This centre takes up the initiative of Exchange of students for training programme to explore biodiversity of North Eastern states. The college has started two vocational degree

courses namely B.Voc. (Printing Technology) and B.Voc.(Web Designing) in this academic session, which are running successfully under the leadership of Nodal Officer Dr. Pankaj Kumar. Dainik Jagran and Sisoft Technology Pvt.Ltd. are respectively the industry partners for B.Voc. Printing Technology and Web Designing respectively. Besides 17 courses in Humanities, Commerce and Science disciplines, college also offers coveted professional degree courses in Computer Science and Journalism, and 5 contemporary add-on Certificate Courses in Foreign Languages: French and Chinese, Video Production and Photo journalism, Travel and Tourism, Communication Skills and Personality Development. The college is successfully running Non-collegiate centre of women education board (NCWEB), under the leadership of Ms. Vandana Rani. In this academic session, with a team of 41 dedicated teachers, this centre is imparting quality education to 1234 students of B.A.(Prog.) and B.Com.(Prog.) courses. The college is also running the School of Open Learning Center (SOL) wonderfully, under the leadership of Mr. Noorul Haq and Mr. Amit Gupta. In this academic session, with a team of 37 dedicated teachers, SOL is imparting education to more than 2500 students of B.A.(Prog.). Kalindi College is nourishing its young learners through innovative and prolific education tools and in return the outstanding achievements of our students have always added brilliance and glory to the college. Year after years, our students are bringing laurels to the college by securing University Ranks, other prizes and winning Gold, Silver and Bronze medals in International, National and State Level Sports Championships. I feel proud to announce that academic session 2017-2018 has been extremely successful and satisfying in terms of accomplishments and accolades in scholastic, co-scholastic and infrastructural development areas. As, I have already mentioned that we have reformed our infrastructure significantly by completing 31 major infrastructure projects namely- new Chemistry Lab, Journalism Lab, Teaching-Research and Innovation Block, Amphitheatre, complete renovation of Administrative Block, Theme Park, August Kranti Park, Saraswati Park, Buddha park, Butterfly Park, Beautification of entrance, installation of Fire extinguishers, History stone, renovation of Botany and Zoology Museums, Convention centre and students Amenities Block, Sports utility centre with all modern facilities, Gymnasia, covering of open area of science block, additional security gate, construction of Parking area, additional rooms at first and second floor in science block, additional CCTV cameras, renovation of Toilets in Science block, Construction of Cyber Centre and Teachers Cyber Centre, UGC Resource cum Research & Innovation Room, Medical Cum Psychologist Room, IQAC Room, IBSD Room and Solar system Project. The TRI block, Administrative Block, Library and Science Block Entrance have provision of ramps to facilitate the differently able students. All along one side of the parking area, Gulmohar Trees & Neem Trees have been planted alternatively, to provide shelter and soothing look to the parking area. I would like to share that the Solar System project on the open roof top of the TRI block and Academic Block of the college, installed under IPGCL Scheme, is successfully generating 61 Kilo Watt Power. The project has been undertaken by **Hero Solar Energy Pvt. Ltd**, New Delhi. The MoU has been signed for 25 Years. This project has reduced the power consumption in the college to a great extent. I am pleased to inform you all that the Project of construction of Girls Hostel, at the back side of amphitheater, in the Playground has started. The hostel will comprise of 80 rooms with 240 beds. The college has received the grant from the University of Delhi and the work is going on, through PWD. The entire Kalindi College will always remain grateful to former Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi, Prof. Dinesh Singh, for providing the complete funding for this Hostel. The dream of Prof. Dinesh Singh to have a Girls' Hostel in Kalindi College

is going to come true very soon. The hostel is expected to be completed by next academic year. Kalindi College has made an unprecedented discernible progress in terms of infrastructural development and overall growth that has resulted into its securing a position among the best colleges of University of Delhi. This spate of growth must be acclaimed to former Vice Chancellor Prof. Dinesh Singh because whenever we required money for the development of Infrastructure in the college, he supported us whole heartedly. We are profoundly grateful to Prof. Singh for complete funding for Teachers' Cyber Centre, Chemistry Lab, Journalism Multimedia Studio, Gymnasia, Girl's hostel etc. in our college. Kalindi College, as a conglomerate of its staff and students, are appreciative of Prof. Singh's contribution as well as indefatigable support towards the development of the college.

Five eminent speakers spoke on various aspects of the paper, addressing a gathering of 44 participants, all teachers from different institutions. The Programme was a grand success. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell and the Science departments organized an Inter college workshop for the Laboratory staff members across all the colleges in the University of Delhi on 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> March, 2018. The objective of the workshop was to impart the knowledge about various general concerns like safety and security of laboratory staff, goods procurement and stock maintenance, basic computer literacy and soft skills as well as to strengthen their core technical area. I thank Coordinators – Dr. Ruchi Tyagi and Dr. Divya Verma and their team for this wonderful and useful programme.

Under the leadership of Dr. Seema Sahdev and Dr. Manish Kumar, the ECO CLUB of Kalindi College runs in coordination with the Department of Environment, Govt of NCT of Delhi. It plays an important role in creating environmental awareness through various competitions, seminars, panel discussions and creative field activities pertaining to environmental sustainability like -plantation drives, Pollution control waste disposal, handling of Paper Recycling Unit etc. Eco-Club observed "World Water Day" on 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2018 by organizing a workshop on 'Water Treatment and Water Quality'. The campaign was to sensitize the students for plantation and protection of plants so as to protect mother Earth from various types of pollution and to counter climate change and global warming. I congratulate Dr. Seema Sahdev and Dr. Manish Kumar for successfully running this club.

The Social Responsibility Cell (SRC) of Kalindi College is highly active and requires special mention in this Annual report for its brilliant ongoing projects for the welfare of underprivileged members of the society. Connecting Dreams Foundation (CDF) of Kalindi College is operative since March 2017. It aims at providing education to underprivileged children in schools. CDF Kalindi in association with SRC started its first project 'DREAM KEY LIBRARY' in April 2017 under which a library was constructed in Khalsa School, RK Ashram. The library has all types of books for children. On the last page of each book, a postcard was attached on which the children were supposed to write a moral lesson they learnt from the book and one dream of their choice. The dreams of these kids were then connected by volunteers of SRC through



donation camps, personal donation and donation from teachers. In total the SRC has been able to connect around 150 individual dreams of the students and found immense pleasure by seeing smiles on their innocent faces. In September 2017, the social responsibility cell came up with its second project 'KILKARI'. Under this project, the children living on streets are chosen by the R&D team, and then their families are counseled about the importance of education and they are then admitted to the nearest government schools under 'Right to Education'. A KILKARI Pathshala was also introduced for children so that they are able to read and write. The Kilkari pathshala in the slum areas of Jhandewalan with a strength of around 20 kids, is being conducted every 4 days in a week, where a team of volunteers teach main subjects like English, Maths, Hindi and EVS/GK/Moral Science. In the second phase of project Kilkari, a team of 8 volunteers conducts the Kilkari pathshala in the slum areas of Todapur, Inderpuri and Patel Nagar, having a strength of 40 children in each centre. In January 2018, the SRC started its third project, 'MASOOM' for the community of special people who need a lot of attention. They lack equality, respect, love, and affection. The project Masoom is an initiative under which the team spends some time with the mentioned community and work towards their welfare and development. The fourth project of SRC in collaboration with ENACTUS is the Project- Rehmat, which aims to improve the plight of manual scavengers, a much-neglected community. In the event of increasing number of deaths being reported in newspapers and television, students of ENACTUS Kalindi contemplated this project wherein safety kits comprising gumboots, gloves etc. are being prepared and distributed to the community of manual scavengers. I feel proud to share that the teaching and non-teaching staff of Kalindi College joined hands to support project Rehmat by donating generously for the cause and providing seed money amounting to Rs. 29,430/- for the project. Manual scavengers across the nation remove human and animal excreta from the streets; and clean septic tanks, sewers and gutters. This inhuman occupation has been banned by the constitution for the past 13 years but it is still being practiced on a large scale. To protect these cleaning soldiers of our nation, Enactus Kalindi came up with Project REHMAT. All the 4 Projects are going wonderfully. I congratulate Convenor SRC - Ms. Indu Choudhary for her wonderful contribution for this cell.

The Central Placement Cell "Kryptus" of Kalindi College is exceptionally energetic. In this session, in collaboration with T.I.M.E.'s group, it conducted, a three day workshop in the college, in October 2017. Under the Placement Cell, in November 2017, the "Outlook group" conducted Internship Drive for the sales & marketing posts, in which 25 students were successfully recruited. Further, in January 2018, placement drive was conducted by Jai Steel Faciliation Pvt. Ltd., where 12 students were selected. In January 2018, another placement drive was conducted by the Global Arcus group, in which 3 students were placed successfully. In February 2018, Freshman Adda, conducted an Internship drive in which 6 students were selected. On 27<sup>th</sup> February 2018, the Placement Cell organised its first ever mega event – "The Internship Fair 2018", where 20 companies like Sharekhan, VQMS and NGOs like Youwecan, Upay were invited. More than 250 students including students from other DU colleges participated in the internship fair. The Internship Fair observed over 490 online and offline registrations by the enthusiastic students. The Placement Cell has collaborated with GTT-Nasscom for a "Mentoring Programme" by the HR team of Barclays involving around 25 third year students on 21-22<sup>nd</sup> March 2018 for job opportunities. I congratulate Convener - Ms. Indu Choudhary, Co-convener - Dr. Pankaj Kumar and 15 newly injected student members of this Cell for successful functioning of this unit in the college.

Kalindi College offers a Parent-Teacher-Student Interface (PTSI), to facilitate parental participation in the college for the welfare of the students. On 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2017 & 7<sup>th</sup> April 2018, Parent Teacher interactive sessions (PTM) were held in college to communicate to parents the strengths and weakness of their children and how to improve upon their child's

performance in the college. I am thankful to Convener Dr. Seema Sahdev, Co-convener Dr. Anjula Bansal and members Dr. Renu Bala, Dr. Manjulata, Dr. Alka and Dr. Nidhi Kapoor for their sincere efforts in this regard.

I feel extremely proud to announce that Dr. Pushpa Bindal of Physics Department has received "Award for College Lecturer 2017-2018" from Directorate of Education, Government of Delhi. I feel proud to share that Dr. Manjulata of Sanskrit Department, is awarded with "Sanskrit Samaradhak Sammanpatr" by Delhi Sanskrit Academy. In this session, a 10-day workshop on the theme "Media, Gender and Human Rights" was organized from 14<sup>th</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2017. On August 24, 2017 an Interactive session with alumni Ms Preeti Wakadikar and Ms Priyanka Gupta was organized. A Workshop on "Media coverage of German Elections, 2017" with Jaroschewski and Petra Sorge (freelancer) from Germany was held on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2017. Screening of the documentary - "*Izzat Nagri ki Asabhyta Betiyan*" was held on 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2017. Photography and Film society 'Encore' conducted a photo-walk with the theme 'Street Photography' in Chandni Chowk area of Delhi on September 3, 2017. On December 12, 2017 a photo-walk was organised with the theme 'Landscape

photography' at Humayun tomb. Various Guest Lectures of eminent speakers were organized. Workshop on 'Visual story telling' was held on February 12, 2018. Two films 'Delhi Untouched' and 'She-Heroes' by our students Tarang Goyal and Lubna Anjum, were short listed and highly appreciated, in CHITRA BHARATI FILM FESTIVAL, organized at Siri Fort Auditorium from February 19<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup>, 2018, I congratulate Dr. Sunita and Dr. Nivedita Giri for excellently handling Journalism Department.

Commemorating the 62nd Mahapari-nirvan-diwas of Babasahab, the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Study Centre of the college was inaugurated by International Bodh Dharam Guru and Chief of Royal White Monastery Europe, Hungary and Nepal - Acharya Guru Karma Tanpai and Ms. Rakhi Birla, Deputy Speaker, Delhi Legislative Assembly on 6th December, 2017. I am extremely indebted to all the previous and present Governing Body Chairman's and members, for their continuous


cooperation and active support, in every possible way, for overall growth and development in the college and for helping me in every possible way for running the college smoothly.

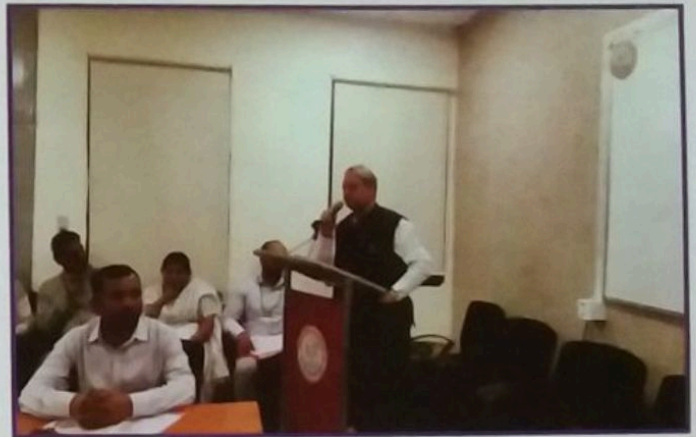

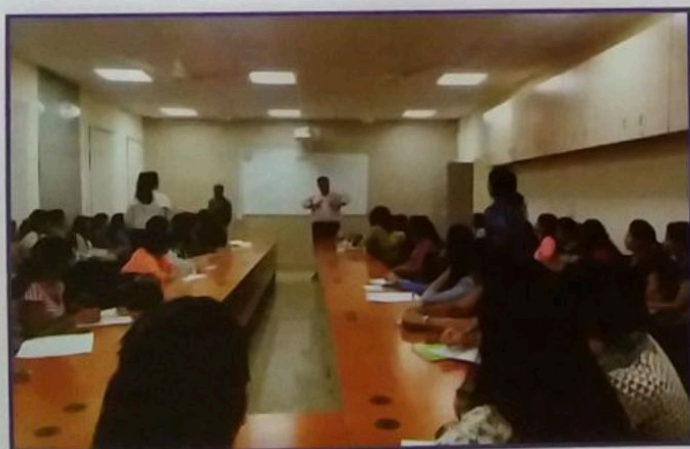

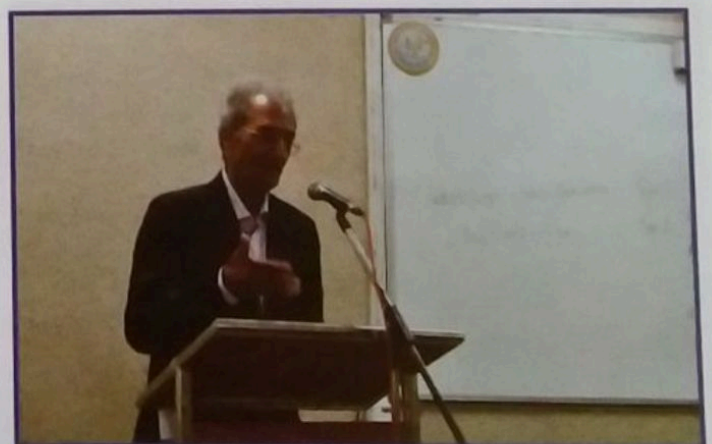

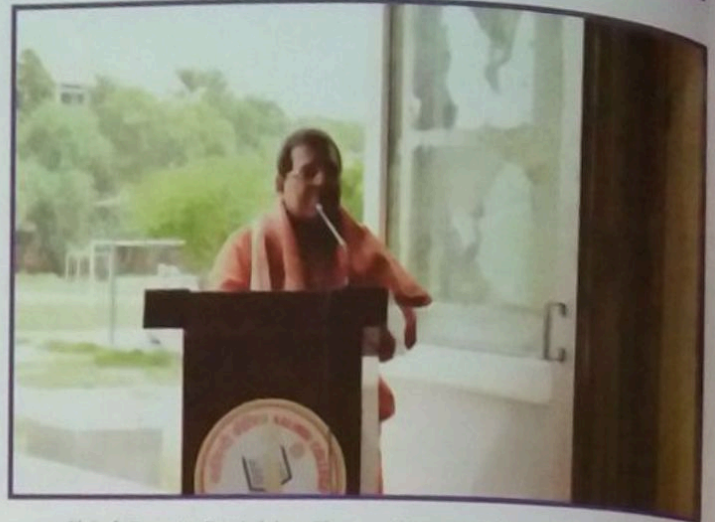

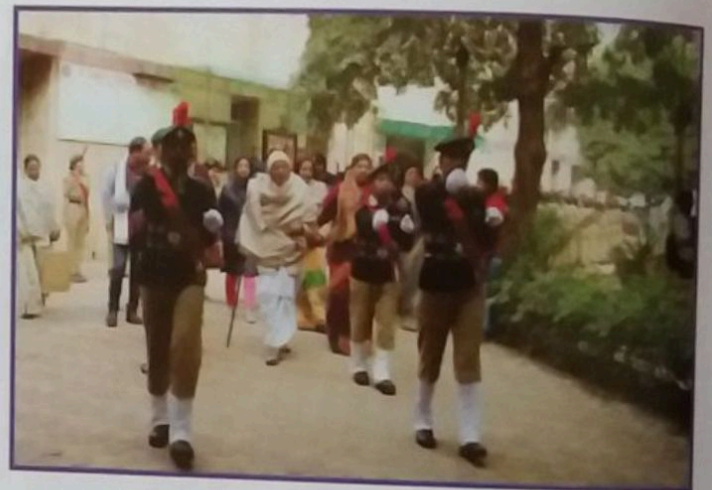

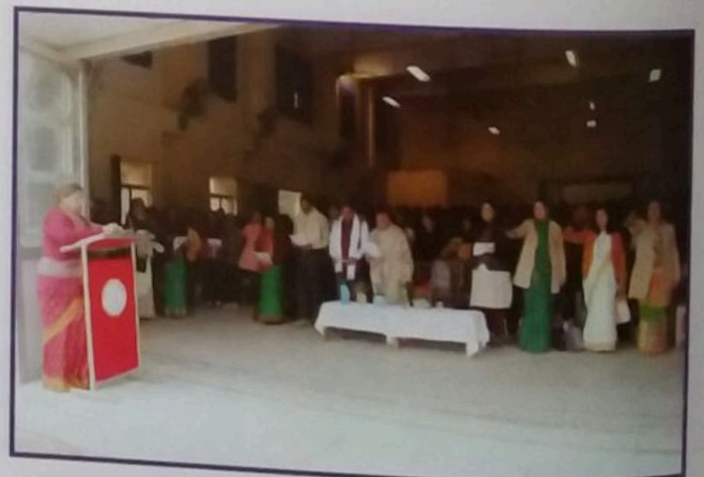

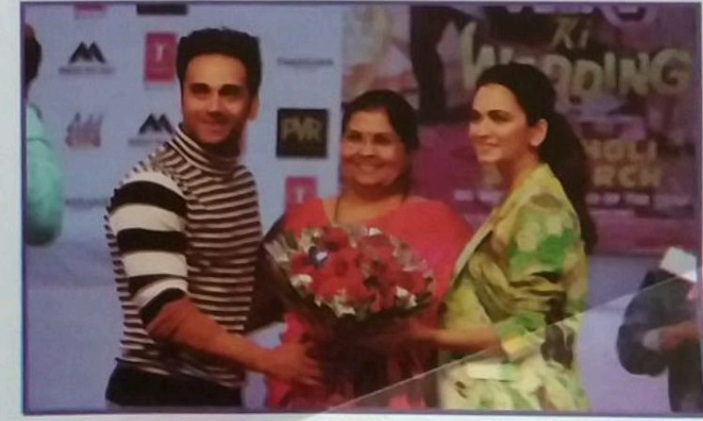

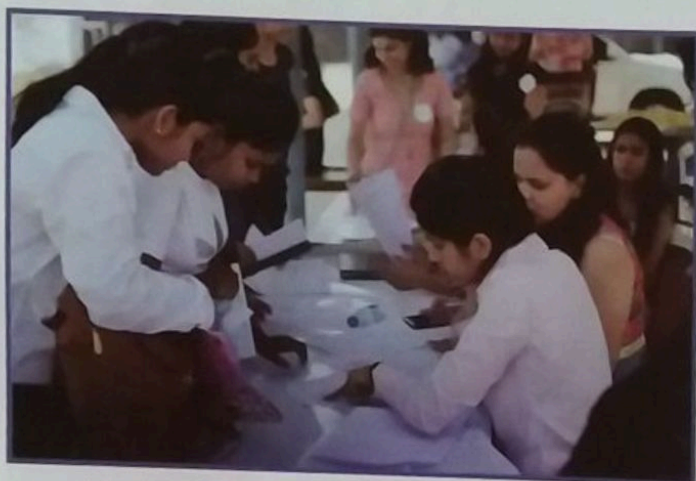

## **Faculty Development Programme on DCE Optional Paper: Literature and Cinema**

**Convener: Monica Zutshi**

A one-day Faculty Development Programme on the newly introduced Discipline Centered Elective optional paper in the BA(H) English III year syllabus entitled **Literature and Cinema** was organized by the English Department, Kalindi College, University of Delhi on 16<sup>th</sup>

February 2018. There were five eminent speakers who spoke on various aspects of the paper, addressing a gathering of 44 participants, all teachers from different institutions. Towards the end of the day, the participants brainstormed in groups to create a question bank.

The first session was on “Adaptation as a Discipline” where Dr. Anuradha Ghosh spoke about adaptation still being a nascent discipline, which was expansive enough to accommodate the larger strokes of the process and ideology of cinematic adaptations as much as it could look at a comparative study of the literary with its cinematic translation.

Dr. Poonam Trivedi took up the next session on cinematic adaptations of Shakespeare’s *Romeo and Juliet* in her presentation “What’s in a word/ image?” where she not only examined the versions directed by Franco Zeffirelli and Baz Luhrmann, but also compared them to Indian cinematic adaptations of the play.

In her paper entitled “Cinematic Ways of Seeing” Dr. Karen Gabriel addressed the technological and ideological aspects of cinema. She spoke about how the language of cinema was not only created by technology but was also informed by the choices that are fundamentally ideological and political. She also focused on the differences that are found in the business aspects of Hollywood and Bollywood, which are gradually being erased.

Dr. Dilip Basu traces the evolution of spy films from its conceptual beginnings to the James Bond movies in his presentation “Evolution of Spy Films with Reference to *From Russia with Love*”. He spoke about this genre of movies and how the language of film transformed literary conventions to the cinematic, the latter becoming a more entrenched stereotype in the popular imagination.

In “The Transgressive Body: Women in Partition Films”, Dr. Debjani Sengupta showed clips of different Bollywood films to examine stereotypes around religion that were created around the Partition in North India. She also briefly demonstrated the subtler effects of the Partition upon the individual’s psyche translated into cinematic language in Ritwik Ghatak’s oeuvre.

In the final session of the day before the Valedictory, the participants were divided into groups and each group brainstormed to come up with questions which may act as pointers for the lecturers teaching the particular text/ topic. The question bank was later compiled and sent to all the participants who helped to make it. The Faculty Development Programme concluded with the Principal, Dr. Anula Maurya, thanking the resource persons and giving the certificates to all the participants.

## **Skill Enhancement Intercollege Workshop for Laboratory staff: Organized by IQAC and Science Departments, Kalindi College**

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell and the Science departments organized an Inter college workshop for the Laboratory staff members across all the colleges in the University of Delhi on 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> March, 2018. The objective of the workshop was to impart the knowledge about various general concerns like **safety and security of laboratory staff, goods procurement and stock maintenance, basic computer literacy and soft skills** as well as to strengthen their core technical area. The workshop was inaugurated by **Professor Ramesh Chandra, Head, Department of Chemistry** (University of Delhi); Former Vice-Chancellor, Bundelkhand University, Jhansi. He highlighted the issues present in the laboratories of various colleges and departments and brought to light the safety standards used in world class laboratories. **Report:** In this project, we adopted a well-known "Prism Coupling Technique" to characterize an optical waveguide. In this method, a laser beam coming out of a prism is coupled into a planar dielectric waveguide (a very thin film of silver nitrate coated on both sides of plane glass plate), which were seen as distinct spots travelling through the waveguide and are focused on a white screen in form of vertical curved lines. The number of lines on the screen represented the number of guided modes the waveguide supports. The project beautifully establishes the physics and concept of normal modes to students.

Women as a 'category' or as a 'group' in comparison to 'men' have been relegated to margins due to systemic and structural discrimination within the society. Different communities may have different experiences of

being excluded but increasingly it is being recognized that it might be wiser to provide and empower the groups to identify their own problems and support them to develop the tools to address the issues that cause them concern. The rationale of doing this project is to understand the issues and problems faced by the marginalized students in girls' colleges of University of Delhi specially those coming from other ethnic community particularly from the North-Eastern Region of India also the study will include the state policies for their protection and integration in the society.

College offers Governing Body approved Short Term Add-on Courses with the objective of equipping the students with skills that give them added benefits and an edge in the intensely competitive job market of today's world.

### **Certificate Course in Foreign Language- French**

#### **Convener: Ms. Sonia Kamboj**

The certificate course in French language is conducted in collaboration with the department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi. This department sends the joining letters of teachers to the college but their salary is paid by the college. The college follows the University Calendar in all matters related to academics. The annual examination is held in April and the students are required to fulfill all criteria laid down by the respective departments. The duration of the course is one year and minimum of 67% attendance is compulsory to take the University Exam

There are 76 students in 2017-2018 in French certificate course. Classes are held in two batches. Batch-1 is taught by Mr. Pawan Kumar and Batch-2 by Ms. Sujata Anand. Classes are held as per schedule: Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday (Batch-1 by Mr. Pawan Kumar) and Monday, Wednesday and Friday (Batch-2 by Ms. Sujata Anand) from 3:00pm to 5:00pm.

### **Certificate Course in Foreign Language- Chinese**

#### **Convener: Ms. Charu Khanna (Odd Semester) and Dr. Manju Sharma (Even Semester)**

Kalindi College introduced an add-on one-year Certificate Course in Chinese with the approval of Department of East Asian Studies in 2016-17. A total of 18 students were admitted. Faculty was sent by the Department of East Asian Studies and classes are being held in the college thrice a week. The course is run under the guidelines set by Department of East Asian Studies, University of Delhi, for conducting part time courses in colleges. First internal assessment of CP I for 50 marks was conducted in November. The answer sheets were sent to the Department of East Asian Studies for evaluation and the result of the same was put up on the notice board for students. The second unit test (oral) for 50 marks was conducted in February 2017. These tests are conducted for the purpose of calculation of internal assessment marks. The final exam would be conducted in March-April 2018, comprising of two written papers (100 marks each) of 3 hours duration.

## **Certificate Course in Travel & Tourism**

A certificate course on Travel and Tourism was introduced in the Department of Geography in the year 2016 for imparting theoretical as well as practical training on Travel and Tourism to the aspiring candidates who wish to choose their career in this field. Our main motive was to help and prepare our young talents to get suitable employment in a period of scarce job opportunities.

In the year 2017 the second batch in this certificate course was started and 23 students out of 25 seats were admitted. This batch is also attending their classes and the course is running successfully. The examination for this batch is scheduled in the month of April 2018 end and we hope to complete the schedule in the right time.

## **Certificate Course in Photo Journalism**

**Convener: Ms. Salma Rehman**

The classes for the add-on course on Photojournalism, started by the Kalindi College in collaboration with the RK Films and Media Academy, commenced on 9<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. The classes are being conducted on every Wednesday (3:00 pm to 5:00 pm) and Saturday (1:00 pm to 3:00 pm) of the week in the college. There are a total number of 16 students who have enrolled for the course. A portion of the practical classes were also conducted by the RK Film and Media Academy in their Studio based in Karol Bagh. The course which initially dealt with the basics of photography (and photography) progressed to an advanced aspect of outdoor practices/ shoots and studio-based projects. The focus was kept more on making the students comfortable with the equipment and shooting in challenging situations. The latter half of the course was dedicated to post-production (lab-based editing session) and ethical concerns surrounding photojournalism, to make the students aware about the rights and responsibilities of a photojournalist.

The students were also taken on photo walks to national Zoological Park, Lodi Garden, Potter's Village (Uttamnagar), Humayun's Tomb, Qutub Minar, Old Delhi, Delhi Haat (INA) and Connaught Place (for street photography session) during the course. Special sessions for smoke photography and product photography were also conducted.

The evaluation process is based on photo project (100 marks), viva (50 marks, based on the project) and a written examination (comprising objective +subjective question, of 50 marks and of one and half hour duration).

The Add-on Course on "Communication Skills and Personality Development" was inaugurated in partnership with Englitude with a batch of 25 students. The classes began in September, 2017 and catered to the proficiency levels of three level of students - Advanced, Intermediate and Basic. The volunteers have further planned a visit to Arya Mahila Ashram, an old age home in the end of March and the NSS Annual Fest- NEEV in beginning of April, 2018.

## **Social Responsibility Cell**

Connecting Dreams Foundation (CDF), Kalindi College chapter, operative since March 2017, aims at providing education to underprivileged children in schools. In order to realize the dreams of children, CDF Kalindi in association with the Social Responsibility Cell (SRC) started its first project 'DREAM KEY LIBRARY' in April 2017 under which a library was constructed in Khalsa School, RK Ashram. The library had all types of books for children like story books, educational books, magazines etc. On the last page of each book, a postcard was attached on which the children were supposed to write a moral lesson they learnt from the book and one dream of their choice. The added postcards acted as an incentive for a child to read the book and add his dream i.e. what he dreams to have (be it a toy, pencil box) to the dream box. The dreams of these kids were then connected by volunteers of SRC. It has been able to connect around 150 dreams through donation camps, personal donation and donation from teachers. In addition, it also completed one school dream which was to have a 'playroom' in the school. For this purpose, one classroom was decorated by painting the walls and making it a fun place. In community dream, the SRC volunteers contacted the MCD office of the area and complained about the improper road in front of the school and

got the road improved. In every visit to the school, the team of SRC added new books to the library and filtered the dreams. In total the SRC has been able to connect around 150 individual dreams of the students and found immense pleasure by seeing smiles on their innocent faces. This little contribution helped those children fulfill their long-lost dreams. The further goals under the project is to complete another community dream which is to make a handmade cost-efficient water filter for the people living on the roads near Jhandewalan metro station.

In September 2017, the social responsibility cell came up with its second project 'KILKARI'. Under project Kilkari, the children living on streets are chosen by the R&D team, their families are counseled about the importance of education and they are then admitted to the nearest government schools under 'Right to Education'. However, taking into consideration the increasing dropout rates, a KILKARI pathshala was introduced to make every child compatible enough to be able to read and write. A Kilkari pathshala in the slum areas of Jhandewalan with a strength of around 20 kids is being conducted every 4 days in a week where a team of volunteers teach main subjects like English, Maths, Hindi and EVS/GK/Moral Science to make the base of a child even stronger. To initiate a fun atmosphere of learning, the volunteers regularly show small video clips in order to teach Moral Science to develop a feeling of interest in the younger generation.

After the successful operation of Kilkari pathshala, it was expanded even further. In order to do so, the SRC collaborated with NGOs Youth for Sewa and Sewa Bharti to inspire those who once completely shattered hopes to study and be educated. This is the second phase of project Kilkari where a team of 8 volunteers conducts the Kilkari pathshala in the slum areas of Todapur, Inderpuri and Patel Nagar having a strength of 40 children in each centre. As a part of recreational activity, dance classes also being conducted regularly in the centres. Thus, after much determination and hardwork, Kilkari pathshala with the help of 20 volunteers has successfully been able to make a positive impact on the lives of more than 120 unattended children living on the streets, deprived of even their basic right- 'Education' and after 3 months, the SRC volunteers have been able to achieve its desired result which was to improve the basics of every child in the centre. Also, 47 children of Jhandewalan slums have successfully been admitted into the nearest government school. The future plan of action in Kilkari is to expand it to maximum areas of Delhi and NCR and establishing an

advance framework i.e. teaching the Level 2 syllabus to the kids as a part of development and innovation.

In January 2018, the SRC started its third project, 'MASOOM'. Interaction with a lot of organisations and day to day experiences made the team realize that the community of special people needs a lot of attention. They lack equality, respect, love, affection and they are denied the acceptance and emotions that every human being on this Earth deserves. Therefore, the SRC started an initiative under which the team can spend some time with the mentioned community and work towards their welfare and development. After much interaction and brainstorming, the team focused on these 3 areas under Masoom. The first area is making them aware of who they are and the basics of the world around them. For example, a module is developed, where the volunteers go and conduct sessions on various must-know topics like identification of the number of fingers, differentiating between a 10 rupee and a 100 rupee note, knowing basic math and topics on similar lines. The second area is teaching them various basic skills like how to hold a ball tight, how to tie shoe laces, how to walk straight, how to shake hands and more and the last area is conducting extra-curricular activities like dance and craft to unleash their hidden talent. A total of 5 volunteers are handling these 3 areas by conducting sessions three times a week, each session is for two hours. After a successful operation of this project, the volunteers have been able to inculcate a feeling of 'being a normal person' in the minds of special people and also in making them aware of various things such as identification of coins and notes, time and basic skills.

The future plan of action in project 'MASOOM' is to add an entrepreneurship aspect in the project and in order to do so the team has thought of creating products such as 'paper soaps' which will be done solely by special people and the marketing will be done by the Social Responsibility Cell. After selling the product created by them, part of revenue will go towards their wellbeing and part of it will be used by for sustainability of this project. After all, in the end it's all about those little steps that possess an ability to make a difference because we make a living by earning but we make a life by giving.

The fourth project is Project Rehmat of SRC is being undertaken by volunteers of Enactus Kalindi. Project Rehmat has a mission to create a nation where a person does not die for a living. Manual scavengers across the nation remove human and animal excreta from the

streets and dry latrine, cleaning septic tanks, sewers and gutters. This inhuman occupation has been banned by the constitution for the past 13 years but it is still being practiced on a large scale. To protect these cleaning soldiers of our nation, Enactus Kalindi came up with Project REHMAT. Under project Rehmat, the team focuses on 3 aspects: safety, community building and entrepreneurship. Our entrepreneurship aspect has been further divided into two areas. One area focuses on helping the manual scavengers get an opportunity to change their profession and work in different fields. Other aspect is focused towards the wives of these scavengers and other females in the manual scavenging community. We have provided them an opportunity to make paper soaps and become self-sustained entrepreneurs. With the first 90 days of commencement of the project the team sold 12 kits, created community in 3 areas namely Kirti Nagar, Seelampur and Mayur Vihar. When it comes to achievement Enactus Kalindi team has bagged first prize in the Social B-Plan competition held at NSIT Delhi and second prize in B-Plan competition held at JIMS Kalkaji. We have also received an order of over 100 kits from the manual scavengers in Delhi. Our future plan of action includes conducting awareness campaigns, further sale of safety kits and paper soaps and providing more employment opportunities to manual scavengers. This is just the beginning of the beautiful journey we have embarked upon to bring a change in lives of these heroes of dirt. The Social Responsibility Cell of Kalindi College is determined to always do the best it can to create a difference!

## **Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Study Center**

The dream of **Ambedkar Study Centre of Kalindi College (University of Delhi)**, the first of its kind in Delhi University, met reality in the year 2017. The Centre is committed towards preserving and propagating the vision and mission of Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar. While focusing on the relevance of Baba Saheb's relentless struggle for social justice and his peerless ideas on human rights and constitutional reforms, the centre strives for creating inter-disciplinary discussions and engaging academicians, civil society and masses for addressing common concerns. The centre has also organised Baba Saheb Memorial Lectures in the past to celebrate the legacy of Baba Saheb and to replicate his ideas in the present context.

Commemorating the 52nd Mahaparinirvan diwas of Babasahab, the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Study Centre was inaugurated at College, on 6<sup>th</sup> December, 2017 followed by a two-day National Seminar on "Dr. Ambedkar on Women's Rights in India: Issues and Prospects" in collaboration with Dr. Ambedkar Chair in Social Justice, Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA), was organized on this occasion on 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> December, 2017. The

seminar, which was attended by a number of eminent dignitaries, research scholars and students, deliberated on crucial issues related to discrimination and marginalisation of women in the Indian society while drawing inspirations from the ideas and teachings of Dr. B R Ambedkar.

The seminar commenced under the guidance of Honorable Principal of Kalindi College Dr Anula Maurya and was conducted by the Convenors Dr Sunita and Ms Manisha was the Co-convener of the event. International Bodh Dharam Guru and Chief of Royal White Monastery Europe, Hungary and Nepal Acharya Guru Karma Tanpai, was the chief guest for the event where as Ms. Rakhi Birla, Deputy Speaker, Delhi Legislative Assembly was the guest of honour. Prof C. Sheela Reddy, Dr. Ambedkar chair in Social Justice, Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) introduced the idea and the theme of the seminar and Prof. Vivek Kumar, School of Social Sciences, JNU delivered the key note on the occasion. Dr OP Yadav, Chief News Editor, Doordarshan News, Delhi and Mr. Vishesh Ravi, MLA of Karol Bagh constituency, were other dignitaries present in the inaugural ceremony.

Remembering the contribution of Dr. Ambedkar in the upliftment of women, Principal Dr. Anula Maurya said that Baba Saheb ensured that the women receive education and live with dignity. She added that Ambedkar's contribution towards women's empowerment was at the level of family and Hindu society.

Acharya Tanpai correlated the teachings of Buddha to Dr. Ambedkar's ideology and emphasized on the practice of holy dharma through which one can achieve everlasting peace and freedom at individual level, family level and universally. Prof. Kumar highlighted the "process of reductionism and blackout" of Dr. Ambedkar in the popular discourse and academia. He claimed that Dr. Ambedkar fought against Sati, denial of widow remarriage, and child marriage - the three important institutions through which subjugation of women happened in the Indian society. Identifying Dr. Ambedkar as the major proponent of social justice in modern India, Dr. Reddy said that he "not only worked for the emancipation of Dalits but also upper classes at a time when he himself was facing discrimination and marginalization". Speaking on the occasion, Ms. Birla emphasized the significance to continue the fight for women equality laid down by Dr. Ambedkar that still remains unfulfilled. The Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Study Centre convener, Dr. Sunita Mangla elaborating upon the objective of the seminar said that it is a great platform to raise awareness among women about their constitutional rights and how they can best utilize them in the Indian society.

The seminar was attended by researchers of colleges from University of Delhi, Jamia Millia Islamia, Jawaharlal Nehru University, Aligarh Muslim University, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Central University of Jammu, National University of Educational, Planning and Administration, University of Allahabad, University of Kalyani, West Bengal, Baba Ghulam Shah Badshah University, Jammu, Chaudhary Charan Singh University, Dravidian University, Andhra Pradesh, Amity Law School, Central Institute of Education, University of Delhi, Symbiosis Law School, Ramjas Academic Institute, Directorate of

Education, Govt of NCT Delhi, Govt College of Education, Jammu and Allen house group of colleges, Kanpur.

The seminar received a total of 65 papers, out of which 49 papers were presented during five technical sessions, covering the broader theme of Dr. Ambedkar on Women's Rights in India: Issues and Prospects focused on gender equality in India and sub themes of Ambedkar's vision on women empowerment, Constitutional and legal safeguards for women in India and Dr Ambedkar 's vision on Uniform Civil Code and role of Media in women's development.

Media representatives from Doordarshan News and independent journalists also attended the seminar.

The event concluded with the valedictory session where the participants were awarded by honourable Principal Mam Dr Anula Maurya Mr. Bhoopender Singh Mavi, Chairman of OBC Commission, Govt. of Delhi, who was the Chief guest of the occasion and Dr Abha Yadav, Deputy Registrar, Jawaharlal Nehru University who was the distinguished guest. Dr Rajkumar Fulwaria of Shyama Prasad Mukherji College was also present among the dignitaries during the valedictory session.

## **SC/ST Cell**

- Kalindi College is the first college in Delhi University to start the SC\ST Cell which was inaugurated by the then Vice- Chancellor Prof. Dinesh Singh & Director, South Campus Dr. Umesh Rai in September 2015.
- The Cell started with its first Orientation Programme for the SC, ST students in which following were discussed for the welfare and upliftment of the reserved category students (SC & ST only).
- Problems related to curriculum and Time Table were discussed.
- Awareness created on the new Hostel created for SC & ST Students in Dilshad Garden, admission Forms downloaded and distributed among these students for easy facilitation of admission to these hostels. This was for non-resident students of Delhi.
- The students were briefed on the exemption of payment of Tuition Fees and admission Fees whose parents were not Income Tax payers.
- The students were also briefed on the various Scholarships available to them so that they could help avail the scholarship they were eligible for.
- Counselling was done with the students to help them overcome inferiority complex related to interaction with fellow students and personal grooming, etc.

- Assurance was given to the students on proper support to tackle any problems being faced by them on a one-on-one personal interaction.

Total 8 colleges of Delhi University participated in solo singing and traditional group dance competition.

## **Coaching Classes for SC/ST/OBC and Minority Students**

Special coaching classes are organised for SC/ST/ OBC [noncreamy layer] and Minority students under the XII Plan to improve their academic skills for useful employment and provide them career guidance for competitive examinations. The college has been running this programme successfully in the college.

Presently in the academic session of 2017-18, the college has 3,693 students out of which unreserved category students are UR-2235, OBC-775, SC569, ST-114, and PWD -10. Being a women's college, it provides opportunities to the girl students, the most affordable and quality education at par with other leading colleges of the Delhi University. The College continuously strives to provide all round help and assistance to its students has created excellent infrastructure and offers academic and co-curricular activities in the campus, the college gives utmost importance to facilitate career counseling, placement and other professional help to young and aspiring students who can avail this opportunity to establish career in their life.

In February 2012, the College started the Coaching classes for its registered SC/ST/OBC (excluding creamy layer) and Minorities students under the Merged Scheme of XI Plan, UGC. These classes were attended by enthusiastic students from these backgrounds, who showed keen interest in learning and benefited from professional coaching by experts from their respective fields. About 200 students were benefited from these classes in the academic years 2011-2012, 2012-13 and 2013-14. In addition to coaching classes, these students were provided study materials such as books/ computer facilities, newspaper, competitive magazines and on-line resource materials etc. The faculty members of the college and some experts from outside, who have vast experience in their respective field were engaged as coordinator / instructor. The main focus of the resource person was on to improve the area in which students face difficulties so that the students can compete in different exams. The periodical tests/review and the assessment reports were prepared by the resource persons and the students were apprised about their weakness.

However, due to lack of grants, college unfortunately stopped the coaching classes. In the light of the growing demand for the continuation of coaching classes in the college, the letter has been sent to UGC with a request to release funds & continue this scheme for the benefits of the students.

From the year 2015-2016, the SOL functions were decentralized and now, the college manages the SOL centre at its own level including arrangement of teachers, time table, etc. These classes are held on Sundays and on public holidays, as per the schedule provided by SOL. The centre provides academic, administrative and logistic support during Sundays and holidays and holds examination at the end of the session. The SOL Kalindi College is successfully running under the guidance and supervision of Dr. Anula Maurya (Principal) and Mr. Noorul Haq (Administrative Officer) and is being managed by Mr. Amit Gupta (Section Officer). The Kalindi centre offers B.A.(Prog.) to the students of I, II, and III YEAR (II and III years have been included last year). The centre has helped hundreds of women to realize their dream of higher education and will continue to do in future as well. The college has undertaken this project on the open roof top, in consultation with the Govt of NCT of Delhi. The project has been undertaken by **Hero Solar Energy Pvt. Ltd**, New Delhi, under the project name "**61.75 KWp Grid Connected Solar Power Plant at Kalindi College**", which has been installed under IPGCL Scheme. The design, supply, installation, commissioning, operation and maintenance is being done by Hero Solar Energy Pvt Ltd.

The project is successfully generating 61 KWp in the college. The MoU has been signed for 25 Years. This has reduced the power consumption in the college to a great extent.

### **C. PROJECTS GOING TO START SOON:**

1. **RENOVATION OF SANGAM PARISAR:** The work of renovation and extension of Sangam Parisar is going to be undertaken by PWD. The renovation and extension of the Sangam Parisar will raise the seating capacity of the hall as two storey Balcony would also be added to increase accommodation. Further, the college green rooms, provisions of toilets and rest rooms has also been incorporated alongwith the provision of Centralized AC & PA system.

The same has been inaugurated by His Holiness, the 14<sup>th</sup> Dalai Lama on 28.01.2015. The work is going to start soon by the PWD.

2. **ELECTRIFICATION OF THE CAMPUS**: This project is under consideration with the PWD (Electrical) and shall provide adequate lighting in and around the campus, especially near boundaries of the college, to prevent any unauthorized entry or untoward incidence.
3. **EXTENTION OF LIBRARY**: The College is undertaking the project of extension of Library through PWD wherein it has provided the estimates for construction of Porta Cabin over the floor of the Library Block.  
This would ease the problem of books storage besides providing adequate space in the Library.
4. **IMPROVEMENT OF SEWER SYSTEM**: The College is having old sewer system and therefore, many a times there occurs chocking of the man holes and back flows, especially during rainy season. In order to improve this sewer system, the college has provided the work of improvement of sewer system, keeping in view the newly added building load, to PWD. The work is going to start soon

#### **D. PROJECTS TO BE UNDERTAKEN**

1 **EXTENSION OF SCIENCE BLOCK**: The preliminary estimates of PWD for the construction of G+3 Floor building, in front of Power House, have been approved. The building would provide enough rooms and halls to be utilized as class rooms/ Labs etc. The existing science block shall be joined with the new building.

2. **EXTENTION OF ACADEMIC BLOCK**: The preliminary estimates of PWD for construction of SPS building in place of existing Canteen area has been approved. The building would provide enough space for canteen area along with additional rooms. The new building would be connected with the existing Academic Block.

3. **DEVELOPMENT OF THE SPORTS GROUND**: The college is going to undertake the development project of the Sports Ground through a specialized agency, incorporating the sports equipment's and other facilities in the sports area.

4. **PROVISION OF LIFT**: The College is going to undertake the project of construction of Lift provisions in the Old Academic Area, that would connect Student' s Amenities Block and the Old Building, facilitating the movement of especially abled students. The college is also exploring the possibilities of providing ramps in various buildings in consultation with the PWD.

5. **INSTALLATION OF CCTV**: The College has installed CCTV cameras in the Admin. Block, Academic Block, Sangam Parisar, College Entrance, Science Block etc., which are operational for the last two years. Presently, the college has 54 cameras.

Due to increase in infrastructure i.e. newly constructed TRI Block, Students Amenity Centre, Sports Utility Centre, Parking Area etc., the college requires 40 additional cameras. This project has been finalized and the CCTV would be installed soon in the additional areas.

**6. BEAUTIFICATION OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE BLOCK:** The college is going to undertake the project of installation of Glasses in the Admin. Block front. It would provide the new look to the building.

**7. BEAUTIFICATION OF THE ENTRANCE GATE:** The project of new entrance gate is being undertaken by the college. The project would provide new gate and enhanced security at the entrance.

**8. CENTRALISED PA SYSTEM FOR THE COLLEGE:** The College is exploring the details to provide centralized PA system, for immediate and emergent communication, connecting all class-room with the administration.

## **LIBRARY**

### **LIBRARIAN: MS KARNIKA GAUR**

The library resources have been enhanced during the year **2017-18** and the total collection of the library reached up to **81,889 books** including Book Bank and Student Aided Fund books. The Library users have been able to enlighten themselves by going through the newly added books. At present library is subscribing **106 magazines/journals and 16 newspapers** in English and Hindi languages on different areas of interest for its readers. The library has a web center for access of e-resources, separate reading room for consultation purposes and photocopy facility for the students and staff. The remote login access of e-resources through N-List login ID is also provided by the library.

## **CENTRAL PLACEMENT CELL**

The Placement Cell of Kalindi College, been in existence for quite some time, was rechristened 'Kryptus' in September 2017 with the induction of 15 student members in the placement cell team. The induction of the student council was to have representation of students in the placement cell to better understand their needs and to smooth the channels of communication and information dissemination. As has always been, the foremost focus of the Placement Cell is to provide the undergraduate students of the college with opportunities to intern and get placed in reputed organizations in the private

sector be it multinational companies or the NGOs. A related challenge is to equip students with the skills to face the process of screening and selection used by potential employers.

In October 2017, a three-day workshop was conducted by T.I.M.E.'s group in the college comprising sessions on resume making, group discussion and personal interview by soft skills trainers and experts- Mr. Ankur Jain, Mr. G.N. Mishra and, Mr. Amit Poddar.

In November 2017, team Kryptus felt the necessity to provide students with a practical knowledge of the corporate world before the students could actually step into it. The Outlook group was invited to the college for conducting Internship Drive for the sales & marketing posts. Around 40 students registered for the same. The selection process included group discussion and personal interview. 25 students were successfully recruited by the company for winter internship.

In December 2017, faculty members Ms. NilanshuYaduvanshi and Ms. Indu Choudhary conceptualized and designed the placement brochure with useful inputs from Dr. Anula Maurya, the honourable Principal of Kalindi College and the Teacher In charges of various departments.

In January 2018, placement drive was conducted by Jai Steel FaciliationPvt. Ltd, a leading business & service provider offering job profiles related documentation, business development and support. 25 students appeared for the interview out of which 12 students were selected and placed successfully.

Further, in January 2018, another placement drive was conducted by the Global Arcus group offering job profile of management consultant & senior manager. Amongst 24 students who appeared for the interview, 3 students were placed successfully.

To further hone the skills of students and to boost their confidence, the Placement Cell organized a mock interview session and mock group discussions for the third-year students to help them get an insight of the procedures of actual recruitment process and hence prepare them for the future placement drives. More than 250 students turned up for the event which was conducted successfully within the premises.

In February 2018, Freshman Adda, a start-up with a vision to help students meet their desired interests conducted an Internship drive. The drive was conducted through group discussions followed by personal interviews. 21 students appeared for the same out of which 6 students were selected. The profiles offered by Freshman Adda were campus ambassador, content writer, social media marketer.

Realizing that skill building is a continuous process, team Kryptus organized another mock interview session which was conducted by Mr. Sunil Dua of T.I.M.E. where students were given an insight of an actual interview by interviewing 4 students in the presence of 50 students and sharing the feedback.



On 27<sup>th</sup> February 2018, the Placement Cell organised its first ever mega event, The Internship Fair 2018 where 20 companies like Sharekhan, VQMS and NGOs like Youwecan, Upay were invited. More than 250 students including students from other DU colleges participated in the internship fair. The Internship Fair observed over 490 online and offline registrations by the enthusiastic students.

In collaboration with Triega Solutions, team Kryptus would be engaging students into a virtual online Internship Fair Program with more than 250 companies which would further help the students in realising the merits of work experience.

The Placement Cell has collaborated with GTT-Nasscom to arrange for a continuous mentoring programme by the HR team of Barclays which will involve around 20-25 third year students who will get an opportunity to visit to the Barclays Corporate office and job opportunities to work with the company. The mentorship programme shall be preceded by an online test and a two-day intensive workshop on interview, employability and corporate skills by GTT and Nasscom for shortlisting the before mentioned 25 students on 21-22<sup>nd</sup> March 2018.

Team Kryptus is also working in close coordination with Yes Bank for an Internship Program. They would be offering students a one-week intensive classroom training by renowned industry leaders on leadership, marketing, communications, digital and social media and a seven-week placement in NGOs to work on well-defined communication projects.

In April 2018, the Placement Cell would be organising a Job fair with 25 companies like Eureka Forbes, Decathlon which deals in sports goods online in India, Convergys which is a leading provider of customer management solutions for companies across India, Capgemini which is a global leader in consulting, technology and outsourcing services and many others.

## **Internal Complaints Committee**

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) is constituted in each college of University of Delhi under “The **sexual harassment of women at workplace (prevention, prohibition and redressal) act, 2013**” hereinafter referred to as “**The Act, 2013**”.

University of Delhi has notified that the provisions of the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 and the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Rules, 2013 supersede the University Ordinance XV-D, with immediate effect. The Act, 2013 is an Act to provide

protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Any aggrieved woman may make, in writing, a complaint of sexual harassment at workplace to the Internal Committee if so constituted, or the Local Committee in case it is not so constituted, within a period of three months from the date of incident and in case of series of incidents, within a period of three months from the date of last incident.

## **Medical Facilities**

College provides good medical facilities to the students and staff. A well maintained medical room with bed, wheel chair, screen, weighing machine, sphygmomanometer, steamer and good quality of medicines is located in TRI block. A doctor comes on alternate days in a week. Doctor is available for the students and staff for their minor complaints from 10:00am to 1:00pm. Some serious cases are referred to the nearby hospital. In 2017-18 we organised an interactive session on "Adolescent Age-Problems and immunization". We also arrange paid immunization for students and staff.

## Department of Botany

**Teacher-in-Charge: Dr. Divya Verma**

### ❖ Visit to ICAR-National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources (NBPGR)

The integration of indigenous knowledge and biodiversity conservation was influenced by global initiatives such as the Convention on Biological Diversity, the Earth Summits and so on. In India, it took the form of the Biodiversity Act, setting up of several national parks, sanctuaries, biosphere reserves, the National Biodiversity Authority, along with UNDP and local NGO programmes.

As a part of the curriculum of One-Semester Compulsory Core Module for Undergraduate Programmes, 'Environment studies', our 27 students of B.Sc. Life Sciences along with three faculty members of Department of Botany, Dr Divya Verma, Dr. Sudesh Bharadwaj and Dr. M. Arunjit Singh visited ICAR-National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources, (ICAR-NBPGR), New Delhi on 25 October 2017. Various role of institute was discussed with the students, some of the points discussed are as below:

- To conduct research and promote collection, conservation, evaluation, documentation and utilization of crop genetic resources in India.
- Brief status of various medicinal plants which are conserved in their conservation site in the campus.
- Various economically important plants were shown to the students and discussed its status and various other information concerning the plants.

#### ❖ VISIT TO TILPATH VALLEY BIODIVERSITY PARK

The Botany Department of Kalindi College had organized a visit to Tilpath Valley Biodiversity Park (TVBP), Sainik Farms, Delhi on 15/02/18 and 16/02/18 for the students of Economic (Hons.), Maths (Hons.), Sanskrit(Hons.) and Computer Science (Hons.) to educate them about nature, which is a compulsory part of their course AECC. 45 students each day along with the faculty members Dr. Sudesh Bharadwaj, Dr. Pratibha Thakur, Dr. Nagma Praween, Dr. Susmita Chatterjee, Dr. Vikas Kumar and lab staffs Mr. Yashpal and Mr. Pawan went for the nature's trail. Tilpath Valley Biodiversity Park is a unique collaborative project visualized by DDA and CEMDE (University of Delhi) under guidance of Prof. Babu (retired Prof. of DU). They aim to restore highly degraded Aravalli landscape and remove *Prosopis juliflora* (Vilayati Kikar), *Lantana* and *Parthenium*, which are weed and create ideal settings for vanishing indigenous flora and fauna. They aim to conserve Herbal plants, Butterflies etc. They not only conserve the relicts of Aravalli's existing flora and fauna but also re-create its native biotic communities. They have started achieving success in their work to a certain extent.

TVBP spreads over an area of 69.56 ha on the Southern Ridge that is contiguous with Aravalli ranges of Haryana. With the above-mentioned aims, a total of 105 tree species belonging to 15 plant communities were planted 2.5 years back. Selection of each plant community depends on the basis of topography features of the terrain.

Low lying and plain area are developed into grasslands and broadleaved tree species community. The gentle slopes and upper reaches of valleys are developed into tropical dry deciduous forest ecosystem dominated by species like *Madhuca* (Mahua), *Diospyros* (Tendu), *Adina* (Haldu), *Butea* (Dhaak), *Holoptelea* (Chilbil), *Dalbergia* (Shisham), *Aegle* (Bael) etc. The steep slopes are developed into open thorny forest ecosystem with dominant

species like *Boswellia* (Salai) and *Commiphora* (Guggul) and associated species like *Albizia* (Siris), *Anogeissus* (Dhawa), *Prosopis cineraria*(Sami) etc.

The ridges and hill plateaus are covered with native shrub lands with species like *Grewia* (Phalsa), *Carissa* (Karaunda), *Capparis* (Karel), *Lycium* (Gojiberi), *Ehretia* (Chamror), *Zizyphus* (Ber) etc.

Mass plantation is being organized frequently in TVBP to connect people to the biodiversity and create awareness on the need to protect and conserve their natural environment. School and College students regularly visit the Biodiversity Park for nature education and research.

Dr. Jay Kumar, Scientist and Mr. Mohammad Salik (Guide) along with the Faculty members educated the students about the degradation and revival of a degraded ecosystem. They were sensitized towards nature appreciation and conservation. The nature walk through the park has encouraged qualities of leadership, exploration and nature observation among the students. Overall the trip was fun filled and knowledge gaining experience for all.

#### ❖ Local Field Visit

A local field visit was conducted within the college campus for the students of B.Sc. (H) Mathematics 1st year and B.A.(H) Geography 1st year; studying core module course in environmental studies on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018; under the supervision of Dr. Pratibha Thakur and Dr. Shushmita Chatterjee.

During the visit the students got aware of the plant diversity of the college. The students also visited herbal garden of the college where they got familiarized with various medicinal plants and their medicinal properties.

## **Department of Zoology**

**TIC: Dr. Manisha Arora Pandit**

### **1. Zebrafish demonstration & Hands on exercise for Life Science 1st year students.**

30<sup>th</sup> January 2018 (for Groups 1 & 2) and 6<sup>th</sup> February 2018 (for Groups 3 & 4)

Resource person, Dr Adita Joshi, Founder Director Sansriti Foundation first demonstrated the early developmental stages in the transparent egg of Zebrafish followed by a hands-on exercise of the same by the students.

Zebrafish is seen as the latest 'model' for embryological development studies as its embryos develop as "see through" embryos, that is, all internal development can be clearly observed from the outside in the living embryo. Therefore, due to this unique benefit of the fish, the early developmental stages can be easily observed under a microscope without any intervention.

The resource person first explained the entire development in the Zebrafish starting from the 2-cell cleavage stage till the formation of the larval stages. The students then had the opportunity to observe each of these stages themselves under the dissection microscopes.

The students found it very interesting to actually observe early cleavage stages as opposed to the routine practice of simply studying embryonic development using fixed permanent slides.

They were taught to identify the various stages themselves and also observe the beginning of early organ development in the embryo. Dr Joshi followed this with an interactive session with them so as to ensure that each one had properly grasped the concepts.

### **2. World wetland day: 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2018: Students of Zoology Hons 1st year and faculty members of the Zoology Department**

The celebration of the World wetland day was organized by the Ministry of Environment at the residence of the Minister for Environment, Dr Harsh Vardhan. The ministry had organized an exhibition on wetlands, showcasing their value addition and benefits to nature and mankind. The focus was also on maintaining them in their pristine form so as to ensure the wellbeing of all living organisms associated with them.

The exhibition also showcased the various projects currently underway in the Department of Science and Technology, Department of Biotechnology and CSIR. These agencies had also

put up information about the various schemes available for students and teachers funded by them.

The highlight of the event was the inauguration of the Dr Harsh Vardhan App by the Minister for Environment, Dr Harsh Vardhan for initiating good green deeds, in which he emphasized on the importance of small and simple steps that each one of us can carry out every day to save the environment from further degradation.

His main focus was on school and college students whom he thought were the main pillars on which this initiative would rest. He motivated them to start contributing towards a better environment and further motivate their family members and peers to do the same.

Following the inauguration of the App, we went back to the Indira Paryavran Bhawan, which was built for the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC) in 2013. We participated in an escorted tour of the premises. The Indira Paryavran Bhawan, is a unique building due to the fact that it is completely self-sustained and manufactures and fulfills all its electricity needs within itself with the optimal use of solar panels. The building is envelope designed to ensure daylight in 75% of occupied area. It was constructed using fly ash bricks and heat insulated AAC blocks that reduce the need for cooling even during the hot Delhi summers. It also utilizes a unique Geo thermal heat exchange system to reduce the need for Air conditioning. It houses a terrace garden on its seventh floor. The building has a fully automated robotic car parking system that can accommodate 330 cars. In an initiative to promote the use of green energy, the parking lot has electric car charging points. It also houses its own sewage treatment plant. The building is a green building in the true sense of the word and focuses on the refuse, reduce, reuse and recycle method of sustainable development.
