This Centre takes up the initiative of Exchange of students for training programme to explore biodiversity of North Eastern states. Under the leadership of Dr. Pushpa Bindal, Dr. M. Arunjit Singh, Dr. Shanuja Beri, this centre organized a workshop 'Challenges and Opportunities in Entrepreneurship Development in North Eastern states of India' on 9th of April 2018. The Centre conducted its annual event on 6th March, 2019 with a workshop on "An Exposition of Perishable Products of the North East and its Challenges". Two vocational degree courses namely B.Voc. (Printing Technology) and B.Voc. (Web Designing) are running successfully under the leadership of Nodal Officer Dr. Pankaj Kumar. Besides 17 courses in Humanities, Commerce and Science disciplines, college also offers coveted professional degree courses in Computer Science and Journalism, and 5 contemporary add-on Certificate Courses in Foreign Languages: French and Chinese, Travel and Tourism, Communication Skills and Personality Development and Skill Development. The college is successfully running Non-collegiate Centre of women education board (NCWEB), under the leadership of Dr. Nivedita Giri. In this academic session, with a team of 40 dedicated teachers and a team of 10 administrative staff, this Centre is imparting quality education to 1257 students of B.A.(Prog.) and B.Com.(Prog.) courses. The college is also running the School of Open Learning Center (SOL) wonderfully, under the leadership of Mr. Amit Gupta (officiating Administrative Officer). In this academic session, with a team of 28 dedicated teachers, SOL is imparting education to more than 2500 students of B.A.(Prog.). I congratulate Dr. Nivedita Giri and Mr. Amit Gupta for this.

The TRI block, Administrative Block, Library and Science Block Entrance have provision of ramps to facilitate the differently abled students. All along one side of the parking area, Gulmohar Trees & Neem Trees have been planted alternatively, to provide shelter and soothing look to the parking area. I would like to share that the Solar System project on the open roof top of the college, installed under IPGCL Scheme, is successfully generating 61 Kilo Watt Power. The project has been undertaken by **Hero Solar Energy Pvt. Ltd**, New Delhi. The MoU has been signed for 25 Years. This project has reduced the power consumption in the college to a great extent. I am pleased to inform you all that the Project of construction of Girls Hostel, at the back side of amphitheater, in the Playground has started. The hostel will comprise of 80 rooms with 240 beds. The college has received the grant from the University of Delhi and the work is going on, through PWD. The hostel is expected to be completed by next academic year. There are 4 more projects which are sanctioned and going to start soon namely - Renovation of Sangam Parisar, Electrification of the Campus, Extension of library and Improvement of Sewer system. There are 8 more new projects to be undertaken in near future namely- Extension of Science Block, Extension of Academic Block, Development of the Sports ground, Provision of lift, Installation of 40 additional CCTV cameras, Beautification of the Administrative Block, Beautification of the Entrance Gate and Centralized Public Addressing System for College.

The Social Responsibility Cell (SRC) of Kalindi College is highly active in the college and requires special mention in this Annual report for its brilliant ongoing projects for the welfare of underprivileged members of the society. Connecting Dreams Foundation (CDF) of Kalindi College is operative since March 2017. It aims at providing education to underprivileged children in schools. In September 2017, the social responsibility cell came up with project 'KILKARI'. The project aimed to fulfill the dream of Education of abandoned children living on streets by bridging the gap between schools and kids and initiating a KilkariPathshala to improve their basics has been able to make a positive impact on the lives of 259 unattended children deprived of even their basic right, Education. TheKilkariPathshala in the Sewa Bharti centres of Todapur and Inderpuri with strength of around 40 kids is being conducted every 4 days in a week where a team of volunteers teach subjects like English, Maths, Hindi and EVS/GK/Moral Science, climate issues and Science. A Swachh Bharat Abhiyan was recently conducted in the InderpuriCentre. Following the Pulwama Attack, Pathshala students were taught

that terrorism must be strongly opposed and war is no solution. The project received much appreciation from CDF and has been up scaled and expanded to 14 colleges of Delhi University by CDF.

Another project of SRC in collaboration with ENACTUS is the Project - Rehmat, which aims to improve the plight of manual scavengers, a much-neglected community. Manual scavengers across the nation remove human and animal excreta from the streets and dry latrine, cleaning septic tanks, sewers and gutters. This inhuman occupation has been banned by the constitution for the past 13 years but it is still being practiced on a large scale. To help these people, we provided them KIT JEEVAN which includes basic necessities required for entering into a sewer on a 3 months basis and during this period they will also get an opportunity to learn a new skill and rehabilitated to a different profession. We have been able to rehabilitate 12 manual scavengers. In 2018, Social Responsibility Cell (SRC) came up with a new project named WERAN. It aims at the upliftment of farming community by educating them about the new and organic farming practices. In Weran, we aim at converting the women entrepreneurs of farming community by engaging them in the business of making pickles and jams. Enactus Kalindi participated in Enactus National Championship 2018 and secured 4th position, winning league 1. Project REHMAT bagged second position in Kamla Nehru college and also in Sri Guru Gobind Singh College of Commerce

Successful implementation of projects by CDF-Kalindi related to children education, special children and poverty and hunger saw Kalindi College winning the **1st Runner-Up Trophy in Dream Team of the Season Award** in the annual event of Connecting Dreams Foundation held at SP Jain Auditorium, South Campus, DU in the month of April 2019, beating 19 colleges. The project **Unnati** which aimed at fighting hunger has won the **Best Dream Project of 2018**, out of 40 other projects running in different DU colleges. 'Project Unnati', a fight against hunger aims to provide one full time nutritious meal to those who are unable to afford it. In order to accomplish the goal, the team provides one full time nutritious meal @RS 5 only to respect the dignity of poor people by employing one woman and transforming her into a successful self-sustained entrepreneur thus promoting Women Empowerment. The project has impacted 511 lives till now. Project Unnati is on a mission to achieve the three E's, Eliminating Hunger, Employment and Empowerment and it is a journey just begun with millions of smiles to achieve!! congratulate Convener SRC-Dr. Indu Choudhary for this wonderful work.

The Central Placement Cell "Kryptus" of Kalindi College is exceptionally energetic. It came into existence in September 2017. Currently the team consists of 12 members. The cell in association with the T.I.M.E institution organized an aptitude test on 12th September 2018 followed by a detailed discussion on the entrance exams like CAT, SSC etc., on 13th September 2018. Kryptus organized a workshop on Group Discussion and Personal Interview on 26th September. In January 2018, placement drive was conducted by Jio telecom industry. They offered the profiles of sales, marketing, HR etc. to the students. 14 students appeared for the interview out of which 11 students were selected and placed successfully. Kryptus, in association with T.I.M.E. conducted a second round of sessions on Group Discussion and Personal Interview on 23rd January 2018 and 30th January 2018 respectively. Third year students were sent for the office interviews of "KVCH" on 5th March 2019 and of "Grapes Digital" on 6th March 2019. More than 150 students including students from other DU colleges participated in the internship fair. From all over India only 4 cadets could reach the Summit and one of them is CPL Ritu Jaglan from Kalindi College. 





Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Kalindi College organized a Seven-Day National Workshop on **"Skill Enhancement at Institutions of Higher Learning: Training Today for Tomorrow"** from 07th January to 13th January 2019. To make it all inclusive, the workshop was divided into four categories as under:

For the first time in any college of the University of Delhi such a Week-long National Workshop with four parallel sessions for faculty development and training of administrative, laboratory and library staff, was organized.

Workshop recorded total 96 participants with 47 external and 49 college participants. The external participants represented (i) 10 colleges of University of Delhi; (ii) 07 Universities/Institutions including: Indira Gandhi National Open University; IIIT Delhi, Jamia Millia Islamia, KBM School; Maghdh University Bodhgaya District-Gaya State-Bihar; Narmada College of Science and Commerce, Zadeshwar, Bharuch; Raj Kumar Goel Institute of Technology, Ghaziabad; (iii) 02 departments of the Government of India comprising Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Ministry of Earth Sciences.

Prof. A.K. Bakshi, Founder Vice-Chancellor, PDM University, Bahadurgarh, Haryana gave the Inaugural Address; Prof Devendra Pathak, Vice-Chancellor, Indore, Madhya Pradesh presented the Valedictory Address. Prof Pathak offered to organize exchange programme with Kalindi College and assured to help to attain MoUs with other universities.

23 resource persons conducted various training sessions. They represented various departments of three universities namely, University of Delhi, Jawaharlal Nehru University and National Institute of Education Planning and Administration (NIEPA); Maniben Nanavati Women's College, Mumbai, Maharashtra; Institute of Secretariat Training & Management (ISIT); Founder, Nectar Factor Foundation; Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB), Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi; Dev Jure and InProRi Intellectual Property Consultants; Krishna and Saurastri Associates, Delhi (Gurgaon) office; Patent Office, Delhi; Guru Nanak College of Education, New Delhi; Guru Nanak Institute of Higher Education, Sonipat and INMANTEC, Ghaziabad. Director, Indian Council of Social Science Research; Director, National Testing Agency (NTA); Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India; and Deputy Adviser, North Region, National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC) were also among the resource persons.

Faculty Development Programme on DCE Optional Paper: Travel Writing

A one-day Faculty Development Programme on the newly introduced Discipline Centred Elective optional paper in the BA(H) English III year syllabus entitled **Travel Writing** was organized by the English Department, Kalindi College, University of Delhi in association with the IQAC on 6th April 2019. There were five eminent speakers who spoke on various aspects of the paper, addressing a gathering of 55 participants, all teachers from different institutions.

Of the participants, 14 were affiliated to Kalindi College, 31 to other colleges affiliated to University of Delhi, 2 were from Aligarh Muslim University, 2 from Kumaon University, 4 from Sharda University, and 1 participant each from IIT Delhi and Galgotia's University. All sessions were followed by perspicacious discussions about various aspects of Travel Writing in the texts under study, and how it intersected with diverse disciplines such as History, Historiography, Sociology, Philosophy, Religion, Cultural Studies, Post colonialism, Nationalism,

Cartography, etc.

The first session was on 'Writing Cities: Introduction to Travel Writing and Travelogy' where Dr. Arup K. Chatterjee poetically spoke about travel writing as a genre which looked at spaces within the consciousness as well as the spaces traversed outside. He also explained his hypothesis about travelogy.

Dr. Antara Datta took up the second session with her presentation entitled 'Medieval Islamic Journeys: Al Biruni and Ibn Battuta', in which she contextualized the two medieval travel writers. She argued for their writings being seen as part of a larger tradition of Islamic medieval writing of the Golden Era, characterized by the gathering knowledge within the medieval Islamic world of "Dar ul Islam" and the 'rihla' traditions, thus challenging the Western hegemonic perspective of seeing the medieval era as part of the dark ages.

In her presentation on Rahul Sankrityayan, 'Of Maps, Migrations, Miscegenation: *Volga se Ganga* as Travel Writing', Dr. Maya Joshi eloquently spoke of the independent, critical mind of the prolific, maverick writer who is best known as the Father of Travel Writing in Hindi Literature. She argued for the staunch cosmopolitan notions that Sankrityayan stood for, emphasizing the need to read the prescribed text within the larger context of his writings.

Dr. Anjana Sharma's paper 'A Woman of Observation: Gender, Travel and Romanticism in Mary Wollstonecraft's *Letters Written during a Short Residence in Sweden, Norway and Denmark*' impressed upon the audience the need to examine the context of Wollstonecraft's context, biographical as well as historical. She also encouraged teachers to adopt a more inquisitive strain of pedagogy, rather than simply teaching texts in an examination-oriented, instrumental manner.

In the last session of the day, Dr. Anjana Neira Dev in her presentation 'Traveling across Time and Space: William Dalrymple in *The City of Djinn*' offered a cross-textual study of Dalrymple's early and later books on the theme of travel with the main focus on *The City of Djinn* as a fascinating and informative book on the history of Delhi, its various shifting capitals, myths, and legends.

The Faculty Development Programme concluded with Dr. Anjana Neira Dev distributing certificates to all the participants.

CERTIFICATE COURSE IN FOREIGN LANGUAGE- FRENCH

The certificate course in French language is conducted in collaboration with the department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi. The college follows the University Calendar in all matters related to academics. The annual examination is held in April and the students are required to fulfill all criteria laid down by the respective departments. The duration of the course is one year and minimum of 67% attendance is compulsory to take the University Exam.

There are 88 students in 2018-2019 in French certificate course. Classes are held in two batches. Batch-1 (45 students) is taught by Ms. Sujata Anand and Batch-2 (43 students) by Mr. Pawan Kumar. Classes are held as per schedule: Monday, Wednesday and Friday (Batch-1 by Ms. Sujata Anand) and Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday (Batch-2 by Mr. Pawan Kumar) from 3:00pm to 5:00pm.

CERTIFICATE COURSE IN FOREIGN LANGUAGE- CHINESE

Kalindi College introduced an add-on one year Certificate Course in Chinese with the approval of Department of East Asian Studies in 2016-17. In the year 2018-19, a total of 21 students were admitted. Faculty is sent by the Department of East Asian Studies and classes are being held in the college thrice a week. The course is run under the guidelines set by Department of East Asian Studies, University of Delhi, for conducting part time courses in colleges. Two internal assessments of CP I for 50 marks have been conducted till now. The answer sheets were sent to the Department of East Asian Studies for evaluation and the result of the same is being sent by the department to the college. The final exam would be conducted in April 2019, comprising of two written papers (100 marks each) of 3 hours duration.

CERTIFICATE COURSE IN TRAVEL & TOURISM

A Certificate Course was introduced in the year 2016-17 in Kalindi College with the objective to educate, train and develop the needed skills to prepare students to be valuable for travel and tourism industry and to provide them with alternative career opportunities. A total of 21 students were admitted. In the year 2017-18, the second batch started with 23 students. The third batch with 16 students is running successfully in 2018-19. The Evaluation process is based on project work and written exams. This year, students are working on a project to enquire about the potential of tourism in India. Each student is assigned one state like Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh etc. and is working to cover its tourism potential and what furthermore can be done to maintain the richness of the destination. After the completion of the course, opportunities will be created for students to work, learn and nurture in the industry environment by working in reputed organizations like Cox and kings, Make my trip, Thomas cook, FCm, Goomo, Yatra etc. as we are working to collaborate with the industry experts to absorb our students and provide them with brighter career opportunities.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS & PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT

The aforementioned course commenced in September and ended in the last week of November, 2018. It admitted 25 students in the current batch and tested them in Speaking and Listening. It aims to prepare students to handle the job market as they pass out of college by improving their public speaking skills. An end semester testing is carried out in the form of presentations to evaluate the progress of the student. For this the college has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Englitude, a private organization with experience in the field. Each class is for duration of 2 hours and is conducted during the weekdays in the latter half of the day. By attending the course which caters to three levels (Basic, Intermediate and Advanced) students with varying levels of proficiency tend to benefit from the exposure. It makes them confident by encouraging peer group learning and interaction with experts.

Skill Development

Dr. Nisha Bakshi, convener of Skill Development Cell made visits to Atma Ram Sanatan Dharma College (ARSD) and Acharya Narendra Dev College, Delhi University on October 25 and October 30, 2018 respectively. The purpose of the visits was to gather ideas and insight about the ongoing incubator projects in these colleges. The convener of the Skill Development of Atma Ram Sanatan Dharma College, Dr. Rajiv Singh discussed about different aspects of skill related programmes and funding. He made it clear that skill development programmes and incubation are different in terms of scope and approaches. Skill related programme is part of an initial step. It includes all skill related activities whereas incubation is the advanced stage of this process. Incubation needs continuous planning for making proposals on various topics related to the discipline of science. Skill development related programmes are funded by MSME but the flow of funding is very slow and tedious. Sometimes the funding gets interrupted also. As suggested by Dr. Rajiv, it is better to apply for Delhi government funding which is easily made available to the colleges coming under the ambit of Delhi

government.

The convener of the Skill Development of Acharya Narendra Dev College, Dr. Sanjay Vohra informed that Incubation is the advanced stage of innovation and research. Incubation can be initiated after doing some work and gaining some experiences on skill development activities. Skill projects in ANDC are funded by the students themselves who get back their money by selling their products in the market. To start the projects, a certain amount of seed money was provided by the college as loan.

One Day Workshop on Soap Making

On November 15, 2018 skill development cell organised a workshop on “Soap Making: Melt and Pour” in the Conference room, Kalindi College. Ms. C Anupama, an expert in this art was invited as the guest for this programme. Dr. Nisha Bakshi, the convenor of this cell welcomed the guest by presenting her a bouquet. Ms. Anupama discussed the process of soap making in a very effective and interesting manner. With melt and pour method, Ms. Anupama explained the whole process of creating customised soaps for all skin types. While practically displaying the soap making process, she also discussed the ingredients such as dried herbs, flowers, glycerine and essential oils that are easily available in the market. During the workshop, students were also shown some videos and documentaries of herbal soap making. While attending the workshop, the students not only learned the soap making process but they also came to know about the procedures of marketing these homemade soaps. Ms. Anupama urged the students to develop their entrepreneurial skills along with professional skills so that they can become independent and empowered at a very early stage of life. She also very patiently responded to the queries raised by the students. With the huge round of applause given by the students, the programme finally came to end.

Parent-Teacher-Student Interface (PTSI)

A Parent- Teacher- Students interface is a formal organisation consisting of parents, teachers and students that is intended to facilitate parental participation in the college. The main objectives of PTSI include-

1. To build strong working relationship among parents and teachers in support of students.
2. To obtain knowledge and voice their opinion about what is happening in the college.
3. To understand students from the parent's and teacher's perspectives.
4. To ensure that the college offers the best learning experience for the students keeping in minds their needs.

College hosts two meetings in a year- one meeting in the first session (July-December) and second meeting in the second session (January-April) to keep parents informed and formulate plans for supporting our teachers to ensure that all our students can realise their full potential. Through this interface, teachers come to know about the social background, interests of the students and students' opinion about everything that is going on in the college, including teachers and the college management. We also come to know how the college works and problems faced by the students and so on. The PTSI in the college works towards improving and enhancing the life of the student and the college as a whole. Knowing more about a student helps teachers to cater to their needs accordingly.

The First Parent-Teacher-Student Interface for the academic year 2018-19 was held on 6th October 2018. Total 117 parents of students from various departments attended the PTSI. The Second Parent-Teacher Interface for the academic year 2018-19 was held on 16th March 2019. Total 37 parents of students from various departments attended the PTSI.

Anti-Ragging Committee

Kalindi College has taken several steps to stop ragging within and outside the college and near college premises like 'Bus Stop', 'Metro Station', etc. During orientation programme held on 19th July, 2017, all the freshers were informed in detail about ragging as well as strict punishment against the students involved in ragging.

Freshers were also informed about contact numbers and e-mail of Anti-Ragging Committee members to report about any ragging activity in the college to the committee members. Several teams of teachers went on a round in the college during college hours to check ragging activities. Strict decisions were taken by anti-ragging committee to curb this offence. Wherein the students involved in ragging were to be punished, rusticated and even expelled for a specific term as per decision of the Principal and University guidelines. Several notice boards were fixed in the college at prominent places stating punishment for ragging as per ordinance XV-C. No ragging case has been reported by anyone this year. The college has submitted a report regarding anti- ragging to the university.

IBSD Committee

On 25th January 2017, Kalindi College signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Institute of Bio-resources and Sustainable development (IBSD), Imphal and set up a Centre for Women Entrepreneurship in North-East. On 17th February, 2017 inaugural Function of Institute of Bio-resources and Sustainable development (IBSD) Kalindi College Centre for Women Entrepreneurship in North East was held. Honorable Governor of Manipur, Dr. Najma A. Haptulla as Chief Guest and Professor Dinabandhu Sahoo, Director of IBSD Imphal as Guest of Honor were invited. Professor Bhairabi Prasad Sahu, Chairman Governing Body was also there to grace the chair. The objective of the IBSD center is to develop and utilize the Bio-Resources of the North-East through the application of modern tools of Biology & Biotechnology. The major objectives of the Centre are:

- Exchange of students for training program to explore biodiversity of North-Eastern states.
- Entrepreneurship and value added production of bioresources.
- Awareness to ethnobiological studies.
- Research on both animal/plant bioresource.

In the month of September 2017, an IBSD Committee was constituted by the Principal of the College. Kalindi College IBSD-Center for Women Entrepreneurship in North East organized a workshop '**Challenges and**

Opportunities in Entrepreneurship Development in North Eastern states of India' on 9th of April 2018. The function was graced by Prof. Dinabandu Sahoo, former Chairman of Kalindi College and currently the Director of IBSD Manipur as the Chief Guest and Ms. Mercy Epao, Director of Ministry for Development of North Eastern Region as the Guest of Honour.

Facilitators of the workshop included experts from different professional backgrounds. Mr. Bibhas Nag, CEO/Founder of Green Techs Green Foods, Products and Services and Mr. Naushad Alam, Cluster Head of Retail Banking North India were present as the resource persons. Workshop was attended by over 100 participants from various colleges of the university. The feedback received was positive and encouraging.

The IBSD centre in Kalindi College conducted its annual event on the 6th of March, 2019 with a workshop on **“An Exposition of Perishable Products of the North East and its Challenges”**. The Programme witnessed huge participation from students and teachers from other Colleges like Miranda House, Ramjas, Sri Aurobindo, Shivaji, Maitreyi, Rajdhani, Delhi School of Social Work, Hansraj and many more. 5 teachers, 26 students of other Colleges and 18 teachers, 49 students of Kalindi College participated in the workshop. The Programme was inaugurated by Prof V.P. Chahal, Assistant Director General, ICAR, Pusa Institute. The event opened with a welcome address by the Principal who reiterated the commitment of the college to education and entrepreneurship. The Chief Guest took the audience through the history of agricultural and horticultural research and traced India's journey from the time it attained independence to becoming the largest food grain and milk producing country in the world. The next speaker was Dr. S.D. Tripathi who made a presentation on “Marker Assisted Genetic Improvement in Bhut Jolokia” where he pointed out how the process of genetic improvement was undertaken in the famous eponymous chilli variety in the North East. Dr L.K. Pandey of Global Food and Agribusiness Advisory, New Delhi spoke on the topic “Market Linkages: North East Value-Added Products” focusing on Food Production, marketing, and delivery. He underlined the changes from National Food Security to Nutritional Food. Outlining opportunities ranging from bamboo to seed production were the highlights of his lecture which reminded the audience of the deep potentialities for entrepreneurship in the north east. The final talk was delivered by Mr Saumyadipta Roy, an entrepreneur himself, who provided an idea about the bottlenecks of storage and transportation. He also shared modes of packaging employed and encouraged the youth to not only try to develop their own brands but also supply to already established chains.

Project Rehmat has a mission to create a nation where a person does not die for a living. Manual scavengers across the nation remove human and animal excreta from the streets and dry latrine, cleaning septic tanks, sewers and gutters. This inhuman occupation has been banned by the constitution for the past 13 years but it is still being practiced on a large scale. Earlier, by doing an illegal and dehumanizing act they faced several dignity issues and because of which, they hesitated to talk to other people. This was the biggest challenge for us to talk to them and convince them to unfollow this practice and adopt a new profession. For this we provide them KIT JEEVAN which includes basic necessities required for entering into a sewer on a 3 months basis and during this period they also get an opportunity to learn a new skill and rehabilitate to a different profession such as employing those manual scavengers in factories as skilled labour.

We have been able to rehabilitate 12 manual scavengers. We have targeted the women of scavenging community by converting them to self-sustained entrepreneurs, engaging them into the business of soap making. We have been able to create 3 women entrepreneurs from that community last year but now we have added 9 more women in the same category.

In 2018, Social Responsibility Cell (SRC) came up with a new project named WERAN. It aims at the upliftment of farming community by educating them about the new and organic farming practices which they weren't aware about. Through this project we have targeted both men and women of farming community by empowering and creating awareness among them about the current scenario prevailing in the country. Also, we aimed at increasing their incomes by making them aware about feasible farming practices and alert them about the vicious cycle of intermediaries or middlemen. It will also be a difficult task to convince farmers of the identified areas to work towards the cultivation of organic fruits and vegetables and the abolishment of intermediaries and setting up a direct connection with the customers.

ACHIEVEMENTS

'Enactus Kalindi' participated in the biggest competition of Enactus India, Enactus National Championship 2018 and secured 4th position, winning league 1. The Enactus National Championship 2018 witnessed participation of 98 teams from different parts of India.

In 2019, we have presented REHMAT in the Kamla Nehru College in Commcentric- the commerce association and also in Rotaract event of Sri Guru Gobind Singh College of Commerce and secured second position in both the events.

We have also participated in the campaign STOP KILLING US headed by Mr. Bezwada Wilson, who is working towards complete eradication of manual scavenging.

Enactus Kalindi also participated in case study competition at Sulabh International- museum of toilets and also showcase the soaps made by our created women entrepreneurs in the event.

FUTURE PROSPECTS

In Rehmat, we aim at increasing our production of soaps and creating more and more women entrepreneurs and rehabilitating more manual scavengers and thus save more lives.

In Weran, we aim at converting the women entrepreneurs of farming community by engaging them in the business of making pickles and jams.

About CDF

Connecting Dreams Foundation (CDF), Kalindi College chapter, operative since March 2017, aims at uplifting the underprivileged section of the society through entrepreneurial ventures and actions that bring a ray of hope in the lives of poor people. CDF Kalindi in association with the Social Responsibility Cell initiated Project Kilkari in September 2017 with a goal to make every child rise and shine bright like a diamond. Under project Kilkari, the children living on streets are chosen by the R&D team, their families are counseled about the importance of education and they are then admitted to the nearest government and private schools under 'Right to Education'. However, taking into consideration the increasing dropout rates, a KILKARI pathshala was introduced to make every child compatible enough to be able to read and write. A Kilkari pathshala in the Sewa Bharti centres of Todapur and Inderpuri with a strength of around 40 kids is being conducted every 4 days in a week where a team of volunteers teach main subjects like English, Maths, Hindi and EVS/GK/Moral Science to make the base of a child even stronger.

A variety of science experiments like making a water filter, hot air burning experiment have been conducted in the centres in the past months. Children have been taught tough topics such as parts of a leaf and flower along with leaf painting. They were also made to pronounce it so that they could add new words to their vocabulary. The Social Responsibility Cell has also started to take climate issues into account in the advance curriculum. Phenomenon such as Global Warming and Climate Change have been introduced, posters to reduce Global Warming were drawn and tips on how to save planet Earth were delivered by the volunteers. Another interesting topic 'Reduce, Reuse and Recycle' was taught to the kids by making useful things out of waste material. The session helped to develop the creative skills of children and they came up with brilliant ideas to reuse old things.

A workshop on 'Child Sexual Abuse' was also conducted on 7 February to educate children about good touch and bad touch, emergency helpline number was given and other remedies that can be taken in such a situation were experienced. In science, a Solar System model was taught to the kids by assigning each child a role of a planet that revolves around sun. This little act helped them to understand how planets revolve around sun and celestial bodies in the solar system. A fun session, full of inquisitive children, they made bookmarks and enjoyed it. Another craft activity, 'greeting card' making was held in the centres with an aim to let the kids realise that wishing people on their birthdays is a good gesture and the best present which is always priceless is a greeting card.

A Swachh Bharat Abhiyan was recently conducted in the Inderpuri centre which was utterly successful. The kids were so enthusiastic and passionate, they cleaned the nearby roads in presence of our volunteers and a message of 'Clean India, Green India' was promoted amongst them. In moral science, a session to teach 'moral values' was organised by showing small video clips on a laptop. This facilitated children to take interest in the topic and promoted e learning as well. Now, following the Pulwama Attack, Pathshala students were informed how our brave soldiers protect our motherland and how to stand against terrorism.

Thus, after much determination and hardwork, Kilkari Pathshala with the help of 16 volunteers has successfully been able to make a positive impact on the lives of more than 120 unattended children living on the streets, deprived of even their basic right- 'Education'. The team has been able to identify at least 70 children who do not go to school in Faridpuri, Patel Nagar and the future plan in Project Kilkari is to admit at least 100 children living on streets, deprived of education into schools and fulfil the Sustainable Development Goal 4 i.e. access to Education. After all, every child is a rainbow willing to shine bright!

In October 2018, the Social Responsibility Cell came up with yet another new project, Project UNNATI with a tagline "anndaan jeevandaan" which is a fight against hunger and the team aims to eradicate hunger problem in the city to save hundreds of those who go to bed hungry and can't even afford a one full time nutritious meal. As a part of initial solution, the team organised food donation camps in college in October to minimize food wastage and at the same time feed it to hungry people. The team also used leftover food and fed it to those for whom it's a blessing in disguise. The team was able to feed at least 100 people in a week from the food donation camp and by reusing leftover food.

The second phase in Project Unnati focuses exclusively on feeding nutritious food to needy people. Hence, the SRC came up with an idea to provide one full time nutritious meal @₹5 only to respect the dignity of needy people. In order to proceed with the plan, the team organised surveys in Rajendra Place and Kirti Nagar in January and February by selling one full time nutritious meal @₹5 to analyse the market expectations and sustainability of the idea. To the team's surprise, the surveys were utterly successful and the team was able to feed at least 100 people on a single day. Till now, Project Unnati has been able to feed nutritious food to at least 500 people who would have rather been to bed hungry. Since the delicious yet nutritious meal has to be cooked by an individual, the SRC has employed one woman who work as chef in the Unnati Bhojanalaya.

The future plan in the project is to fix a menu for nutritious meals and ensure the hygiene aspect of the food cooked by providing professional training to the woman employed. Team SRC is also working to replicate the model in other areas of Delhi so that nutritious food can reach to those who lack it. Project Unnati is on a mission to achieve the three E's, Eliminating Hunger, Employment and Empowerment and it is a journey just begun with millions of smiles to achieve!

Eco Club

ECO CLUB of Kalindi College University of Delhi is a multidimensional, highly active society that runs in coordination with the department of environment, Govt. of NCT of Delhi. The Eco Club play an important role in creating environmental awareness amongst the future generation.

Eco club is group of teachers and students dedicated to making our campus less wasteful, raising awareness for eco-friendly causes and promoting environmentally friendly habits like reducing, reusing and recycling.

The main objectives of eco club include:

1. Motivate the students to keep their surroundings green and clean by undertaking plantation of trees.
2. Sensitize the students to minimize the use of plastic bags, not to through them in public places as they choke drains and sewers, cause water lagging and provide breeding ground for mosquitoes.
3. Organize tree plantation programmes, awareness programme such as quiz, essay, painting competition, rallies, Nukkad Natak etc regarding various environmental issues.
4. Build attitude to help individuals and social groups acquire a set of values and felling of concern for environment and the motivation for actively participating in environmental implement and protection.
5. Teach skill to students to help individual for identify and solve environmental problems.

Eco Club organised lecture on Health Awareness on 01.08.2018. In which honourable Dr. Ashok Varshney, National Sanyojok Arogya Bharti, aware the students about General Diet and Life style. He highlighted the importance of general health and laid stress on intake of healthy diet. He also made the students alert about themselves showing various symptoms of anaemia and calcium deficiency. Dr. Ashok also discussed about the main cause of illness which may not notice due to ignorance and explained preventive health care practices. Vaedye Deepak, Ayurveda-Medicinal plant Executive showed various plants to prevent from dengue, Chikungunya and other seasonal epidemic fever. Principal Dr. Anula Maurya addressed on the need of such inter disciplinary and general lecture for the benefit of students.

About 10 students participated in the programme climate Jamboree: Youth movement with a mission; to empower the youth to take ownership of creating sustainable future for themselves organised by TERI school of Advanced studies at Tyagraj Stadium, New Delhi on 1st to 3rd November 2018. Nitya Tyagi, Mayuri Prajapati and Kanushi Sabhawal of Geography First Year participate in water and sanitation discussion and gave solutions about water crises. Shristi Pandey, Shreya Mishra and Kalindi Gulati Participated in Urban Forest and Biodiversity Seminar. Shristi Pandey and Shreya Mishra were selected to represent her discussion group in front of the panelist and awarded with dell digital ruff pad as a token of appreciation. Shristi Pandey won third prize in the quiz competition on the topic disaster preparedness and was awarded with Rs. 5000/- cheque and a certificate.

An event was organised by Eco Club on 5th November 2018 to spread message of "Anti-pollution Diwali" with a motto of celebrating green Diwali. Environmental Studies report

To conscious the young minds about the need of sustainable development, global warming and climate extremities. The Supreme Court of India has decided to introduce an Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC-1) under CBCS .Each and every undergraduate student has to qualify this paper. A part of their syllabus they have to visit to any local polluted site or may study the flora, flora and degraded ecosystem. This paper is shared by three departments like Botany, Geography and Zoology.

1. Botany Department: Indira Paryavaran Bhawan (IPB)

Accompanying Teachers: Drs Sudesh Bhardwaj and Vikas Kumar

B.Sc. (Hons) Botany and Zoology visited the IPB on 30 August 2018. A benchmark in sustainable built habitat and focuses on the “5Rs” of sustainable development works under MoEFCC. It is a Net Zero Energy multistoried with cent percent onsite power generation by solar panels. IPB has efficient water conservation system like recycling of waste water, rainwater harvesting and geothermal heat exchange system. IPB highlighted Jal, Vayu, Prathvi and Agni and Akash. Their motto is to reduce ecological footprint and respect and save our Earth. They celebrated the Environment day, biodiversity day, tiger and elephant day. In the nutshell, students understood the concept of green building and know how we must exploit our natural resource is and reduce carbon footprints.

2. Geography Department: Yamuna Biodiversity Park

Teachers Accompany – Dr Shashi Bhushan, Dr Ranjeet Kaur, Ms. Geeta Kumari and Mr. Jitendra Rishideo

The objective of this visit was to promote the education on environmental awareness and nature conservation as they can get an opportunity to interact with nature education officers. The Yamuna Biodiversity Park is biologically rich wetlands, grassland communities, a wide variety of fruit yielding species and an abundance of medicinal herbs. This biodiversity park has emerged as the capital's most visited public place and prominent center for learning and understanding the environment. The Park also comprises a native flora and fauna which used to exist 100 years ago and then became extinct locally. It further, acts as a natural conservation site for specific group of endangered plants. The park features two major zones - the visitor zone and the nature reserve zone. Our students saw so many good examples of ecosystems. Particularly the Wetland ecosystem was more attractive. There were two wetlands in the park which simulate natural water bodies. Apart from

migratory birds, these wetlands have a rich aquatic diversity of invertebrates, turtles, fish and phytoplankton. There was also a butterfly park that was an extremely ideal place for all the photo fanatics. There were the central enclosed areas where the flowering plants are grown, which attract the butterflies. Our students also observed more than two dozen varieties of forest landscapes, apart from the grasslands that dominate a major portion of the landscape.

3. Zoology Department: National Zoological Park

Accompanying teachers: Drs Manisha Pandit, P.P.Saini, Varsha Sharma and Rosina

One day excursion of B.Sc. Physical Sciences and B.Com (H) I Year students for the paper of Environmental Studies was organised. The Students observed the rich biodiversity of the Zoological park like Asiatic Lion, Black Bears, Rhino, Hippocampus, Tigers, Nilgai, Jaguar, Emu, black buck, brow antler deer, Civet etc. They enjoyed watching Birds spotted Painted storks, little cormorants, cattle egrets, pond herons, common teals, white necked storks, sarus cranes, black necked storks, white ibises, spoon bilvelers, pintails and spot billed ducks. The trip emphasized the importance of maintaining and preserving biodiversity. It helped to inculcate a sense of care for the environment and all its different life forms. It also gave a glimpse of *ex situ* conservation of biodiversity and the importance of various methods used in India to conserve life -forms.

DR. B.R. Ambedkar Study Centre

Women Development Centre

Deswal Associate Prof. in Faculty of Law D.U and Prof. Shveta Gagneja spoke on various aspects of legal empowerment of women as the need of the day. The main issues that were covered by them were PWDVA, POSCO, Section 498A, pornography and other matrimonial offences.

Students got the chance to interact with grassroots women activists and women members of the parliament. SOL Kalindi College is successfully running under the guidance and supervision of Dr. Anula Maurya (Principal) and Mr. Amit Gupta (Administrative Officer Offg.). The Kalindi centre offers B.A.(Prog.) to the students of I, II and III YEAR. The centre has helped hundreds of students to realize their dream of higher education and will continue to do in future as well. First-year classes of B.A. (PROG.) were scheduled from November 2018 to March 2019, II year and III-year classes have been scheduled from December 2018 to March 2019. College has undertaken this project on the open roof top, in consultation with the Govt of NCT of Delhi. The project has been undertaken by **Hero Solar Energy Pvt. Ltd**, New Delhi, under the project name “**61.75 KWp Grid Connected Solar Power Plant at Kalindi College**”, which has been installed under IPGCL Scheme. a design, supply, installation, commissioning, operation and maintenance is being done by Hero Solar Energy Pvt Ltd. Project is successfully generating 61 KWp in the college. An MoU has been signed for 25 Years. This has reduced power consumption in the college to a great extent.

C. PROJECTS ABOUT TO START SOON:

- **RENOVATION OF SANGAM PARISAR:** The work of renovation and extension of Sangam Parisar is to be undertaken by PWD. It will raise seating capacity in the hall as two storey Balcony would be added to increase accommodation. The college green rooms, toilets and rest rooms have also been incorporated alongwith a provision of Centralized AC & PA system. The same has been inaugurated by His Holiness, 14th Dalai Lama on 28.01.2015. The work is about to start soon by PWD.
- **ELECTRIFICATION OF a CAMPUS:** This project is under consideration with PWD (Electrical) and shall provide adequate lighting in and around the campus, especially near the boundaries of the college, to prevent any unauthorized entry or untoward incidence.
- **EXTENTION OF LIBRARY:** The College is undertaking a project of extension of Library through PWD wherein it has provided a space for construction of Porta Cabin over a floor of a Library Block. This would ease a problem of books storage besides providing adequate space in the Library.
- **IMPROVEMENT OF SEWER SYSTEM:** The College is having old sewer system and Therefore, many a times occurs chocking of man holes and back flows, especially during rainy season. In order to improve this sewer system, the college has provided a work of improvement of sewer system, keeping in view of a newly added building load, to PWD. The work is going to start soon.

D. PROJECTS TO BE UNDERTAKEN:

1. **EXTENSION OF SCIENCE BLOCK:** A preliminary estimates of PWD for construction of G+3 Floor building, in front of Power House, have been approved. This building would provide enough rooms and halls to be utilized as class rooms/ Labs etc. An existing science block shall be joined with this new building.
2. **EXTENSION OF ACADEMIC BLOCK:** A preliminary estimates of PWD for construction of SPS building in place of existing Canteen area has been approved. This building would provide enough space for canteen area along with additional rooms. This new building would be connected with the existing Academic Block.
3. **DEVELOPMENT OF SPORTS GROUND:** The college is going to undertake a development project of a Sports Ground through a specialized agency, incorporating sports equipments and other facilities in a sports area.
4. **PROVISION OF LIFT:** The College is going to undertake a project of construction of Lift in the Old Academic Area, that would connect Student' s Amenities Block and Old Building, facilitating a movement of especially abled students. The college is also exploring a possibilities of providing ramps in various buildings in consultation with PWD.
5. **INSTALLATION OF CCTV:** The College has installed CCTV cameras in the Admin. Block, Academic Block, Sangam Parisar, College Entrance, Science Block etc., which have been operational for last two years. Presently, the college has 54 cameras.
Due to increase in infrastructure i.e. newly constructed TRI Block, Students Amenity Centre, Sports Utility Centre, Parking Area etc., the college requires 40 additional cameras. This project has been finalized and CCTV would be installed soon in the additional areas.
6. **BEAUTIFICATION OF THE ADMINISTRAIVE BLOCK:** The college is going to undertake a project of installation of Glasses in the Admin. Block front. It would provide a new look to the building.
7. **BEAUTIFICATION OF ENTRANCE GATE:** The project of new entrance gate is being undertaken by the college. The project would provide new gate and enhanced security at the entrance.
8. **CENTRALISED PA SYSTEM FOR COLLEGE:** The College is exploring options to provide centralized PA

system, for immediate and emergent communication, connecting all class-rooms with good administration.

Library

Librarian: Ms Karnika Gaur

The library resources have been enhanced during the year **2018-19** and the total collection of the library reached up to **83,464 books** including Book Bank and Student Aided Fund books. The Library users have been able to enlighten themselves by going through the newly added books. At present library is subscribing **103 magazines/journals and 16 newspapers** in English and Hindi languages on different areas of interest for its readers.

The library has a web center to access e-resources, separate reading room for consultation purposes and photocopy facility for the students and staff. The remote login access of e-resources through N-List login ID is also provided by the library.

Placement Cell

The Placement Cell of Kalindi College, 'Kryptus', came into existence in September 2017. Currently the team consists of 12 members who understand the zeal of the placement cell and strive hard to serve the best on the platter. The induction of the student council was to have representation of students in the placement cell to better understand their needs and to smooth the channels of communication and information dissemination. As has always been, the foremost focus of the Placement Cell is to provide the undergraduate students of the college with opportunities to intern and get placed in reputed organizations in the private sector be it multinational companies or the NGOs. A related challenge is to equip students with the skills to face the process of screening and selection used by potential employers.

On 5 September 2018, a new year of placement cell begun with an orientation program for the students, especially the freshers in order to acquaint them with the professional world which is full of plethora of opportunities. The cell got an overwhelming response as more than 100 students enthusiastically participated in the same.

With a new year, team Kryptus aims to provide a better experience to the students, so in order to give them a glimpse of their future endearments, the cell in association with the T.I.M.E institution organized an aptitude test on 12th September 2018 followed by a detailed discussion on the entrance exams like CAT, SSC etc on 13th September 2018. . It was a test held by one of the members of the institute (MR. SANKALP). Many students turned up for the test as the team of Kryptus had already made them aware about the test. It helped them to get a glimpse of these exams and also rank themselves which help them to pull up their socks for the preparation of the same.

The team believes in over all training of the students in order to help them excel in their own fields and also make the institution proud to have them as a part of it. Keeping the same thought Kryptus organized a workshop on Group Discussion and Personal Interview on 26th September 2018 which was again an eye-wakening session for the students.

In January 2018, placement drive was conducted by Jio, which is a leading company in the telecom industry. They offered the profiles of sales, marketing, HR etc. to the students. 14 students appeared for the interview out of which 11 students were selected and placed successfully.

Kryptus, in association with T.I.M.E conducted a second round of sessions on Group Discussion and Personal Interview which took place on 23rd January 2018 and 30th January 2018 respectively. More than 80 students were a part of the drive which added to their set of skills and knowledge.

Realizing that building is a continuous process, and the more opportunities Kryptus brings to the platter the higher the fly. Keeping the same in mind the cell sent the third year students for the office interviews of KVCH on 5th March 2019 and in Grapes Digital on 6th March 2019.

On 8th March 2019, the Placement Cell organized its mega event, The Internship Fair 2019 where 20 companies like Sharekhan, VQMS and NGOs like Unnati, Upay were invited. More than 150 students including students from other DU colleges participated in the internship fair. The Internship Fair observed over 350 online and offline registrations by enthusiastic students.

Team Kryptus is also working in close coordination with Yes Bank for an Internship Program. They would be offering students a one-week intensive classroom training by renowned industry leaders on leadership, marketing, communications, digital and social media and a seven week placement in NGOs to work on well-defined communication projects.

In April 2019, the Placement Cell would be organising a Job Week with 25 companies like Aviation, Jio etc. which deal in providing telecom services in India, and many others.

Internal Complaints Committee

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) is constituted in each college of University of Delhi under “**The sexual harassment of women at workplace (prevention, prohibition and redressal) act, 2013**” hereinafter referred to as “**The Act, 2013**”.

University of Delhi has notified that the provisions of the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 and the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Rules, 2013 supersede the University Ordinance XV-D, with immediate effect. The Act, 2013 is an Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto. Any aggrieved woman may make, in writing, a complaint of sexual harassment at workplace to the Internal Committee if so constituted, or the Local Committee in case it is not so constituted, within a period of three months from the date of incident and in case of series of incidents, within a period of three months from the date of last incident.

Internal Complaints Committee of Kalindi College organized a workshop " Legal Awareness of women on sexual harassment, Pre Conception, Pre Natal and Diagnostic Techniques Acts" on 19th September 2018 under convenership of Dr. Pushpa Bindal. Honorable Judge Vinod Kumar Meena, Secretary, DLSA, West, Tis Hazari Court, Delhi and Dr. Girish Shastri, Nodal Officer, West district Court were the resource persons for the workshop who provided information about the act and legal services provided by Government to the fully packed auditorium.

Counselling Facilities

The counselling facility aims to mobilize all the available resources of the college or home for satisfaction of the vocational, educational and socio-personal needs of the students. Its objective is also to help students develop, optimize and utilize their skills and correct the sources of their weaknesses and to improve the standard of education.

1. Counsellor Ms. Namrata Punia is available for 3 days a week, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from 9.00 am to 12.00 noon. She is available in the Medical Room in the TRI Block.

6. The Faculty is also involved in counselling the students and a schedule of their availability is provided on the website.

The Biochemical Society organized an Invited Talk on 10th October 2018 in the college Auditorium, "Sangam Parisar". Dr. G. S. Sodhi, Associate Professor at Chemistry Department and Forensic Science Unit, Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College, University of Delhi, Delhi-110007 was our invited guest for the talk. Dr. Sodhi delivered a lecture on 'Role of Forensic Chemistry in processing Crime Scene Evidence'.

"It may be claimed that there is no more effective deterrent to crime than the certainty of detection. Equally true is that there is no surer way of establishing identity than by fingerprints. The detection of latent fingerprints at the scene of crime and their subsequent development is therefore one of the most powerful tools available in casework investigations. The fingerprints found at the scene of crime or an article removed from it are formed when the papillary ridges leave a deposit of perspiration on a surface with which the finger has been brought into contact. The constituents of sweat may be selectively fixed by different chemical reagents so as to make the latent prints visible. Novel chemical compositions for detecting latent fingerprints on crime scene evidence were described in the presentation given by him. This was followed by a few case studies which highlight the importance of scientific methods in solving crime cases".

This lecture was very beneficial for the students of Botany, Chemistry as well as Zoology who want to work for the country in relation to investigating crime and pursue their careers in this sensitive area. Students as well as teachers were very enthusiastic for the lecture and participated actively.

Furthermore, Biochemical Society also organized various academic events (co-curricular and extracurricular activities). The activities/competitions included Powerpoint Presentation, Poster Making, Quiz, Just A Minute, Guess the Substance, Dumb Charades, Face Painting and Fotografia. Students of the college keenly participated in these competitions. For these eight events, exciting cash prizes with certificates were given to each of the winners including the participation certificates for participants.

Talk by Dr. Anand Prakash

For its opening event, the English Literary Society invited renowned scholar, teacher and mentor Dr. Anand Prakash, formerly Associate Professor, Hansraj College, University of Delhi to deliver a lecture on Literary Criticism on 5th September 2018. The lecture was meant to orient students to the meaning, purpose and value of literary criticism and analysis. Dr. Prakash explained the actual work that analysis entails, emphasising its personal and creative aspects, thus encouraging student to approach it as a rich, engaging activity. Students spoke about their responses to texts and were enthused to approach the very act of reading as a creative and expressive endeavour.

Poetry Writing Workshop

The English Literary Society organised a workshop on poetry writing on 1st October 2018 and it was conducted by celebrated Indian English poet and Professor, School of Humanities (English), Indira Gandhi National Open University, Prof. Nandini Sahu. Prof. Sahu discussed the basics of poetry writing, and introduced students to the various forms of poetry, describing the common literary techniques used by poets. Her presentation was followed by an interactive session in which many students brought up their concerns about writing poetry, and also their own poems with Dr. Sahu.

Talk on *AndhaYug*

ACIVITY AND INTERACTION DAY 9th October 2018

One day departmental activity and interaction was organised by 'Dharohar', the history society of Kalindi College. The day included two special lectures, activities for students and society elections for session- 2018-2019.

The day began with the society election which was conducted for the post of President and Secretary. The nominations for the post of President were: Supriya Poddar (III Year) and Teena Thakur (III Year) and for the post of Secretary were: Megha Rani (II Year) and ParaambaRaghuwanshi (II Year). Subsequent to voting Supriya Poddar was elected as the President and ParaambaRaghuwanshi as the Secretary for the Society. Class representatives were also appointed. Archana Bharti and Mahima Chauhan were appointed the class representatives for I Year, Ananya Bahuguna and Megha Rani for II Year and Nikita Bisht and Nagamma for III Year.

Dharohar organised two special lectures on the day. One in the morning session by Dr. Smita Sahgal, Associate Professor, Lady Sriram College and in the afternoon session by Dr. Yuthika Mishra, Associate Prof., Vivekanand College, University of Delhi.

Dr. Smita Sahgal spoke on 'Reading gender relations within the Mahabharata'. She through her research work acquainted the students with the meaning of gender, defined gender relations and elaborated the concept of hierarchy and the power associated with it by referring to various philosophers. She explained as a result of new trends in historiography how and why we started looking at our ancient texts with new perspective. Dr.

Sahgal based her lecture on Mahabharata to explain the gender relations by citing examples of female, male and transgender characters from the text. Her lecture inspired the listeners for the re-reading of the text with a new insight.

Dr. Yuthika Mishra spoke on 'History and Archives'. Through her well structured lecture Dr. Yuthika, explained the difference between library, archives and museums. She explained the details about the National Archives of India and State Archives, their functions and working. The objectives with which they were established and how in course of time it changed and archives became important source to write history. Dr. Yuthika also talked about ancient and medieval forms of record keeping. She explained to the students various technologies involved record management. She also explained through images various scripts in which records have been found from earlier periods like Modi, Sharda, Kaithi manuscripts. She explained various roles played by archives, how their use shifted from writing the political history to freedom struggle then to contemporary issues of marriage and constitutional rights. Dr. Yuthika also highlighted some of the challenges faced by Record Commission. To generate interest among the students she spoke on carrier options/opportunities in the field of preservation and conservation.

The Departmental Activity concluded with three activities for the students, Spin-a-Yarn, Quiz and Guess the Personality, which proved to be extremely engaging and popular among the students.

➤ **Workshop-cum-Training**

1. Laboratory Staff Training/Workshop

One day workshop for Laboratory staff was held in Zoology Department on January 11, 2019. Under the aegis of IQAC, Kalindi College Four participants attended the workshop from Zoology Department of our college. The workshop conducted included three sessions:

First Session: Dr. Varsha Singh "Maintenance and Safety Measures of Scientific Instruments"

In this Dr. Varsha discussed about the guidelines and methodology about maintenance and safety measures for the scientific instruments such as Microscope, autoclave, pH meter, ELISA reader etc. the PowerPoint presentation was followed by a hands on demonstration of the instruments.

Second session: Dr. Shanuja Beri "Spectroscopy"

In the second session Dr. Shanuja gave the details of the Spectroscopy instrument, its working principle and data handling. She also gave demonstration and hand on training about the Spectroscopy instrument.

Third session: Dr. K. Vandana Rani "Protein Characterization"

In the last session Dr. Vandana told them about the characterization of protein by electrophoresis. She gave a detailed insight about the chemical preparation used in this experiment. The presentation was followed by hands on training for the same.

At the end of the session a discussion was held among our laboratory staff and a feedback was also taken for the same.

2. Student training "Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp for Science Students"

A step ahead, the Society organized a Three Day Workshop-cum-Training entitled as "**Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp for Science Students**" in association with **IQAC Kalindi College** and **National Institute for Entrepreneurship and Small Business Development (NIESBUD), Ministry of Skill Development, Govt. of India**. In this programme various students of B.Sc. Hons. Zoology, Chemistry, Physics, Botany, Computer Science and Mathematics and B.Sc. Life Sciences and Physical Sciences were benefitted with training and a certificate. The programme included a two day interactive session on 15-16 January 2019 and a one day Industrial visit to a NIESBUD incubation centre KRAFTIVITY at Narayana, Delhi on 23rd January 2019.

On the first day of interactive session **Mr. H. P. Singh, Senior faculty** and **Program In-charge** of NIESBUD told about various schemes of Govt. of India, training program and incubation centre. while on the

second day **Mr. Ravi Gupta, an entrepreneur trainer** share his expertise on how to design and start up an entrepreneurship whereas **Mr. R. K. Chandra, retired bank manager** and **entrepreneur trainer** told us about various laws, formalities and precautions while seeking Bank and Govt. Schemes for loan.

This training was succeeded with an industrial visit to a NIESBUD incubation centre KRAFTIVITY at Narayana, Delhi, where the experts gave an insight to students how they can open their own small business or incubation centre. They also demonstrated a bakery session with students and taught our students to how to make muffins. They were also informed about various short term and cost effective courses in bakery and cosmetics.

➤ **Campus Bird Count (The Bird Count India 2019) and Invited talk**

The society is meant and motivated to plan out some awareness campaign towards sustainable environment development and in this context Department joined the campaign of Campus Bird Count India 2019, from 15-18 February 2019. The Bird Count India is public project with the aim to document the distributional range and the abundance of Indian birds, from the finest scale (within a city) to the largest (across the country). Through collating observations on birds across seasons and years, enable us for a better understanding of seasonal patterns of movement and migration of birds, and to monitor changes in distribution and abundance of birds over long periods. This campaign has the partnership consists of a large number of organizations and groups all over India and share common goals.

In this campaign a pre-introductory talk was delivered by **Ms. Misha Bansal, project coordinator**, Kalindi College, on the topic **“Introduction to Birding”** on **13th February 2019** in which she talked about identification of birds, their life history pattern of migration and methods of their counting.

Further on **15th February 2019**, **Mr. Prasanna Gautam**, a very passionate bird enthusiast from the team joined and guided during **Kalindi College Campus Bird Count and Walk**. He has been a trekker, has coordinated the Snow Leopard Project with Earthwatch and has participated in the tiger census at Ranthambore and Elephant census in Corbett. In our campus walk we recorded 28 different bird species in our campus at different location. All the students of Zoology and Life Sciences have learnt a lot from him and observing birds with him was a delight for the students and faculty.

• ***Environmental Sciences Educational Trips to Delhi Zoo (National Zoological Park, New Delhi)***

1. The Zoology Department organized one day educational trip for of B. Com I year Students (30 students) for Environmental studies (compulsory and qualifying) paper during academic session 2018- 2019. One day trip was organized on 10th October 2018 to National Zoological Park, Delhi. Dr. Varsha Singh and Dr. M. Rojina Devi organized and accompanied the trip.

2. One day excursion of B.Sc. Physical Sciences I Year (39 students) to National Zoological Park, New Delhi, was conducted on 5th Nov 2018 under guidance of Dr. Prem Prakash Saini and Dr. Manisha Arora Pandit for the paper of Environmental Science. The Students observed the rich biodiversity of the Zoological park like Asiatic Lion, Black Bears, Rhino, Hippotamus, Tigers, Nilgai, Jaguar, Emu, Black Buck, Brow Antler Deer, Civet etc

They enjoyed Bird watching in the park and observed Painted Storks, Little Cormorants, Cattle Egrets, Pond Herons, Common Teals, White Necked Storks, Sarus Cranes, Black Necked Storks, White Ibises, Spoonbills, Shovelers, Pintails and Spot Billed Ducks.

The trip emphasized on the importance of maintaining and preserving our biodiversity. It helped to inculcate a sense of care for the environment and all its different life forms. It also gave a glimpse of ex situ conservation of biodiversity to the students and showed them the importance of various methods used in India to conserve life.
