“Training and Awareness Program on Empowering Women through Digital Redressal: Capacity Building on SHE-BOX Portal under the POSH Act, 2013”

Overview:

The session focused on raising awareness about workplace safety for women and equipping students with practical knowledge of digital grievance redressal systems.

Prof. Namita Rajput delivered an intellectually stimulating and informative lecture highlighting critical legal frameworks and redressal mechanisms aimed at empowering women in professional and academic spaces.

Key Components of Her Address:

The POSH Act, 2013:

Prof. Rajput opened her session with an in-depth overview of The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, commonly known as the POSH Act. She elaborated on its legal provisions that protect women against sexual harassment in the workplace and promote a safe and equitable environment. The Act mandates every workplace to have an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) to address grievances in a structured and confidential manner.

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC):

She emphasized the role and responsibilities of the ICC, which is a statutory body required in every institution or organization with more than 10 employees. The ICC serves as the first line of redressal and is tasked with receiving, investigating, and resolving complaints in accordance with principles of natural justice.

SHE-BOX Portal:

A major highlight of the seminar was the capacity-building session on the SHE-BOX (Sexual Harassment Electronic Box) portal – an initiative by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India. Prof. Rajput demonstrated how this digital platform enables women employees (in both the private and public sectors) to file sexual harassment complaints online. She also emphasized the significance of accessibility, anonymity, and the ease with which women can seek redressal without fear or intimidation.

Ministry of Women and Child Development:

Prof. Rajput acknowledged the efforts of the Ministry in launching innovative and inclusive platforms like SHE-BOX and promoting the implementation of the POSH Act across institutions. She applauded its role in policy-making, advocacy, and ensuring gender justice across workplaces in India.

Conclusion:

The seminar succeeded in creating a dynamic and educative platform for discourse on women's safety, digital grievance redressal, and the importance of legal literacy. The participants left with a renewed sense of responsibility and empowerment, better prepared to support safe, inclusive, and respectful workplaces.
