- Shortage of permanent staff. This leads to a lot of instability in the department in various ways.

- Visits/ Talks by industry professionals
- Increasing students' interest in research together with scope of enhanced research work in all fields.
- To upgrade the quality of delivery with help of amalgamation of experience and technology.

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Challenges

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- To increase the campus placements in the corporate sector and attract better companies for placement.
- To make up for the loss of hands-on practical training of the students due to online teaching.
- Reaching out to students belonging to different intellectual and academic levels in the same class.
- Internet connectivity problem amidst online classes.

5. Recommendations

Kalindi College offers one of the most valued education that trains its students to develop a holistic personality. The faculty encourages students to go beyond curriculum and hone their analytical skills. Students are motivated to write research papers and present their research work in national and international conferences. The faculty members actively help the students in getting their research work publish in reputed journals and books / conference proceedings. The most common factors impacting gaps in academic achievement are social, gender, racial and structural inequalities. The college ensures that students coming from marginalized sections of the society receive opportunities to build various life skills, specifically interpersonal skills. Along with scholarships and fee waivers, the college issues laptops to students from economically weaker sections of the society. The College takes up measures to enhance future employability of the students like short term workshops, add-on courses, skill enhancement projects etc. This aspect of pedagogical innovation has taken care of the students especially from weaker sections of society and has tried to direct the skills and talents of the students in certain vocational fields of art and crafts, stitching, etc. Through undergraduate research projects, the faculty encourages students to go beyond curriculum and inculcates in them research ethics and equips them with skills required for future research. These activities provide a platform for the students to exhibit their creativity, talent, scientific and critical acumen as well as organizational

Besides, the college has also been working on skill up-gradation of its non-teaching and teaching staff by conducting ICT workshops, webinars on research ethics, FDP on Research Methodology etc. to name a few.However, despite the Institute's vision and significant efforts to strengthen industry linkages, the pace of getting collaborations has not been up to the mark. It is suggested that the College must make consistent efforts to tie-up with industry and institutes of repute for student and faculty exchange. The College must augment teaching and research initiatives and upgrade laboratories in-sync with new and emerging areas. Administrative reforms may be introduced for better governance. It is further suggested to recruit permanent staff to avoid instability in the working of various departments.

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
