Report on "Hands-on training for e-content development using basic tools"

The e-content development committee of Kalindi college organized its inaugural event on "Hands-on training for e-content development using basic tools" for the faculty members of the college on 27th September 2021, Monday at 5:30 PM. The resource persons for the sessions were our committee members Dr. Savita Sharma, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics and Dr. Pawan Kumar, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany. Dr. Sharma opted to cover "Basics of audio and podcasting tools" while Dr. Kumar volunteered to share his knowledge and experience on "Quick start guide to video content creation". The poster of the event was launched and was also uploaded on the college website.



Interested faculty members from the college had to register themselves using https://forms.gle/H6RzaSTzhSB3Jbo36 link. A total of 130 teachers from various departments of the college registered for the event. A separate WhatsApp group comprising of participants as well as organizing members was created to share the details and other relevant information regarding the event. Our resource persons shared the pre-requirements with the participants well in advance before the event. This included step-by-step guide to download various software and tools to be covered during the hands-on training session. This was done to ensure that the participants come prepared for the training session before hand.


The program was conducted on google meet platform and was streamed live on Kalindi College youtube channel.




The event started with the introductory remarks by Dr. Shilpika Bali Mehta, convenor, econtent development committee. Dr. Mehta apprised everyone about the functioning of the committee and emphasized on the importance of e-content development especially amid Covid times. Our Principal, Prof. Naina Hasija graced the occasion and gave her best wishes for the successful event.





The first session on "Basics of audio and podcasting tools" was conducted by Dr. Savita Sharma. Dr. Sharma explained the concept behind creating a podcast and its advantages in our education system. She covered all the necessary steps required to create a basic podcast using a freely available software 'audacity'. Working instructions as well as live demonstration on how to create, edit and import the track were covered efficiently in the session.






The second session on "Quick start guide to video content creation" was carried out by Dr. Pawan Kumar. Dr. Kumar covered all the steps required in creating a video content in an easy and simplified manner. He started with explaining what all equipment and recording set up are required for creating a video. A live powerpoint was recorded using 'freecam' software. Concept of green screen and its importance in video recording was also explained brilliantly. Dr. Pawan then made use of 'kinemaster' software and demonstrated its working with the audience. In the end, the details on how to add subtitles in the video and how to publish the video on any platform were also shared.







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4. Detailed Report:

The "MOOCs, E-Content Development, Research Methodology and Statistical Tools in Open Education World" a two week Faculty Development Programme (FDP) with the aim to attract and bring together experts, researchers and teachers to focus on connecting classroom teaching with applied research was organized by Kalindi College University of Delhi in collaboration with Mahatma Hansraj Faculty development Centre (MHFRDC). Project 'Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds' (SWAYAM) provides an integrated platform and portal for online courses, using information and communication technology (ICT) and covering all higher education subjects and skill sector courses to ensure that every student benefits from learning material through ICT. SWAYAM involves development of Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC's) compliant e- content (video and text) and building a robust IT platform.

The 21st Century is the era of the information technology, entire system especially teaching and learning process is gradually moving towards blending mode. We have seen lot of changes in teaching during past few decades; nowadays we are observing all the stakeholders of academic system are using ICT tools. We neither ignore nor resist the usages of technology in open education world. The fact is that we have to accept the usages of ICT, which is in dire need of changing academic environment. MOOCs and e- content are very useful for our new generation academicians. The Research Methodology and Statistical Tools are fulcrum of all types of research and innovation. The two Week faculty development programme was helpful for all stream teachers from sciences to Humanities. There were a total 14 speakers from esteemed organizations and 138 participants from 10 different states of India have joined in this FDP.

The main purpose of this FDP was to focus on blending of classroom & online teaching with modern research approach. FDP, programme was funded by Ministry of Education, Government of India under Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching scheme. With the aim to develop skills for effective delivery and development of econtents through various tools to manage online classes through MOOCs two live sessions per day from 9:30 am to 1.00 pm was part of first objective. Afternoon time was fixed as per the second objective with library hours from 2.00 pm to 3.00 pm every day and assessment and evaluation from 3.30 pm to 5.30 pm every day.

For the inauguration Guest of Honour Prof. Ruchi Das, Head, Dean, Faculty of Mathematical Science University of Delhi and Chief Guest Prof. Balaram Pani, the Dean of Colleges, University of Delhi graced the occasion with their blessings and motivational words. Prof. V. Ravichandran currently working as a Professor of Mathematics at National Institute of Technology, Tiruchirappalli gave the inaugural talk on "Research Methodology" on day 1 and he also give a talk on day 2 "How to write a research paper"? Dr. Ranjana Jain currently working as Assistant Professor in the Department of Mathematics of the University of Delhi shared her knowledge with two sessions on "How to prepare E- content using various online video-making tools". Prof. Hamendra Kumar Dangi, Department of Commerce, University of Delhi taken two session on Sentimental Analysis and Bibliometric Analysis. Prof. C. P. Gupta department of Finance, South Campus University of Delhi presented a beautiful analysis using statistical tools for sampling with two sessions.

Professor Shobha Bagai is currently working as Professor in Cluster Innovation Center University of Delhi talked about statistics in open education world. Prof K. Srinivas is a valuable resource person and delivers skill based technical sessions & lectures across the country for Faculty Development Programmes, Faculty Induction Programmes, Refresher Courses and Orientation Programmes at UGC HRDCs in many Universities in India on e-Learning, MOOCs, e-governance and Computer Applications in Project Management. 

Report of Skill Enhancement workshop

A two days skill enhancement workshop on the topic "Skill enhancement by ICT Learning in the period of online knowledge exchange" was organized on 9-10 December, 2020 for the university lab staff. Third prize: Rs.700: Himanshu, Hindu college





The work shop was a huge success. It was highly appreciated by all the participants. They requested the organizers to conduct such workshops more frequently in future.




Short description about event:

Report

A one-day Faculty Development Programme on the newly introduced Discipline Centred Elective optional paper in the BA(H) English III year syllabus entitled **Travel Writing** was organized by the English Department, Kalindi College, University of Delhi in association with the IQAC on 6th April 2019. There were five eminent speakers who spoke on various aspects of the paper, addressing a gathering of 55 participants, all teachers from different institutions.

Of the participants, 14 were affiliated to Kalindi College, 31 to other colleges affiliated to University of Delhi, 2 were from Aligarh Muslim University, 2 from Kumaon University, 4 from Sharda University, and 1 participant each from IIT Delhi and Galgotia's University. All sessions were followed by perspicacious discussions about various aspects of Travel Writing in the texts under study, and how it intersected with diverse disciplines such as History, Historiography, Sociology, Philosophy, Religion, Cultural Studies, Postcolonialism, Nationalism, Cartography, etc.

The first session was on 'Writing Cities: Introduction to Travel Writing and Travelogy' where **Dr. Arup K. Chatterjee** poetically spoke about travel writing as a genre which looked at spaces within the consciousness as well as the spaces traversed outside. He also explained his hypothesis about travelogy.

Dr. Antara Datta took up the second session with her presentation entitled 'Medieval Islamic Journeys: Al Biruni and Ibn Battuta', in which she contextualized the two medieval travel writers. She argued for their writings being seen as part of a larger tradition of Islamic medieval writing of the Golden Era, characterized by the gathering knowledge within the medieval Islamic world of "Dar ul Islam" and the 'rihla' traditions, thus challenging the Western hegemonic perspective of seeing the medieval era as part of the dark ages.

In her presentation on Rahul Sankrityayan, 'Of Maps, Migrations, Miscegenation: *Volga se Ganga* as Travel Writing', **Dr. Maya Joshi** eloquently spoke of the independent, critical mind of the prolific, maverick writer who is best known as the Father of Travel Writing in Hindi Literature. She argued for the staunch cosmopolitan notions that Sankrityayan stood for, emphasizing the need to read the prescribed text within the larger context of his writings.

Dr. Anjana Sharma's paper 'A Woman of Observation: Gender, Travel and Romanticism in

Mary Wollstonecraft's Letters Written during a Short Residence in Sweden, Norway and

Denmark' impressed upon the audience the need to examine the context of Wollstonecraft's

context, biographical as well as historical. She also encouraged teachers to adopt a more inquisitive

strain of pedagogy, rather than simply teaching texts in an examination-oriented, instrumental

manner.

In the last session of the day, Dr. Anjana Neira Dev in her presentation 'Traveling across Time

and Space: William Dalrymple in *The City of Djinns*' offered a cross-textual study of Dalrymple's

early and later books on the theme of travel with the main focus on The City of Djinns as a

fascinating and informative book on the history of Delhi, its various shifting capitals, myths, and

legends. The Faculty Development Programme concluded with Dr. Anjana Neira Dev distributing

certificates to all the participants.



Teacher as a mentor requires empowering the students to develop their strength, beliefs and potentiality and personal attitudes.

A total of 29 staff members participated in the training programme (Physics-11, Chemistry-10, Botany -04 and Zoology-04). The session wise resource person details of each department is attached with the report. After compiling the feedback of each participants we can surely say that the event was successful and informative.

SESSION-1

Theme: Tools and Techniques used in Plant Sciences

Resource Person: Dr. Ranjana Roy Mishra, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, Kalindi College

No. of Participants: 04

Highlights/Objective of the session:

In the session, a power point presentation was given by Dr. Ranjana Roy Mishra describing

- 1 How to make percentage solutions
- 2. Molar solutions
- 3. Buffers

Difference between stock and working solution was described and Calculation were explained. An interactive discussion was held to make the concept clear. Phosphate buffer and their making was described using monobasic and dibasic salts.

Storage and labelling of chemicals as well as their biohazard aspects were discussed. Special emphasis was given on carcinogenic chemicals like Benzene, Ethidium Bromide and Ninhydrin, their handling and disposal. Biohazard symbols were discussed and how to recognize them on bottle was made clear. Different glasswares and equipments used in laboratory were explained in detail with their proper terms and usage. They included autoclavable and non autoclavable screw cap bottles, Amber bottles, Falcon tubes, centrifuge tubes, magnetic beads, Retriver, Water Distillation unit, Magnetic stirrer, pH meter Micropipette, Microtips, Microcentrifuge tubes, Autoclave, Laminair flow, BOD incubator, shaker, DNA and Protein electrophoresis units, power supplies, UV transilluminator, microbiology techniques etc. Their Biosafety aspects were also discussed simultaneously. Different types of Microscopes, staining methods and Preservation of specimens via different fixatives was also explained.

The demonstration was given on the types of electrodes and operation of instruments like pH- meter, potentiometer and conductivity meter. The participants performed acid – base titration by using conductometer.

Highlights/Objective of the session:

This session started with a short lecture on crystal structure, structural features influencing the boiling and melting points of pure substances and the effect of impurity on these.

The uses of recrystallization and importance of purity were discussed along with boiling point and melting point as a criterion for purity and identification.

The participants were given hands-on training in crystallization using various solvents. This was followed by melting point determination using kjehldahl and electronic apparatus. For liquids, boiling point determination was done by distillation method followed by kjehldahl method.

Theme: (i) Preparation of solutions in Chemistry Laboratory for various experiments, (ii) Cleaning techniques for some Basic Laboratory Apparatus, (iii) Reagent Preparation.





Report

A one-day Faculty Development Programme on the newly introduced Discipline Centred Elective optional paper in the BA(H) English III year syllabus entitled **Literature and Cinema** was organized by the English Department, Kalindi College, University of Delhi on 16th February 2018. There were five eminent speakers who spoke on various aspects of the paper, addressing a gathering of 44 participants, all teachers from different institutions. Towards the end of the day, the participants brainstormed in groups to create a question bank.

The first session was on "Adaptation as a Discipline" where Dr. Anuradha Ghosh spoke about adaptation still being a nascent discipline, which was expansive enough to accommodate the larger strokes of the process and ideology of cinematic adaptations as much as it could look at a comparative study of the literary with its cinematic translation.

Dr. Poonam Trivedi took up the next session on cinematic adaptations of Shakespeare's *Romeo* and Juliet in her presentation "What's in a word/ image?" where she not only examined the versions directed by Franco Zeffirelli and Baz Luhrmann, but also compared them to Indian cinematic adaptations of the play.

In her paper entitled "Cinematic Ways of Seeing" Dr. Karen Gabriel addressed the technological and ideological aspects of cinema. She spoke about how the language of cinema was not only created by technology, but was also informed by the choices that are fundamentally ideological and political. She also focused on the differences that are found in the business aspects of Hollywood and Bollywood, which are gradually being erased.

Dr. Dilip Basu traces the evolution of spy films from its conceptual beginnings to the James Bond movies in his presentation "Evolution of Spy Films with Reference to *From Russia with Love*". He spoke about this genre of movies and how the language of film transformed literary conventions to the cinematic, the latter becoming a more entrenched stereotype in the popular imagination.

In "The Transgressive Body: Women in Partition Films", Dr. Debjani Sengupta showed clips of different Bollywood films to examine stereotypes around religion that were created around the Partition in North India. She also briefly demonstrated the subtler effects of the Partition upon the individual's psyche translated into cinematic language in Ritwik Ghatak's oeuvre.

In the final session of the day before the Valedictory, the participants were divided into groups and each group brainstormed to come up with questions which may act as pointers for the lecturers teaching the particular text/topic. The question bank was later compiled and sent to all the participants who helped to make it.

The Faculty Development Programme concluded with the Principal, Dr. Anula Maurya, thanking the resource persons and giving the certificates to all the participants.



Faculty Development Programme on "Legislative Practices and Procedures" on 6th April, 2017 in the College premises.

Under CBCS, "Legislative Practices and Procedures" as part of the Skill Enhancement Course in the undergraduate course of Political Science Honours and "Legislative Support" in BA Program have been introduced. There has been a constant need since its introduction for developing a uniform pedagogy for the course. The Programme was an attempt to assist the faculty members of the colleges of the University of Delhi in understanding the dynamics of Legislative Practices and the technicalities of Legislative Procedures. The pedagogic interventions deliberated upon curriculum, teaching guidelines and reading material for newly introduced Skill Enhancement Course. The Programme brought together scholars working on this area and the teachers teaching this course to come together for working out the guidelines of the course as well as for updating the knowledge with regard to the current developments in this field.


