7.1.9 Sensitization of students and employees of the Institution to the constitutional obligations: values, rights, duties and responsibilities of citizens

a. **Spreading election awareness among students** Department of Political Science organised National Voters' Day (NVD) on Jan 25 in partnership with Sanjivani (NGO) and Chief Electoral Office, Delhi. The theme of 2016 NVD was "Inclusive and Qualitative Participation" and the slogan was 'NO VOTER SHOULD BE LEFT BEHIND'.

b. One Billion Rising: Sensitization for violence against women

On the initiative of Department of Political Science on 5th February 2016, Kalindi College became the third college of University of Delhi to have participated in the One Billion Rising movement, the global mass action to end all types of violence against women.

The volunteers from Blood Connect organized an awareness camp on blood donation in the college premises on 7th March 2016. The NSS unit of Kalindi College organized Blood Donation Camp in association with the Social Responsibility Cell of the college. It witnessed mass participation from students resulting in collection of more than76 units of blood.

d. Teaching kids of construction workers
