- "Vittiya Saksharta Abhiyaan (VISAKA)"


 The campaign "Vittiya Saksharta Abhiyaan (VISAKA)" was initiated on 2nd

 January, 2017 with the maxim of Financial Digital Literacy Campaign. The project aimed at educating students, teachers, non-teaching staff of college and



the traders in nearby areas of the College. NSS and NCC volunteers of the college were educated about the needs to equipthe country proceeding towards becoming a Cashless Economy Along with the announcement of demonetisation in December 2016, the Government of India initiated the process of digitisation of money. A lot of people especially the traders and shopkeepers were facing a lot of problems in understanding the digital modes of payments. Ensuing with this objective the college decided to send volunteers from college to nearby residents and Tank road market to spread the awareness.

- The owners and workers of the outlets/stores were instructed regarding the usage of E-wallets (paytm, free charge etc.)
- o Inculcating the habit of transacting money through Plastic Money (credit card, debit card,prepaid card etc)




Social Responsibility

• Social Responsibility Cell

Connecting Dreams Foundation (CDF), Kalindi College chapter, operative since March 2017, aims at providing education to underprivileged children in schools. In order to realize the dreams of children, CDF Kalindi in association with the Social Responsibility Cell (SRC) started its first project 'DREAM KEY LIBRARY' in April 2017. The dreams of these kids were then connected by volunteers of SRC. It has been able to connect around 150 dreams through



donation camps, personal donation and donation from teachers. In addition, it also completed one school dream which was to have a 'playroom' in the school. In every visit to the school, the team of SRC added new books to the library and filtered the dreams. In total the SRC has been able to seeing smiles on their innocent faces. This little contribution helped those children fulfill their long lost dreams.

- In September 2017, the social responsibility cell came up with its second project 'KILKARI'. Under project Kilkari, the children living on streets are chosen by the R&D team, their families are counseled about the importance of education. A Kilkari pathshala in the slum areas of Jhandewalan with a strength of around 20 kids is being conducted every 4 days in a week.
- In January 2018, the SRC started its third project, 'MASOOM'. Interaction with a lot of organisations and day to day experiences made the team realize that the community of special people needs a lot of attention. They lack equality, respect, love, affection and they are denied the acceptance and emotions that every human being on this Earth deserves.. A total of 5 volunteers are handling these 3 areas by conducting sessions three times a week, each session is for two hours. After a successful operation of this project, the volunteers have been able to inculcate a feeling of 'being a normal person' in the minds of special people and also in making them aware of various things such as identification of coins and notes, time and basic skills.
- O The fourth project is Project Rehmat of SRC is being undertaken by volunteers of Enactus Kalindi. Project Rehmat has a mission to create a nation where a person does not die for a living. Manual scavenging inhuman occupation has been banned by the constitution for the past 13 years but it is still being practiced on a large scale. To protect these cleaning soldiers of our nation, Enactus Kalindi came up with Project REHMAT. Under project Rehmat, the team focuses on 3 aspects: safety, community building and entrepreneurship. With the first 90 days of commencement of the project the team sold 12 kits, created community in 3 areas namely Kirti Nagar, Seelampur and Mayur Vihar.

• IBSD COMMITTEE







• In October 2020, Enactus Kalindi took part in the first ever online fundraiser organized by the Books For All initiative under Daan Utsav of Guzaarish NGO







