
Rashtriya Swachhta Kendra organised a digital exhibition to showcase the success story of Swachh Bharat Mission at Gandhi Darshan Complex , Rajghat on 26th , August 2022 . Nearly 154 students and 5 faculty members from Kalindi college participated in this exhibition . From the Souvenir Shop & Information Centre , students moved to the Amphitheater taking a view of the area. The exhibition began at Hall A , a 360°State Of The Art Auditorium , showcasing a visual depiction of success of Swachh Bharat Mission.

The Swachh Bharat Mission is one of the biggest mass movements or Jan Andolan programmes of independent India. Announced on 02 October, 2014 by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) aims to change the image of rural India through mass scale behavior change. Under Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin), 10.28 crore toilets have been constructed in 36 states/UTs. 603,175 villages were declared open defecation free in five years. More than 30 crore people participated in the behavior change campaigns under the world's largest behavior largest programme. Further students moved to 'Hall B' that depicted the whole process of Swachh Bharat Mission starting with the Introductory gallery, to the pre -SBM phase and then the inauguration by PM Narendra Modi. Various zones were part of Hall B like The champion zone, The Women Empowerment zone and The IEC zone. Swachh Sundar Sauchalaya Wall, The Stats wall and pledge wall are also captivating parts of the exhibition. The students in the end met Sauchha Singh, the robot. The whole exhibition was very enlightening and knowledgeable for the students.

To celebrate the Father of the Nation and his ideologies Kalindi College, the University of Delhi in collaboration with Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti organized a Student Symposium on Mahatma Gandhi and Global Citizenship Education on August 26th, 2022 at Gandhi Darshan, Rajghat, New Delhi. Dr. Sangita Dhal (Convenor) and Ms. Keertika Lotni (Co-Convenor) of Gandhi Study Circle, Kalindi College worked immensely to bring this event to great success.

About 150 students along with 5 faculty members from Kalindi College attend this event. A large number of students gathered from four other colleges, Shri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College, Miranda House College, Daulat Ram College, and Zakir Husain Delhi College of the University of Delhi, and participated in the event.

The wholesome motive behind this event was to educate its audience about the New Education Policy 2020, and other supportive policies of the government in accelerating Global Citizenship Education and to provide a vision to instill the Gandhian Ideological model. The presentations covered three-tier keynotes. First, Perspective on Gandhi and Global Citizenship Education. Second, How can we promote the study of Global Citizenship in the classroom? Third, skills needed for Global Citizenship Education.

Priyanshi Singh (Zakir Husain College) was the moderator of the program. The Student Symposium commenced with a film by GSDS (Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti) on the life of Gandhi, his contributions, and his beliefs. The music department of Kalindi college performed a blissful bhajan which is known to be Gandhi Ji's favorite 'Vaishnav Jan to'.

Soon after Raghujeet Singh and Yash Vahisht (SGTB Khalsa College) mesmerized the audience with the same Bhajan yet in their way. Prakhar Gupta (SGTB Khalsa College) aroused a deep patriotic sentiment in the hearts of the audience through his poetry.

Mr. Gulshan Grover addressed the guests and welcomed them by giving insights into the ideology and structure of the Global Citizenship Education model. After which, Divya Jha (Kalindi College) and Shakshi Kundu (Miranda House) recited poetry. Harshita and Meenu (University of Delhi) introduced the theme through a presentation on quality education, global citizenship education, its value, and the new education policy.

A series of speeches took place where students Amisha Das (Zakir Husain College), Deeksha Rawat (Kalindi College), Anushka Saxena (SGTB Khalsa College), Muskan Patel (Miranda House), Suman Kumari (Daulat Ram College) elaborated on various aspects of the theme, approaches, relevance, principles, and emphasis on other branches associated with global

citizenship. One of them quoted Gandhi Ji, he said, "I do not want my house to be walled in on all sides and my windows to be stuffed. I want the cultures of all lands to be blown about my house as freely as possible, but I refuse to be blown off my feet by any."

Followed by another series of speeches by JushyaKhambiri (Zakir Husain College), Dolly Hirawat (Kalindi College), and Amrita (SGTB Khalsa College). Later, the moderator talked about Non-Violent communication and projected video reflections on the Non-Violent Communication program. And soon they called for a break.

After the break, people were awakened by the exemplary performance by Raqs: The Street Play Society of Kalindi College that acted as a satire on society and how Gandhi's ideologies are exceptionally relevant in Today's scenario.

Divya, Pallavi, and Vishakha from Kalindi College mentioned the developmental aspects in his teachings and cognitive, social, emotional, and physical emancipation along with the empowerment of youth for a nation to progress. Harshita (Kalindi College) presented Gandhi as a revolutionary ideology. Concurring from all the arguments presented, there is a strong need for a positive change or else the world will deflect toward destruction or terrorism.

The performance from SGTB Khalsa College by Akash Kumar and Avani Jain made us reminisce about the incessant Contribution of Gandhi toward the freedom struggle. There were endearing performances by students of Kalindi College and SGTB Khalsa College. Kalindi College's students Mansi Jain sang 'Teri Mitti', Dilnashi Zehra recited poetry and Shallu sang a patriotic song that invoked the patriotism and charisma of the youth.



Students of Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur Khalsa College and YMCA also participated in the program with great enthusiasm. On the occasion of 153rd Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi (2nd October – International Day of Nonviolence) National Gandhi Museum in association with United Nations Organisation is organizing competitions to the students at National Gandhi Museum campus at Rajghat. The students of Kalindi College, University of Delhi were awarded the opportunity to participate in the Quiz Competition and Oratorical Competition on the topic "Gandhi's Vision of India", organised by National Gandhi Museum on 15 September, 2022 from 11 am to 3pm.
