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


ABOUT NSS

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME is a Central Sector Scheme of the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. It provides an opportunity to the student youth of schools of Technical institutions, Graduate & Post Graduate at the colleges and University level of India to participate in various government-led community service activities & programs. With the sole aim to provide hands-on experience to young students in delivering community service. In May 1969, a conference of student representatives (of universities and institutions of higher education) convened by the Ministry of Education and the University Grants Commission unanimously agreed that a national-service scheme could be an instrument for national integration. On 24 September 1969, the then Union Education Minister V.K.R.V. Rao launched the NSS program in 37 universities covering all states. simultaneously requested the Chief Ministers of States for their cooperation and help. It was appropriate that the program was started during the Gandhi Centenary Year as it was Gandhiji who inspired the Indian youth to participate in the movement for Indian independence and the social uplift of the downtrodden masses of our nation.

ABOUT THE NSS UNIT OF KALINDI COLLEGE

NSS UNIT of Kalindi College, the University of Delhi is a group of young girl volunteers under the guidance of programme officer Dr. Alka Chaturvedi who opt to serve the nation through the NSS-led community service wearing the NSS badge with pride and a sense of responsibility towards helping the needy. We believe the best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in the service of others.

It also provides opportunities for the students to take part in various government-led community service activities & programs. 'Not me but you're' keeping this motto in mind organize a series of social events and conduct various awareness programs based on many social issues throughout the session for a better understanding of society and betterment of the society. MOTTO OF NSS

The Motto Of NSS is “Not Me But You”, An NSS volunteer places the ‘community’ before ‘self’. To practice national integration and social harmony. NSS attempts to establish meaningful linkages between ‘Campus and Community’, ‘College and Village’ and ‘Knowledge and Action’. In which our aim to instill the idea of selfless services for helping society in every possible way and striving to work hard to ensure the enhanced standard of living.

OUR OBJECTIVE

Our main objective is to understand the community and also to provide opportunities to the students to connect them and understand themselves in relation to their community and to utilize their knowledge in finding out practical solutions to individual and community problems

SELECTION OF VOLUNTEERS

Firstly interested students are required to fill out the registration form. Secondly, the students are called for an interview, and based on their abilities the students are shortlisted.

Each volunteer is required to work for 2 years and 240 hours in total. After completing the benchmark of required hours they are awarded certificates.

Our NSS Team consists of two groups i.e., OFFICE BEARERS and VOLUNTEERS.

Office bearers are selected based on their work and also have to go through another interview conducted by the programme officer explaining how they are the best candidate for leading the team.


PLANTATION DRIVE, 5TH JUNE 2021





BEST OUT OF WASTE COMPETITION, 12TH JULY 2021





TALENT HUNT COMPETITION, 15TH JULY 2021








POSTER-MAKING COMPETITION, 28TH JULY 2021



NATIONAL YOUTH AWARDS, 12TH AUGUST 2021









DEBATE COMPETITION, 26TH AUGUST 2021





The National Service Scheme of Kalindi College on 8th September, on the occasion of International Literacy Day, organized a virtual inter-college Article Writing Competition.



Putting Your Beliefs in Action.


JAM COMPETITION, 12TH JANUARY 2022

EXTEMPORE SPEECH COMPETITION, 13TH FEBRUARY 2022





The time of the competition was 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm. During this time duration participants were requested to give the slogan poster and thus the winners declared were:-





WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY, 5TH JUNE 2022



YOGA CELEBRATION , 21ST JUNE 2022



Urban gardeners are doing their work all around from last stop gardens to colourful windows hanging baskets more city goers are practicing their green thumbs.



If we gauge our entire sector, then research says that women's issues are either concentrated on her reproductive role and her body or on her economic role as a worker. But none of them is focused on empowering the women.

Women empowerment is the process that creates power in women to live a happy and honorable life in a society. Women are empowered when they are able to ingress opportunities in a variety of fields such as in education, profession, lifestyle, etc., without any restraints and restrictions. It includes raising their status through education, awareness, literacy and training. It also encompasses the authority to take decisions. When a woman makes a crucial decision, she feels empowered. Women's empowerment is the most momentous point for the overall advancement of a country rate. Out of the total population, 50% of the population should consist of women. However, due to female foeticide practices, girl child numbers are declining sharply in India. It has also striked the sex ratio in India. The literacy rate in girls is very low. Most of the girls are not even provided with primary education. Moreover, they are married early and made to raise children and do only household work.



CLIMATE CHANGE AND GOVERNMENT OF INDIA

World temperatures are rising because of human activity, and climate change now threatens every aspect of human life. Humans and nature are and will be experiencing catastrophic warming with worsening droughts greater sea level rise and mass extinction of species. We face a huge challenge but there are potential solutions to it.

- What is Climate Change?

Climate is the average weather in a place over many years. Climate change is a shift in those average conditions.


The rapid climate change that are now seen are caused by human beings using oil gas and coal for their homes factories and transportation.

When these fossil fuels burn their release greenhouse gases mostly carbon dioxide. These gases trap the sun's heat and cause planet's temperature to rise. The world is now about 1.2 degrees Celsius warmer it was in the 19 century and the amount of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere has risen by 50%. A report in 2021 by climate action tracker group calculated that the world was heading for 2.4 degrees Celsius of warming by the end of the century. If nothing is done, scientists think global warming could exceed 4 degrees Celsius in the future leading to the devastating impacts.

- Impact of Climate Change

Extreme weather are already threatening our lives and livelihoods.

- Regions could become uninhabitable.
- Farmlands could turn into deserts.
- Extreme rainfall causing rhetoric flooding as seen recently in China, Germany, Belgium and the Netherlands.
- Poor will suffer the most due to lack of facilities to them.
- Oceans and its habitats are also under threat like the Great Barrier Reef in Australia.
- Wildfires are becoming more frequent.



▪ As frozen ground melts in places like Siberia, greenhouse gases trapped for centuries will be released into the atmosphere, worsening the climatic conditions.

▪ Animals find it harder to sustain. For example, polar bears could die out as the ice they rely on melts away, and elephants struggle to find the 150-300 liters of water a day they need.

Scientists believe at least 550 species could be lost if action is not taken.

- Government Initiatives

» Countries agree that climate change can only be tackled by working together. In a landmark agreement in Paris in 2015, they pledged to try to keep global warming to 1.5°C.

» The COP26 global climate summit in Glasgow in November 2021 is crucial if climate change is tackled positively.

- In this summit countries set out their carbon reduction plans for 2030.

- Many of them have pledged to get out to net zero by 2050. This means reducing greenhouse gas emissions as much as possible and balancing out the remaining emissions by absorbing an equivalent amount from the atmosphere.

- Experts agree that this is achievable, but it will require governments, businesses, and individuals to make big changes.

- Conclusion

At an individual level, we can limit our impact on the climate in the following ways:

- Take fewer flights.
- Live car free or use an electric car.
- Buy energy efficient products such as washing machines, when they need replacing.
- Switch from a gas heating system to an electric heat pump.
- Do plantation.



आजादी का अमृत महोत्सव

15 अगस्त 2022 को भारत की आजादी के 75 वर्ष पूरे हो जाएंगे। भारत की आजादी के 75 साल पूरे होने के साथ, यह आजादी को फिर से मनाने का समय है जजसे हमने 75 साल हाससल फकया है। अमृत महोत्सव की शुरुआत प्रधानमंत्री नरेंद्र मोदी ने 12 मार्च 2021 को नमक सत्याग्रह के 91 वर्ष पूरे होने पर साबरमती आश्रम से की है। आज के युवा आजादी संग्राम में होने वाली कई घटनाओं और कई वीरों से अपररर्चत है जजन्होंने आजादी की लडाई में अपना योगदान ददया। एक देश तभी आगे बढ़ता है जब वहाँके युवा अपनी जडों को याद रखते हो और अपने अततत से सबक लते हों। युवाओं को स्वतंत्रता और संघर्ष के महत्व को बताने के सलए घटना बहुत महत्वपूर्ण है। इस ऐततहाससक, सांस्कृततक और राष्ट्रीय रेतना का पालन करने के सलए, प्रधान मंत्री नरेंद्र मोदी ने अहमदाबाद, गुजरात में साबरमती आश्रम से एक पदयात्रा (स्वतंत्रता मार्ष) को झंडी ददखाकर रवाना फकया और इस तरह 'आजादी का अमृत महोत्सव' कायक्रष म का शुभारंभ फकया। आजादी का अमृत महोत्सव 15 अगस्त 2022 से 75 सप्ताह पहले शुरू हुआ और 15 अगस्त 2023 को समाप्त होगा।

दांडी मार्ष की तजष पर इस कायक्रष म की शुरुआत फ्रीडम मार्ष नामक पदयात्रा से की जाएगी। यह यात्रा अहमदाबाद के साबरमती आश्रम से शुरू होकर दांडी तक जाएगी और नमक सत्याग्रह की तरह 25 ददन में 241 मील का रास्ता तय फकया जाएगा जजसमें 80 पदयात्रत्रयों को शासमल फकया जाएगा। इसके तहत देश की अदम्य भावना के उत्सव ददखाने वाले सांस्कृततक कायक्रष म भी आयोजजत फकए जाएंगे। इनमें संगीत, नतूय, प्रवर्न, प्रस्तावना पठन (प्रत्येक पंजतत देश के ववसभन्न क्षेत्रों का प्रतततनचधत्व करने वाली ववसभन्न भार्ओं में) शासमल हैं। युवा शजतत को भारत के भववष्ट्य के रूप में ददखा ते हुए गायकवंदु में 75 स्वर के साथ-साथ 75 नतषक होंगे। साथ ही साथ इस आयोजन के माध्यम से 'वोकल रिलोकल' असभयान को बढ़ावा देने की कोसशश की जा रही है। इसके सलए साबरमती आश्रम के पास मगन तनकास है वहाँ एक रखा रखा गया है और ये रखा सामान्य रखा नहीं है जब भी कोई व्यजतत लोकल व्यापारी और कं पनी का माल खरीदेगा और उसकी तस्वीर को सोशल मीडडया पर लोकल रिलोकल का टैग लगाकर सोशल मीडडया पर डालेगा उसके तरंत बाद ये रखा घूमेगा।

इक्कीसवीं सदी का भारत

वर्तमान में हम इक्कीसवीं सदी में जी रहे हैं। जिस प्रकार उन्नीसवीं सदी को ब्रिटेन का समय कहा जाता है, बीसवीं सदी को अमेरिकन सदी कहते हैं, उसी प्रकार इक्कीसवीं सदी भारत की है। IBM इंस्टिट्यूट फॉर बिज़नेस वेल्यु की रिपोर्ट 'इन्डियन सेंचुरी' के अनुसार: भारत एक तेजी से बदलने वाली अर्थव्यवस्था है। आने वाले वर्षों में भारत को सबसे अधिक उन्नति करने वाले देशों में शामिल किया गया है। स्वतंत्रता के पश्चात् हमारे देश ने विभिन्न क्षेत्रों में उन्नति की है, जैसे: सामाजिक अर्थव्यवस्था में प्रगति, वैज्ञानिक आविष्कार, सांस्कृतिक रूप में समृद्धि, शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में विकास, खेती के उन्नत तरीके, तकनीकी और विज्ञान का समुचित विकास, चिकित्सा के क्षेत्र में अनुसंधान, आदि कई क्षेत्र हैं, जिनमें अब हम आगे बढ़ चुके हैं।

- **डिजिटल भारत** - आज के भारत को इक्कीसवीं सदी का भारत कहा गया है, मोदी सरकार के आने के बाद भारत में डिजिटल क्रांति का भी संचार बहुत ज्यादा हुआ है। जिस तरह ई-कॉमर्स ने भारत में जगह बनाई है ठीक इसी तरह आज भारत में अनेक सरकारी सुविधाओं के लिए हम घर बैठे ऑनलाइन आवेदन कर सकते हैं। यहाँ तक की अब तो यह सेवा बैंकिंग क्षेत्र में भी बढ़ गई है और अनेक डिजिटल बैंक्स भी भारतियों के लिए उपलब्ध है। आगे बढ़ते हुए भारत को डिजिटल योगदान मिलने के बाद भारत में अनेक तरह के बदलाव आने शुरू हुए है। और हम कह सकते हैं की आने वाला समय भारत का होगा।
- **आर्थिक क्षेत्र** -- आज हमारा देश आर्थिक रूप से पहले की अपेक्षा कहीं अधिक सक्षम है। हॉवर्ड यूनिवर्सिटी के अर्थशास्त्रियों के अनुसार भारत की विकास दर [Growth Rate] लगभग 7% है, जो इसे सबसे तेज गति से विकास करने वाला देश बनाती है और इसी वजह से वर्ष 2024 तक इसे चाइना से भी आगे ले जाएगी। अगर आज भी देखा जाये, तो भारत का स्थान दूसरा ही है अर्थात् अर्थव्यवस्था के मामले में हम चाइना के बाद विश्व की सबसे बड़ी आर्थिक शक्ति हैं। हमारे देश की मोदी सरकार और उने वित्तीय मंत्री मण्डल ने अभी हाल ही में विदेशी प्रत्यक्ष निवेश [FDI पॉलिसी] को पूर्ण रूप से अपनी मंजूरी प्रदान की है, जिससे अब कई बाहरी कम्पनियाँ भारत में बड़े पैमाने पर निवेश करने में नहीं हिचकिचाएंगी और जिसका लाभ देश की अर्थव्यवस्था को मिलेगा।
- **चिकित्सा विज्ञान क्षेत्र** :- प्राचीन काल से ही हम चिकित्सा के क्षेत्र में अक्ल रहे हैं, परन्तु उपकरणों के अभाव में हम पिछड़ गये थे, परन्तु आज स्थिति कुछ और है। हमारे देश में सभी बीमारियों का इलाज उपलब्ध है, साथ ही उनकी जांच के लिए भी सभी मशीनों की व्यवस्था देश में उपलब्ध कराई गयी है। स्वतंत्रता के बाद प्रारंभ की गयी प्रथम पंचवर्षीय योजना की तुलना में, आज हमारे चिकित्सकों और अस्पतालों में पलंगों की संख्या बढ़कर पहले की तुलना में क्रमशः लगभग 2 गुनी से 6 गुनी हो चुकी है। मलेरिया, टी.बी., हैजा [Cholera] जैसी बीमारियों से लोग पहले की अपेक्षा कम पीड़ित होते हैं। वही जानलेवा बीमारियों, जैसे: प्लेग, छोटी माता [Small Pox], आदि से होने वाली मृत्यु दर में भी कमी आई है। देश में व्याप्त पोलियो जैसी बीमारी को लगभग हम पूर्णतः खत्म कर चुके हैं। देश में औसत आयु बढ़ी है और बिमारियों से होने वाली मृत्यु दर में भी कमी आई है। नेशनल हेल्थ पालिसी के अनुसार हम "सभी के लिए स्वास्थ्य" [Health For All] के लक्ष्य को भी जल्दी ही प्राप्त कर लेंगे। चिकित्सा विज्ञान में उन्नति करने के साथ ही हम देश में बीमारियों के प्रति जानकारी फैलाने और उससे बचाव के प्रति जागरूकता उत्पन्न करने में भी सफल रहे हैं।

- तकनीकी क्षेत्र में : तकनीकी के मामले में भी हम पहले की अपेक्षा कहीं अधिक आगे बढ़ चुके हैं। कई मशीनें, यंत्र, आदि का अब हमें आयात नहीं करना पड़ता, बल्कि हम स्वयं ही उसका उत्पादन कर रहे हैं। बड़े-बड़े कारखानों में उत्पादन, मशीनों की सहायता से माल बनाना, संगणक से कार्य करना [Computerization], आदि ने इस प्रक्रिया को अधिक सरल बना दिया है।
- **Computerization** : आज हमारे देश का प्रत्येक विभाग कम्प्यूटर पर कार्य करता है, किसी भी जानकारी को आप इसके माध्यम से आदान-प्रदान कर सकते हैं। साथ ही सभी सूचनाएँ भी इसी पर उपलब्ध हो जाती हैं। इसके अंतर्गत 'ई-कॉमर्स' भी शामिल है। जिसके द्वारा हम घर बैठे-बैठे अपना सामान कम्प्यूटर पर खरीद सकते हैं और बेच भी सकते हैं। ये ई-कॉमर्स कम्पनियाँ स्थानीय बाजारों से प्रतियोगिता करती हैं, पर वही दूसरी ओर ये कई लोगों को रोजगार भी उपलब्ध करा रही हैं।
- ऑटो - मोबाइल क्षेत्र : इस क्षेत्र में हम अब तक वांछित उन्नति नहीं कर पाए हैं, जैसे : हमारा देश आज भी कारों के निर्माण के लिए विदेशी तकनीक पर ही निर्भर है। हम केवल इसके कुछ भाग ही बनाते हैं। परन्तु प्रयास जारी है और जल्द ही हम इस क्षेत्र में भी सफलता प्राप्त कर लेंगे।
- कृषि उत्पादन के क्षेत्र : आज हमारे देश में कृषि करते समय आने वाली बाढ़, सूखे आदि समस्याओं से निपटने के लिए पर्याप्त साधन और तकनीकी उपलब्ध हैं, जिसके चलते आज 21वीं सदी के भारत देश का उत्पादन कई गुना बढ़ गया है। आज हम हमारे देश की खाद्य-पदार्थों की जरूरतों को तो पूरा कर ही सकते हैं, बल्कि दूसरे देशों की जरूरतों के मुताबिक निर्यात करने में भी सक्षम हैं। इस स्थिति को पाने में देश में चलाई गयी 'हरित क्रांति' का बहुत बड़ा योगदान है। फसलों के खराब होने, सड़ने जैसी समस्याओं पर हमने नियंत्रण पा लिया है और दूसरी ओर उन्नत बीजों, खाद, सिंचाई के पर्याप्त और उन्नत तरीके, संग्रहण क्षमता, आदि ने इसके विकास में बहुत महत्व-पूर्ण भूमिका निभाई है।
- रक्षा उपकरणों के क्षेत्र में : हमारे देश में 3 प्रकार की फौजें हैं : थल सेना, जल सेना और वायु सेना। तीनों को सम्मिलित किया जाये तो हम विश्व की प्रथम 7 शक्तियों में स्थान रखते हैं। साथ ही तीनों ही सेनाओं के रक्षा उपकरण भी हमारे पास पर्याप्त मात्रा में उपलब्ध हैं। हाल ही में सबसे कम वजन का लड़ाकू विमान बनाने में भी हमने सफलता प्राप्त की है। इस विमान का नाम 'तेजस' है और इसके लगभग सभी कल - पुर्जे, मशीनें, आदि भारत में बनाई गई हैं। यह हमारी रक्षा के क्षेत्र में अब तक की सबसे बड़ी उपलब्धि है नजी क्षेत्रों को रक्षा क्षेत्र में सम्मिलित करने से इसके तीव्र गति से विकास की सम्भावनाएँ व्यक्त की जा रही हैं। इसमें अम्बानी बंधू, टाटा जैसी कंपनियों को शामिल किया गया है, परन्तु अभी इनके प्रोजेक्ट सरकार के पास अनुमति हेतु अटके हुए हैं।
- शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में : हमारे देश में शिक्षा का स्तर भी सुधरा है। परन्तु अभी तक हम केवल प्राथमिक शिक्षा को ही मुफ्त उपलब्ध करा पाए हैं, जो काफी नहीं है। आज हमारे देश में विद्यार्थी सभी क्षेत्रों में उच्च शिक्षा प्राप्त कर सकते हैं। यहाँ पर्याप्त मात्रा में शालाएँ, महाविद्यालय, आदि खोले गये हैं। साथ ही हमारे यहाँ बाहर के विद्यार्थी भी शिक्षा ग्रहण करने आते हैं। हमारे देश में प्रौढ़ शिक्षा अभियान, सर्व शिक्षा अभियान जैसे कार्यक्रम चलाकर

- देश में शैक्षिक स्तर को सुधारने के लिए सराहनीय कदम उठाए गये हैं. देश के सम्पूर्ण विकास के लिए लड़कों के साथ - साथ लड़कियों की शिक्षा के लिए भी समुचित प्रयास जारी हैं. बल्कि आज देश में कल्पना चावला [प्रथम भारतीय महिला अंतरिक्ष यात्री इंदिरा गाँधी [प्रथम महिला प्रधानमंत्री], प्रतिभा देवी सिंह पाटिल [प्रथम महिला राष्ट्रपति], चंदा कोच्चर [ICICI बैंक की वर्तमान CEO एवं D.], आदि जैसी महिलाये तो पुरुषों से भी आगे निकल चुकी हैं. इक्कीसवीं सदी का भारत जहाँ इन क्षेत्रों में उन्नति प्राप्त कर रहा है, वही कुछ क्षेत्र ऐसे हैं, जिनकी तरक्की अभी बाकी है, जिनकी परिस्थितियों में सुधार की आवश्यकता शेष है, उनमे से कुछ क्षेत्र अग्र - लिखित हैं
- बेरोजगारी : आज हमारे देश को युवा - शक्ति के मामले में विश्व का सबसे समृद्ध राष्ट्र माना जाता है, परन्तु रोजगार के अभाव में यह शक्ति व्यर्थ हो रही है और इसी कारण हमारे देश की कई प्रतिभाये विदेशों में स्वयं को साबित करके रोजगार प्राप्त कर रही हैं, जिसमे देश का ही नुकसान है. देश के युवा दिशा - हीन होकर अपराध के मार्ग पर बढ़ रहे हैं. हमारे देश में हमें रोजगार के अनेक अवसरों की आवश्यकता है. यदि हम बेरोजगारी की समस्या से छुटकारा पा ले तो कई समस्याएँ स्वयं ही समाप्त हो जाएगी.
- गरीबी : हमारे देश में दुर्भाग्य की बात यह है कि अमीर और अमीर तथा गरीब और गरीब होता जा रहा है. इस कारण देश पूर्ण रूप से विकसित नहीं हो पा रहा और अभी तक विकासशील देशों की गिनती में गिना जाता है. इसका कारण कही न कही स्विस बैंकों में रखा काला धन भी है, यदि इसे देश में लाये जाने के प्रयास सफल हो, तो यह समस्या काफी हद तक हल हो सकती है.
- जनसंख्या : हमारे देश की जनसंख्या बहुत ही तेज गति से बढ़ रही है, जिसके कारण हम लागू योजनाओं का उचित प्रकार से लाभ नहीं उठा पाते और सरकार भी इन्हें व्यापक रूप में सफल नहीं बना पाती. हम भारतीय आज 125 करोड़ से भी अधिक हैं. जिसमें सभी सुविधाओं को बांटना, सरकार के लिए भी मुश्किल है. इस पर नियंत्रण पाना अत्यंत आवश्यक है अन्यथा हमारी समस्याओं की सीमा दिन - प्रतिदिन बढ़ती ही जाएगी.

इन सब के बावजूद हमें ' सुपर - पावर ' कहा जाता है, इसका कारण है: आज दक्षिण एशिया में भारत की स्थिति सभी क्षेत्रों में अन्य देशों की तुलना में सबसे मजबूत है, चाहे वह क्षेत्र आर्थिक हो, राजनीतिक क्षेत्र हो, सैन्य बल की बात हो, सांस्कृतिक क्षेत्र की बात हो अथवा जन - सांख्यिकी [Demographic] की. दक्षिण एशिया की जनसंख्या का लगभग 77% हिस्सा हमारे देश का है, इसकी जी.डी.पी. में हमारा योगदान 75% है, 77% भू - भाग हमारे क्षेत्रफल का हिस्सा है, इसके रक्षा बजट का 80% हिस्सा हमारा होता है और इसके सैन्य बल में 82% हमारा सैन्य बल शामिल है और सबसे महत्व - पूर्ण बात -: हम विश्व की सबसे बड़ी लोकतांत्रिक अर्थव्यवस्था में से एक हैं., जिसकी वर्तमान जी.डी.पी. दर 9.2% है, जो वैश्विक अर्थव्यवस्था में महत्व - पूर्ण स्थान रखती है. साथ ही हमारे देश के अन्य बड़ी अर्थव्यवस्था वाले राष्ट्रों के साथ समझौते और संधियाँ भी हैं, जो इसे इक्कीसवीं सदी का सुपर पावर बनाने में और विकास की ओर अग्रसर होने में मदद करती हैं. इस प्रकार इक्कीसवीं सदी के भारत का भविष्य बहुत ही स्वर्णिम है.













