

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




ANARGAYA CHIB TEAM LEADER 1ST YEAR

My first year in college was exciting and happening thanks to Politeia. Hopefully, I get to continue this journey for the next two years too.




India: A Growing Power

CLIMATE CRISIS: THE VERGE OF ABYSS BY

I have heard some people say that Homo sapiens is the smartest and most intelligent creatures on earth. But I want to ask, what would you call a person who beats their head against the wall and that too on purpose? Somehow, that's exactly what humans do. Not many can deny that the ultimate result of almost every human action is nothing, but self-destruction. Frankly, in reality, we are chasing our destruction. Let me get this straight, our current approach for development is leading us toward blowing up the entire planet – like literally, everything that we see. So yes, we are basically the most foolish creatures on earth. Here, in this piece of writing, I am specifically focusing on climate change and how we are on the verge of the abyss.

The point at which we stepped into this journey of self-destruction (of course, apart from environmental degradation there are other forms of destruction, but this issue is the most persistent one) was with the onset of the industrial revolution. And woosh... it's already been 270 years into the journey. Any ordinary person like me can only imagine, and not know exactly, the extent of harm that has already been done to our planet and to an uncountable number of living creatures. The global temperature has already increased by 1.2 C since the industrial revolution. 2500 billion tonnes of CO2 have already been emitted into the atmosphere. There is a certain limit to global CO2 emission (carbon budget) which, if crossed, will lead to global warming going over the 1.5 C mark. This can lead to the catastrophic destruction of our planet to the extent that I, in my capacity cannot describe. Out of this carbon budget, we are only 500 gt of CO2 below, before we reach the 1.5 C mark. And if we continue with our current greedy behavior, then this budget is ending very soon. And trust me, none of us in our right senses would want to cross this 1.5C mark. Over the years (some 300 years) the concentration of CO2 has been increasing gravely in the atmosphere, and selective climate action by a few activists won't help at all. Only if each and every human in their highest capacity will contribute to the cause, can we fight this phenomenon. It is easier said than done of course. The most immediate and apparently the only efficient solution to this is to stop burning fossil fuels. Nothing below a total phase-out of fossil fuel will work. But unfortunately, human rationality is only based on procuring higher economic gains and not on our very survival. Of course, if we follow this "total phase-out" approach, it will produce losers and winners. Phasing out fossil fuels will lead to huge losses for many industrialists and a loss of livelihood for a considerable chunk of the population. But when fighting climate change, we need to remember that the whole of humanity will emerge victors and absolutely no one would be a 'loser' in the true sense.

Policymakers and world leaders need to attract industries, companies, and carbon-based economies of the world toward green energy resources. We need to invest more and more in scientific innovations to develop cost-efficient green energy that promises equal or more gains than fossil fuels. And when these innovations enter the market, the big profit-seeking entities must substitute fossil fuels with green energies. The competition in fossil fuels will necessarily decline and green energy will become the driving force of economies across the nations. And one day we can hope that the climate crisis becomes a thing of the past.

"Sex Work" is "Work"

India is a growing nation, constantly working and improving itself by taking righteous steps. Over the past years, our political institutions have acknowledged taboo issues and couldn't hold the attention of the larger masses.

On May 26th, 2022, the Supreme Court of India acknowledged that Prostitution is ar profession and that all sex workers are entitled to a life of dignity and respect in society. This decision by the law enforcers has taken the common masses by the wind and is highly appreciated as it proves once again that the life of citizens, irrespective of their occupation, without dignity is incomplete and that the constitution is safeguarding the rights of all its citizens.

The supreme court judgment was entitled under various disciplines like

- 1) sex workers are entitled to equal protection by the law and criminal law must apply equally in all cases, considering age and consent;
- 2) sex workers should not be penalized or arrested or harassed or victimized whenever there is a raid on any brothel;
- 3) the child of a sex worker should not be separated from the mother on the grounds of occupation;
- 4) if sex workers are assaulted, proper medical and legal aid should be provided to them; and
- 5) media should not reveal the identity of the sex worker involved in case of raids.






This landmark acknowledgment of Sex work as an occupation (informal) has been a step toward compensation for discrimination and assault against the workers. Not only this decision highlights the importance of work or underlines the right to life with dignity of every individual, but it guides society to perceive sex workers and prostitution in a different light, and also safeguards the workers from further assault and being victims of crime. The occupation of an individual does not decide his or her right to life with dignity, but our mentality does.

Bemoan!


The war cries of samaj sevak in the name of janhit, but what is the war against and what for?

When Marriage Stands Between Rape

The split verdict of the honourable Delhi High Court on the issue of marital rape has led to immense deliberation upon the narrow line between the 'Right and Wrong'. Rape cases themselves hang from a thin rope of violation of consent, whose validity and credibility varies as per the situation in which the said crime was committed. These thin and blurry lines are synonymous with any women's issues these days. Women's issues have now become a Whack-a-Mole game with the hammer in the hands of the institutionalised patriarchy. It is a game of chance where justice is handed based not on the right that ensures it, but rather the mere chance of being able to avoid the strict hammer of men. No wonder Thor had the hammer and not Bella.

It is common parlance for men to dismiss marital rape as criminal, at times on public forums in the most condescending and demeaning ways. Patriarchy has led them to believe that they can mansplain their way through this too. They are not wrong though. They do mansplain their way through every other matter when it comes to women's rights. Men have been dictating the lives of women, their roles, rights and responsibilities through public institutions, academic literature, language and even the judiciary. It might seem like an exaggeration to say this in 2022, but what I cannot get off my mind is the fact that even a split verdict on the marital rape case is a difference of opinion between two men.

But the final decision has not been given and is up to the honourable Supreme Court now, which, if all goes well, is awaiting its first woman Chief Justice in the coming years. So, to dally on the judicial aspect is something I will avoid for now and hope to avoid after the final verdict too, given yet again, if all goes well. What cannot be avoided is the need to recognise the shortcomings in our system, social or political and not blatantly oppose any suggestible change in old policies.

Around 150 countries have criminalized marital rape as of 2019. While India boasts of leading the fight against COVID, yet we are unwilling to lead the fight against women's issues with the same enthusiasm. Enthusiasm is very far-fetched; we do not even give them the due recognition, forget support, all in the name of preservation of culture and traditions. But neither the "sindoor" nor the "mangal sutra" is supposed to protect the wife. It only protects the husband and the marriage. And the "nikahnama", though a contract, rarely ever addresses just treatment towards the bride after marriage. So, if a woman demands her rights to be protected after marriage, does that not seem a fair demand?



Remember, serving to the human cause, helping humans and most importantly, being human is what all we need and what is actually religion and God's will!




Let's do it for (our) your sake.

GREEN POLITICS

Green politics, or Eco politics, is a political ideology that aims to foster an ecologically sustainable society often, but not always, rooted in environmentalism, nonviolence, social justice and grassroots democracy. It began taking shape in the western world in the 1970s; since then, Green parties have developed and established themselves in many countries around the globe and have achieved some electoral success.

The common misapprehension, still held by a large section of the population, is that Green Politics is about environmentalism – that the principal objective is to get more effective legislation in place to combat pollution, encourage recycling, protect the countryside from excessive development and so on: in effect, to achieve a more environmentally-friendly version of the current

system. But Green Politics aims to reconstruct the patterns of human activities and relationships so that they come to respect and value the natural systems on which they depend. This goal is unachievable until equity and social justice are woven into the fabric of each politics stands upon 4 pillars social justice, grass-roots democracy, non-violence, and respect for diversity, which have become more or less established principles of Indian political parties. The integration of the environmental dimension of green politics, consisting in turn, of the twin pillars of ecological wisdom and sustainability, is in an evolutionary phase. It is likely that increasingly, this integration will reflect the views of the growing Indian middle class.

Mahatma Gandhi, the father of the nation, was a practitioner of "green politics" far ahead of his times. His politics in the first half of the last century embraced the six principles of green politics, namely social justice, ecological wisdom, grass-roots democracy, non-violence, ecological wisdom and sustainability, that were adopted in 2001 at the first Global Greens Congress at Canberra, Australia. Despite Gandhi's green politics, no established political party in India can claim to be a "green party" in the accepted sense of the term. India is constantly struggling with environmental issues such as floods and droughts every year. The water scarcity in Chennai and the air pollution in Delhi are the prime indicators of this problem. And yet we do not have a strong political representation of these issues in the elections in our country. Therefore, there is an urgent need for green politics in India.

TOWARDS BECOMING A BETTER LGBTQIA+ ALLY

This is the 21st century and we are in the middle of Pride Month. Given the aversion of society and its stakeholders towards this subject (LGBTQIA+ community), this assumed. more than enough. emphasize the ineluctability of addressing the needs of this community of people who are just as normal as any other human being.

The term LGBTQIA+ is an acronym for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, asexual, and others. The letters 'I' and 'A' are relatively newly adopted in the acronym. The "+" sign is a symbol that represents members of the community who identify with sexual orientation or gender identity that isn't included within the acronym. It's an inclusive way of representing gender and sexual identities that letters and words cannot yet fully describe.

There has been a lot of advancement in the legal landscape and the evolution of social opinions and attitudes related to an individual's sexuality, gender identity, and gender expression. However, the LGBTQIA+ community members still suffer pernicious and evident gender biases in all areas of public and private life. This includes housing, employment, opportunities in academic settings, in the ability to buy goods and services, and in the opportunities to participate meaningfully in our society's decision-making processes. Deeply embedded homophobic and transphobic attitudes, often integrated with a lack of adequate legal protection against discrimination on grounds of sexual orientation and gender identity, expose many LGBTQIA+ people of all ages and in all regions of the world to appalling violations of their human rights.

To comprehend the important terms in this context, such as Homophobia and Transphobia, an understanding of phobia is needed. Phobia is derived from the Greek word 'Phobos' which means fear. It is a persistent irrational fear of a specific object, activity, or situation that compels a person to avoid it. So, homophobia is the fear of homosexuals, those who prefer to be intimate with people of their gender. Similarly, transphobia is the aversion to people who are transgender. This includes fear and discrimination against them. The causes of such phobias can be psychologically rooted or a result of social norms/pressure. Anyone, regardless of their sexual orientation and/or gender identity, can support the LGBTQIA+ people. And while there is no cookie-cutter way of being an ally, doing so requires education, advocacy, efforts, and a desire to learn from one's mistakes. There are several ways to be a good ally to the community.

The first and foremost way is to acknowledge our privileges. As individuals, we may not experience discrimination first-hand and that is exactly how we should recognize this privilege. This allows us to understand how inherently different the case is for people belonging to the community. Acknowledging the fact that their struggle is far greater than ours is essential. Additionally, this helps us empathize with their problems. The second way to be a good ally is to educate oneself about the lives of the people of the community and be receptive to learning new things and concepts. An ally should have clarity of gender differences and pronouns for each of them, as the initial step. The members of the LGBTQIA+ community may have significantly different experiences and it is very important to be informed of their issues, latest news, etc. Researching about other related and relevant topics such as trans prejudice, pride month among others, will also help broaden one's perspective. Thirdly, an ally is also someone who listens, with an open mind. The journey of being an ally brings new, sometimes shocking information to one's consciousness which requires open-mindedness. Attentively listening to people also creates a sense of comfort amongst them and eventually also enhances our ability to understand better. Fourthly, allyship also means inculcating a sense of responsibility in us to ask questions respectfully. As straight or cisgender allies, a lot of care must be put in framing questions directed towards the members of the LGBTQIA+ community.

Blatant assumptions should not be made, and questions should be asked to gain correct information. Asking questions also bring varying angles and something as dynamic as the experiences of people requires exactly that. Another crucial way to be a good ally is to speak for the underrepresented and marginalized. If one recognizes something damaging towards the LGBTQIA+ community then an ally must raise their concern for the same. Something as small as misgendering someone who isn't physically present should be corrected and be used as a teachable moment. Especially those who are privileged must advocate for those whose voices are shut down. To be a good ally, one must also confront their flaws. An ally may not always be right and so, needs to challenge their own biases, stereotypes, etc. Being open to the idea of sometimes being faulty and willing to work on what is right is an important aspect of progressing towards becoming a better ally. Lastly, an ally must always be inclusive and kind. Small things such as acting with kindness and empathy bring big differences to those who're clear targets of discrimination.

Ultimately, it's about taking small steps together towards achieving the greater goal of equality and inclusivity.

धर्म (Religion) Vs एथिक्स (Ethics), मोरैलिटी (Morality)

आज बात करते हैं कुछ अंतर्विरोधों की बाह्य दुनिया से लेकर आंतरिक मानवीय अस्तित्व या मैं कहूं अंतरात्मा तक की प्रत्येक परिस्थितियों में हर क्षण हर पल मानवीय स्वभाव कई अंतर्विरोधों व सह संबंधो के साथ कई क्रियाकलाप करता हैं। किंतु यह अंतर्विरोध क्या हैं? क्या मनुष्य एक ही परिस्थिति मे प्रत्येक क्षण अलग-अलग भावों एवं विरोधों से घिर सकता है? आप सोच रहे होगें कि ऐसा मानवीय स्वभाव के कारण होता हैं, किंतु नहीं, हाँ, मानवीय स्वभाव प्रत्येक स्थिति में अलग-अलग हो सकते हैं किंतु एक ही स्थिति में दो अलग-अलग विचारों का उद्भव वह भी अंतर्विरोधी संबंध मे, एक अलग स्थिति को प्रदर्शित करती हैं। वह है बाह्य नैतिक नियमों का आंतरिक नैतिक नियमों से टकराव अर्थात एथिक्स (Ethics) बनाम मोरैलिटी(morality)।

यूं तो नैतिकता नीतिशास्त्र का एक शब्द है, जिसकी उत्पत्ति इथोस (Ethos) से हुई है जिसका अर्थ प्राचीन काल में रीति-रिवाजों से लिया जाता था, किंतु आजकल इसका अर्थ आंतरिक विशेषता होता है। अकसर नैतिकता के लिए प्रायः मोरैलिटी शब्द का भी प्रयोग किया जाता है। इस मोरैलिटी शब्द का निर्माण लैटिन भाषा के शब्द मूर्स (Mores) से हुआ है, जिसका भी अर्थ है; रीति-रिवाज। किन्तु नैतिकता व मोरैलिटी के बीच एक पारदर्शी अंतर हैं, जिसे समझना

थोडा किठन है। नैतिकता और मोरालिटी का यह अंतर्विरोध बहुत ही ज्यादा उलझा हुआ है। यह हमेशा यह सोचने पर मजबूर करता है कि कौन सा कार्य नैतिक है या कौन सा मोरल है? देखा जाए तो एथिक्स और मोरालिटी में कोई तात्विक अंतर तो नहीं है। सामान्यतः जीवन में नैतिकता के लिए प्रायः "मोरैलिटी" शब्द का प्रयोग किया जाता हैं, जबिक अध्ययन के क्षेत्र में "एथिक्स" शब्द का प्रयोग किया जाता है।

यहाँ ध्यान देने वाली बात यह है कि जहाँ एथिक्स प्रोफेशनल नियमों के तहत निर्णय को बांधता है, क्योंकि इसमे नियमों का अत्यधिक असर होता है। जो मनुष्य को बाह्य कायदे व नियमों के प्रति आग्रसर करता हैं। और जिनमें वस्तुनिष्ठता स्पष्ट रूप से दिखाई देती हैं, उसे हम एथिक्स कह सकते हैं। किंतु मोरैलिटी व्यैक्तिक (personal) एवं आंतरिक निर्णयों पर निर्भर करता है



क्रोवल अंतरात्मा के द्वारा सुझाए जातें हैं और यह सब्जेक्टिव विषयों पर निर्भर होती है।

अतः जब बाहय दुनिया की यह नैतिक मान्यता जो आपकी अपनी आंतरिक नैतिक मान्यता भी बन जाती हैं, तब वहां मोरालिटी और एथिक्स का संयोग होता है और दोनों एक ही रूप में हमारे सामने प्रकट होती है। अतः हम कह सकते हैं कि एथिक्स और मोरैलिटी एक दूसरे के पर्यायवाची नही किन्तु अपूर्ण पर्यायवाची जरुर है।

अब प्रश्न उठता है कि इन का संयोग क्यों और कैसे होता है? मेरे विचार से एथिक्स और मोरैलिटी का संयोगात्मक पक्ष मनुष्य के व्यक्तिव, स्वभाव और धर्म से संचालित होते हैं। यहां धर्म की परिभाषा को स्पष्ट करना थोड़ा जिटल है, परंतु धर्म यहां भी अपना महत्वपूर्ण स्थान रखता है क्योंकि धर्म वह दर्शन है जो प्रायः महत्वपूर्ण विषयों की व्यवस्था एवं निष्पक्ष परीक्षण का प्रयास करता रहता है। और धर्म ही वह नैतिक अभिव्यक्ति है जो व्यक्ति के संपूर्ण जीवन को गहराई से प्रभावित करती है। क्योंकि जो मज़बूती धर्म पर टिकी नैतिकता(अर्थात धार्मिक नैतिकता) में होती हैं, वह धर्मिनरपेक्ष नैतिकता में नहीं हो सकती। इसीलिए मनुष्य का स्वभाव और व्यक्तित्व कहीं ना कहीं उसके धार्मिक नैतिक अभिव्यक्ति से अवश्य जुड़ा होता है। ऐसा हम विषय के सरलीकरण के लिए भी कह सकते हैं, क्योंकि यदि हम केवल बुद्धि या तर्क के स्तर पर नैतिक/अनैतिक का फैसला करते हैं, तो इसमें समस्या यह है कि हमारी बुद्धि बहुत बड़े लालच और भय के सामने कमज़ोर पड़ जाती हैं।

इसके विपरीत, यदि व्यक्ति गहरी धार्मिक निष्ठा रखता हैं और उसे इस बात पर अखंड विश्वास है कि ईश्वर ही संपूर्ण जगत का नियंता है और उसकी मर्जी के बिना यहां एक पत्ता भी नहीं हिल सकता है तो उसके मन में एक अद्भुत आत्मविश्वास रहता है। ऐसी धार्मिक निष्ठा वाले लोग नैतिक-अनैतिक का फैसला इस आधार पर करते हैं कि उनके अपने धर्म द्वारा घोषित नैतिक मानदंड क्या हैं? उनके अनुसार धर्म द्वारा जिस आचरण को नैतिक होने का प्रमाण-पत्र मिला होता है, वे बिना किसी विचलन या द्वंद्व के उसे जीवन भर दुहराते रहते हैं। इसे ही कार्य नियंत्रण का मानदंड समझा जाता है।


अत: स्पष्ट रुप से कहा जा सकता है कि व्यक्ति जब तक किसी-न-किसी स्तर पर कर्म सिद्धांत को स्वीकार न कर ले, तब तक विश्व में नैतिक व्यवस्था नहीं चल सकती। अब इसका आधार धर्म हो भी सकता है एवं नहीं भी। क्योंकि धर्म और नैतिकता दो स्वतंत्र अवधारणाएँ हैं। धर्म नैतिकता को दृढ़ता व स्थिरता तो प्रदान करता है किंतु संपूर्ण अधिग्रहण नहीं करता हैं। नैतिकता स्वंतत्र रूप से प्रदर्शित हो सकती है, किन्तु मोरैलिटी कई रूपों मे मानव स्वभाव, मानवीय प्रवृत्ति एवं धर्म से जुड़ी होती है।

LOCAL SELF GOVERANCE IN JAMMU AND KASHMIR

The expression of aspirations of people at the grass root level and their direct participation in governance has been a challenge for most Indian states, but owing to its constant

politically hostile environment, this challenge became herculean and nearly impossible in Jammu and Kashmir. The focus of the administration never went towards local upliftment as they were always too busy ricocheting between one crisis or another. This in turn added fuel to the growing discontent in Kashmiris as their identity felt suppressed and later manipulated and eventually, used for political gains of a few. It was no surprise when J&K ranked amongst the poor performers in the tier-wise ranking index of Devolution Report 2015-2016. The state of Jammu and Kashmir initially encompassed a geographical area of 2,22,236 sq km (85,806 sq miles).

After Ladakh became a separate union territory in 2019, it is now only 42,241 km2. The geographical area is not the only thing that has been reduced in this region. Political instability, cross-border terrorism, and other hostile elements have all reduced its identity to that of an unsafe border state. Jammu and Kashmir in the last few years have seen major administrative changes from a state to a union territory and by the abrogation of article 370. However, what it has still not witnessed is the effective decentralization of political power even after years of establishment of provisions for setting up of local governing bodies in the form of panchayats.

The demand for autonomy has been echoing in the Kashmir valley for decades. In this wave of autonomy, the rural local self-rule discourse has been suppressed to the undercurrents. Ever since the enactment of the Jammu and Kashmir Panchayati Raj Act in 1989, only three successful elections excluding 2020 by-elections have been conducted so far. With the constantly uncertain political landscape of Jammu and Kashmir, providing local self-governance could be a respite to the general public, especially the drastically affected rural population. Gandhi's idea of village swaraj of providing complete republic, independent of neighbors for vital needs, yet interdependent for many other aspects, is a promising prospect to restore the faith of the general public of Jammu and Kashmir in the federal institutions in India. This local voice needs to be highlighted which has been subdued in the orchestra of radicalization, suppression, and violence-ridden politics that have largely shaped the political discourse and reputation of Jammu and Kashmir in recent decades.

CONTEMPORARY RELEVANCE OF GANDHISM

Mahatma Gandhi (1869-1948), an Indian activist and social philosopher, saw India's Independence and observed it as an opportunity "to wipe every tear from every eye". He had his heart set to transform the destiny of India through moral regeneration and wanted to establish India as a sovereign republic.


It was the time when India was under oppressive British rule, penury, vast socio-economic inequalities, and environmental degradation. Further, it was also in the clutches of communal tension and hatred. Gandhi preached spiritualism, ahimsa (non-violence), renunciation, the dignity of labor, satyagraha, truthfulness, and moral courage for the upliftment of individuals as well as society. In the present scenario, Gandhian Philosophy and ideologies are very much needed, though in some fields we're already practicing his ideas and values, no doubt we need to re-visit his sayings and enforce them at every level. When we talk about GANDHIJI the first thought that flashes across one's mind is 'simplicity' or to be precise, "simple living and high thinking", the idea that he lived by. This defines Gandhism and his objectives of transforming the individual and society very well. Therefore, in these troubled times where the world is haggling with so many problems, it becomes imperative to endeavor toward inculcating Gandhian values in various aspects of life and governance. Some prominent Gandhian ideologies need to be recognized at the global level as they have enlightened not only India but the whole world- TRUTH & NON-VIOLENCE: These two are the fundamental principles of Gandhism and are very relevant in the contemporary world where many countries and nations are going through war resulting in huge casualties of innocents of common people (as in Afghanistan & Russia-Ukraine war).

TRUTH: the core value of Gandhian ideology, which he followed throughout his life, believes that 'the truth empowers an individual whereas a lie weakens him from within'. This principle of body text truthfulness to self and the world is essential for every human in his life to accomplish his wishes and goals. Gandhi himself proved the non-violence of his thoughts by terminating the Non-Cooperation Movement, as soon as it turned violent

resulting in the Chauri-Chaura incident where the British officers were burnt alive by the people directing the movement and Gandhiji was detained. Gandhiji named his non-violent actions SATYAGRAHA which literally means "holding onto truth" to designate a determined but nonviolent resistance to evil. Satyagraha became a major tool in the Indian struggle against British imperialism and has since been adopted by protest groups in other countries. This ideal is extremely relevant in the present scenario where people don't even think once before harming others to claim their entitlements. SWADESHI: It is the other most important ideology of Gandhi Ji, the word swadeshi derives from Sanskrit and is a convergence of two Sanskrit words. 'Swa' means self or own and 'desh' means country. So Swadeshi means one's own country, but can be said in the context of self-sufficiency. Swadeshi is the focus on acting within and from one's community, both politically and economically. It reflects the interdependence of community and self-sufficiency.

Gandhian Idea of DECENTRALISATION of power should be implemented in Democracies empowering the local self-government at grass root level which is already in practice in India, the Indian government has been practising this idea by adopting to Panchayati raj and municipality system in rural and urban areas respectively. It has made governance easy and effective. Gandhiji always used to respect all religions. SECULARISM is another key component of his ideology. It's not only written in the Indian Constitution but also there in the society as a core value system. And this is the reason behind the Coexistence of diverse religions in India. The world today needs tolerance in the society to flourish and help people in neutralizing the business in the society that is taking place day by day based on religion and caste. Gandhi Ji was in favour of the Vedic system and thus supported the VARNA SYSTEM instead of the caste system, it is because in the Varna system people are assigned to certain varnas by their work, not the birth as in the caste system. And following his idea, he named lower people marijuana and to pay a token of respect he restricted himself by entering the premises of temples where lower caste people weren't allowed. And I'm sure it'll also lead to a decrease in the crime rate in present times if we implement it. Because the hatred for the other religion becomes the reason behind communalism and the riots arising out of fundamentalism.

SOCIALISM is another basic idea of Gandhism. Gandhian school of thought works as a lighthouse to the policymakers of the nation. And looking at the economy MNREGA (2005) is the best example of reducing the poverty in the nation, so somewhere we are practising his ideologies which clearly shows the relevance of Gandhi's thoughts in the Present day, but all we need is modifications and more concern. Also, Gandhi Ji made an emphasis on CLEANLINESS or SWACHHTAA and a few years back, the honourable prime minister of India introduced the biggest cleanliness drive of India named "Swach Bharat Abhiyaan" which there is an




KOREAN ENTERTAINMENT(A WHOLE NEW WORLD)



A remarkable film that brings out gory truth about Hindu genocide in the Valley

Thirty-one years ago, 1990 to be precise, half million Kashmiri Hindus were ethnically cleansed of Kashmiri Valley by marauding Islamic gangs. Brutal murders and rapes followed. Even a judge of the Srinagar High Court was shot in broad daylight. While the then Kashmir Chief Minister, Farooq Abdullah, completely abdicated his responsibility, perhaps one should say colluded with the gangs, 500,000 Kashmiri Hindus had no option but to leave or stay back and die.

Many died in squalid camps and most moved on with their lives with pitiable scanty support from the Indian government, picking on their lives and hoping one day to go back to their homes — the homes where their ancestors survived six earlier genocides. Even after 31 years, even after removal of laws that greatly contributed to this genocide, India has no solution to bring them back because it has lacked the courage to face the reality of Islamist fundamentalism and the courage to dismantle terror infrastructure. Worse, their story is hardly ever discussed openly in India even after 31 years, while any minor incident particularly that would portray Hindus in poor light turns into a high decibel campaign.

Filmmakers Vivek Agnihotri and his wife, Pallavi Joshi, have decided to change that. They have done what India has not done for 31 years — to show the real face of Kashmiri Hindu genocide in their film, The Kashmir Files, which is currently screened across many cities in the United States. The breadth and width of its coverage of Kashmiri Hindu genocide in the film even while being gentle to the capacity of the audience to take, is a feat by itself. This movie could not be possible without enormous painstaking research, but that is only one part of the story; how to take that and weave into a story to tell the truth, nothing but the complete truth in all its aspects, takes skills and one has to deeply admire Vivek and his team on their stupendous work. The movie deeply touches you, it touches a raw nerve, wakes you up from your deep slumber.

The film is the story of Kashmiri Hindus, but is also the saga of all Hindus and perhaps all persecuted societies of the world — whether it is Jews by Christian Germany, Christians in Turkey by the Islamic Ottoman empire, or the native religions of Americas and Africa by Christian West and systematic destruction of Muslims and their countries by Western deep state today. More importantly, it is the story of Hindu India, perhaps the most brutalised societies of the world by fundamentalist Abrahamic religions where according to some

estimates 80 million perished; it is the story of how a small community held on to its culture in spite of enormous travails; it is the story of the fountainhead of the most profound Hindu thought that originated in Kashmir that still is a beacon to all humanity; it is the story of spineless Indian governments and their whitewashing attitudes because they lack courage to face the reality.

It is the story of what happens if a society is not prepared to stand united and fight the brutal savages, trying to appease and negotiate with those who have nothing in mind other than your destruction. It is the story of Hindu rulers who have hardly learnt any lesson — from Prithviraj Chauhan releasing Mohammed Ghori and was later killed at the first opportunity, to the current BJP leadership like Ram Madhav who during his recent New Jersey programme boasted that the Centre could attract millions of visitors to Kashmir while it could not get few Hindus to live without fear.

It is the story of our political leadership competing with each other for minority appeasement and pandering. It is also the story of sacrificing our soldiers in the process of eliminating terrorists, but lacking courage (from the administration, judiciary, et al) to get to the root cause of terrorism. It is a continuous saga of death and destruction of the most advanced civilisation which is on its last thread of hope. Either it gears up to survive or be prepared to be perished in the not too distant a future.

The Kashmir Files is a movie that needs to be shown to one and all. It's a reminder to the threats the Indic civilisation is facing and how it's time we acted in a more resolute and forceful manner to deal with the threats it is — and has been — facing.

लोकतंत्र का गौरवः द्रौपदी मुर्मू

भारत दुनिया का सबसे बड़ा लोकतांत्रिक देश है और इस देश का सबसे बड़ा संवैधानिक पद है 'राष्ट्रपित पद' जो प्रत्येक भारतीय के लिए गौरव, सम्मान और अभिमान का विषय है। राष्ट्रपित भवन जिसमें राष्ट्रपित रहते हैं, न केवल राष्ट्रपित का आवास या ऑफिस है बल्कि यह वह जगह है जो आम नागरिकों की जन भावनाओं से जुड़ी है जहाँ उनका प्रतिनिधि भारत का प्रथम नागरिक रहता है। यही कारण है कि आम नागरिकों को राष्ट्रपित भवन देखने के लिए आमंत्रण दिया जाता है इसलिए जब भी कभी मौका मिले राष्ट्रपित भवन को जरूर देखना चाहिए जो राष्ट्र की धरोहर है। यहाँ इस संवैधानिक पद की चर्चा करना इसलिए भी आवश्यक हो जाता है क्योंकि इस बार संविधान की सबसे बड़ी सिपाही और भारत की प्रथम नागरिक महामहिम द्रौपदी मुर्मू। ऐसा किसी ने सोचा भी नहीं होगा कि दिल्ली से 2000 किलोमीटर दूर स्थित उड़ीसा के एक छोटे से गांव के एक बेहद साधारण स्कूल से शिक्षा प्राप्त करने वाली द्रौपदी मुर्मू एकदम असाधारण उपलब्धि हासिल कर के देश के सर्वोच्च संवैधानिक पद पर विराजमान होगी और देश की ही नहीं दुनिया की बेहतरीन इमारतों में शुमार किए जाने वाला राष्ट्रपित भवन उनका सरकारी आवास होगा।

भारत की 15वीं राष्ट्रपित के रूप में चुनी गईं महामिहम द्रौपदी मुर्मू देश की प्रथम मिहला राष्ट्रपित माननीय प्रतिभा देवी सिंह पाटिल के बाद देश की आज़ादी के बाद सबसे पहली आदिवासी राष्ट्रपित और सबसे कम उम्र की राष्ट्रपित भी हैं। द्रौपदी मुर्मू उड़ीसा के मयूरभंज जिले की कुसमी तहसील के बैडापोसी गांव में एक संथाल जनजाति से ताल्लुक रखती हैं। वे मिहलाओं का प्रतिनिधित्व करने के साथ-साथ देश की कुल आबादी के लगभग 8.5 प्रतिशत भी ज्यादा के तीन बड़े आदिवासी समुदायों भील, गोंड़ और संथाल का प्रतिनिधित्व करती हैं। उन्होंने एक अध्यापिका के रूप में अपने करियर की शुरुआत की और उसके बाद धीरे-धीरे राजनीति में आ गई। अपने पित और दो बेटों के निधन के बाद द्रोपदी मुर्मू ने अपने घर में ही स्कूल खोल दिया जहां वह बच्चों को पढ़ाती थी। उस बोर्डिंग स्कूल में आज भी बच्चे शिक्षा ग्रहण करते हैं। उनकी एकमात्र जीवित संतान उनकी पुत्री है जो भुवनेश्वर में रहती हैं। संथाली और उड़िया भाषाओं की अच्छी ज्ञाता भी हैं। झारखंड की पहली महिला राज्यपाल बनने का खिताब भी द्रौपदी मुर्मू के नाम ही है।

जहां एक तरफ द्रौपदी मुर्मू के राष्ट्रपति बनने पर दुनिया भर के नेताओं ने इसे भारतीय लोकतंत्र की जीत करार दिया है। एक आदिवासी महिला का राष्ट्रपति जैसे पद पर पहुंचना भारतीय लोकतंत्र बात का भी प्रमाण है कि चयन नहीं बल्कि व्यक्ति के प्रयास उसकी नियति तय करते हैं। वहीँ दूसरी तरफ जातिगत दुर्भावना से प्रेरित इंडिया टुडे के जनरल मैनेजर इंदिरानिल चटर्जी ने फेसबुक पर राष्ट्रपति की यह कहकर इंसल्ट की है कि "मैं आदिवासी प्रेसिडेंट को सपोर्ट नहीं करता...कुछ सीटें सभी के लिए नहीं बनी है... क्या अब स्वीपर सरस्वती की पूजा करेंगे?... इससे न केवल हम सबको अपमानित होना पड़ा है बल्कि रायसीना हिल्स के कुछ आत्माओं को भी अपमानित होना पड़ा है।" द्रौपदी मुर्मू के भारत की पहली आदिवासी राष्ट्रपति बनने के कितने ही अर्थ लगाए जाएं लेकिन इस बात में कोई दो राय नहीं है कि वह जाति और सांस्कृतिक रूप से दुनिया के सबसे अनोखे देश के लोकतांत्रिक सफर में एक खूबसूरत पड़ाव है। द्रौपदी मुर्मू का इस समय राष्ट्रपति बनना इसलिए भी बेहद खास है क्योंकि एक ओर जहाँ महिलायें जीवन के हर क्षेत्र में सफलता प्राप्त कर रही हैं और देश के शीर्ष पदों पर पहुंचने में कामयाब हो रही हैं वहीँ दूसरी ओर उनके खिलाफ हिंसा और जातिगत उत्पीड़न की घटनाएं लगातार बढ़ती जा रही हैं। ऐसे में एक महिला राष्ट्रपति और समाज के हाशिये पर मौजूद समुदाय का प्रतिनिधि होने के नाते द्रौपदी मुर्मू की जिम्मेदारी और भी बढ़ जाती है। आमजन की निगाहें अपने नए प्रतिनिधि की ओर टिकी हैं। क्योंकि बाबासाहेब डॉ. बी. आर. अम्बेडकर ने कहा था कि,

"किसी समाज की तरक्की मैं इस बात से मानता हूँ कि उस देश की महिलाओं ने कितनी तरक्की की है।"




