The very first session of the remarkable "CAREER CHARCHA" series was conducted on August 29, 2021. Several notable alumni who pursued their masters from diverse renowned colleges in varied fields of interest within Economics were invited to enlighten the students of The Economics Department of Kalindi College on subsequent careers and their respective experiences. The ten eloquent speakers that were courteously invited had studied at Delhi School of Economics (DSE), Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI)

, Madras School of Economics (MSE) , The Indian Statistical Institute (ISI) , Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (GGSIPU) and Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics (GIPE).

The lively session started modestly with a brief introduction by our hosts. The webinar commenced with a notable alumni, Akanksha Dua who pursued her masters from JMI, currently working as Assistant Director at Food Safety & Security Authority of India (FSSAI). She regaled the attendees with her own experiences in the college and her overall journey so far post her graduation from The University of Delhi. The speaker appropriately addressed various considerable doubts and queries that were put forward by the audience. The considerable doubts that were posed ranged from sheer confusions regarding college selections to complex ones like how to conduct yourself in professional settings, etc. The insights provided by her were informative, practical and connected the dots for all the queries and questions raised.

The next speaker was Chakshu Jain who gallantly did her masters from JNU and currently works as Lead Assistant Manager at EXL. Her inputs were equally informative and addressed various distinct sorts of queries. The other speakers that followed were Puja Uppal and Nikita Jain from MSE, both of whom now work at Infosys and Skoch Consultancy, respectively. They were patient in talking eloquently to the attendees and guided them well regarding prospects in the concerned fields.



"Research Paper Writing for Beginners"


The Student Editorial Board of Kalindi Economics Society organized a session on 'Research Paper Writing for Beginners', on 11th September 2021, for the research enthusiasts of the college. Ms. Debanjali Dasgupta, a Ph.D. Scholar and Graduate Teaching Assistant at the University of Tennessee, USA, was the speaker for the session. Ms. Debanjali's dissertation titled "Sustainability Performance of the Indian Cement Industry" has been published in Clean Technologies and Environmental Policy and another paper is under review in an International Journal. The speaker enlightened the audience by giving valuable insights on the procedure of writing a good research paper and stressed the importance of a publication for admission to foreign universities. The session started by highlighting the importance of research writing. Ms. Dasgupta mentioned that one should seek proper guidance from their professors and should be clear about the topic and aim of his /her research & how the study adds to the current literature.


Furthermore, she accentuated the point that a researcher should select a topic that interests him/her and should have exhaustive knowledge about other research papers on that topic along with being well organized and structured about the process. Ms. Debanjali emphasized the importance of the correct structure of the research paper. She also introduced the audience to the importance of literature review by citing her own experience with the publications.

Ms. Dasgupta also mentioned a few last-minute tips for the audience which involved checking for citations, grammatical errors, steering clear of the fancy words, and inclusion of graphs and tables. She also gave instructions on how to prepare the graphs and tables on powerpoint to avoid any last-minute complications. Our speaker introduced the audience to software that can be used for drafting the research paper, namely 'Latex', used extensively in the USA, and also mentioned how guidelines are different for every journal, and non-adherence can lead to a rejection from the respective publication house.

After the presentation was completed by Ms. Dasgupta, the house was open for questions from the audience, and needless to mention, the Q&A session attracted several intriguing questions from the audience, ranging from the choice of topics to papers written in the group along with questions from students with a non-economical background.

The event turned out to be a huge success as students from various courses joined in and interacted with the speaker during the Q&A session wherein their questions were answered in a very coherent manner by the speaker. We received extremely good feedback from the audience mentioning that the event helped the students increase their knowledge regarding research paper writing as compared to their understanding of this topic prior to the session. The nature of the content offered by the speaker, Ms. Debanjali Dasgupta was impressive and very informative. The overall response suggested we conduct similar events in the future. Ms. Debanjali was delighted to share her experiences with us and the evening ended with the Faculty Advisor of the Editorial Board, KaCES, Ms.Pummy Yadav giving a vote of thanks to our guest speaker, followed by a virtual photography session.



Meghnad Desai Academy for Economics, for the data enthusiasts of the college. The speaker for the session was Ms. Sandhya Krishnan, a Ph.D. Scholar at the University of Amsterdam and an Assistant professor. The speaker has completed her graduation in Economics from the University of Mumbai. Ms. Krishnan is providing courses in Applied Econometrics and Development Economics. Ms. Sandhya has published papers in journals such as the Economic and Political Weekly and with publishing houses such as Routledge.

The speaker enlightened the audience with the procedure of analysing big data sets, and stressed the importance of machine learning and data analytical tools in our lives.

The session started by highlighting the importance of big data sets and the use of maths in every discipline. Ms. Krishnan mentioned that one should seek proper access to basic tools and knowledge of predicting it. She also brought into our knowledge the fact how Amazon, Netflix and all the big brands keep a track of our activities with the help of data science. Stressing about the increase in digitalisation of data with technology and the use of data science in the Covid-19 scenario, she stressed the gravity of machine learning.

The speaker started the session with an open question asking the difference between wants, needs and desires and interacted with the audience in full swing. The zealous participants interacted with the speaker enthusiastically.



Report on "<u>DEMYSTIFYING GRE</u>" Session Date: October 31, 2021; Sunday Platform: Google Meet

Kalindi College Economics Society, KaCES, organized an interactive session on 'DeMystifying GRE' on 31st October 2021, for all those who plan on pursuing higher studies from abroad. The speakers for the session were college alumni.

Ms. Medha Malviya, batch of 2009, is now an employee at Ecofitt Corp. as an Office Administrator. Ms. Medha has done Masters in Resource and Environmental Management from Dalhousie University, Canada.

Another speaker was Ms. Ashima Munjal, batch of 2018, currently working as a Data Scientist at Fractal Analytics. She went to Stevens Institute of Technology, New York, USA pursuing Master's in Business Intelligence and Analytics. She briefed us about the GRE procedures, benefits of a strong SOP, and internship certificates and reference letters.

Another speaker was Meghna Aggarwal, batch of 2021, who will be pursuing MSc in Development Economics and Policy Making, erelong, from the University of Manchester, England.

She was keen on highlighting a lot of technicalities that an individual might encounter going forward with their GRE preparations. She was keen on answering quite a lot of wide-ranging queries from an equally curious audience. She briefed regarding the format of the paper and how much time one can devote for the same, quoting her own experiences and preparatory tips. She highlighted a lot of facts from myths and explained how a calm demeanor rather than an anxious one can help individuals score decent scores. She reiterated how an SOP forms an important part of applying to universities abroad and how a good SOP can help you safely secure a seat in your desired College/University.

She explained which colleges she applied to abroad and in England specifically that aligned more with the kind of master's degree she wanted to pursue. It helped the audience understand how the process goes about from narrowing down the kind of degree or knowledge one might want to go for to choose the specific colleges or universities to the financial aspects of it all.


Miss Ashima continued the session forward by separating facts from myths and calmed the audience's nerves in a way through her own experiences at Stevens Institute of technology. She highlighted how her first semester there involved a lot of practical experiences, networking with all sorts of individuals and professionals and how professors encourage a diverse crowd of students coming from different countries.

She iterated how visa procedures in The USA can be cumbersome but how at the same time one needs to be proactive and not really let the technical aspects involved tire you. Financial advice formed a core part of her talk too. In that, she highlighted how varied scholarships can come really useful in securing education at universities abroad and how one needs to be mindful of their financial decisions too while going forward in this direction.

All in all, the speakers guided the audience very well and were open to any further correspondence regarding any doubts or queries unanswered. The session delivered well on its objectives and helped the audience get a wider perspective on not only the different paths alumni have taken but also of how varied opportunities are around and abound.




















CLOSING CEREMONY KaCES, Economics Society Kalindi College, DU
