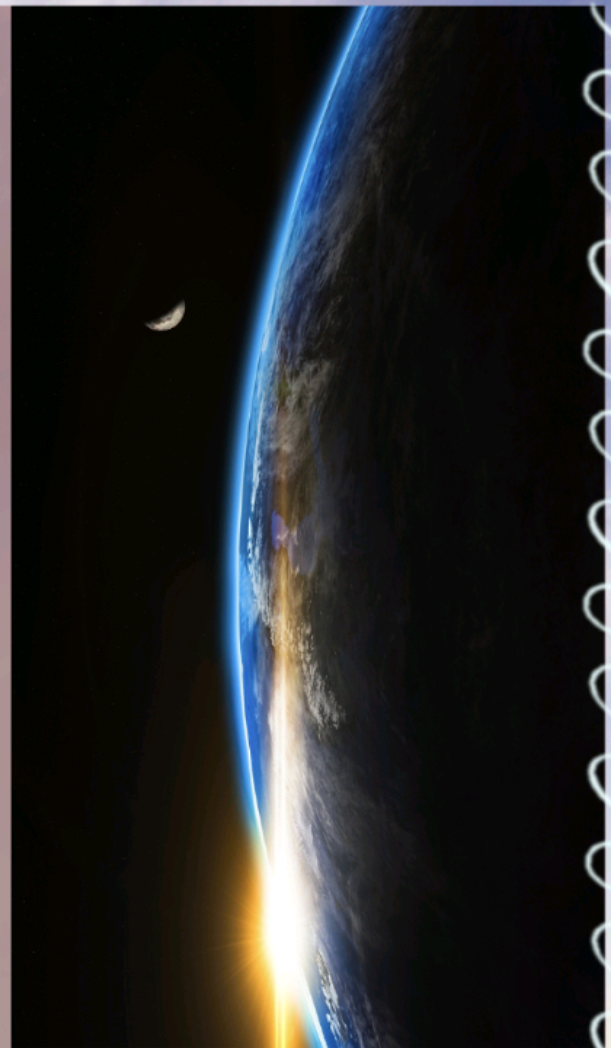
This earth is neither mine nor

All the activities saw an overwhelming response with over 200 students across various colleges and departments participating in multiple events.

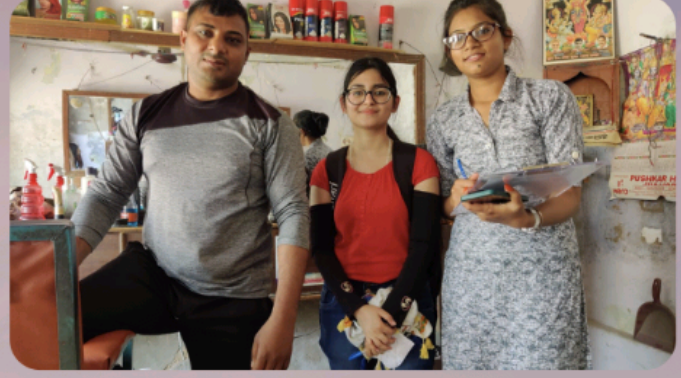
All the winners of their respective competitions were presented with certificates of appreciation along with gift vouchers by Dr. Seema Sahdev.

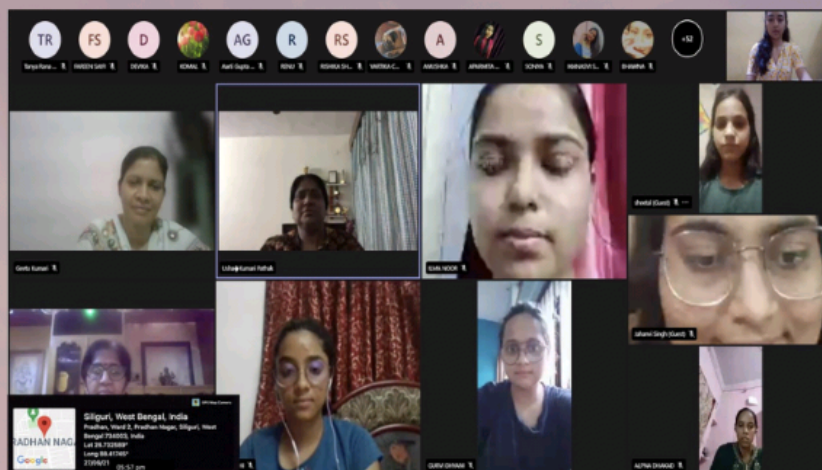

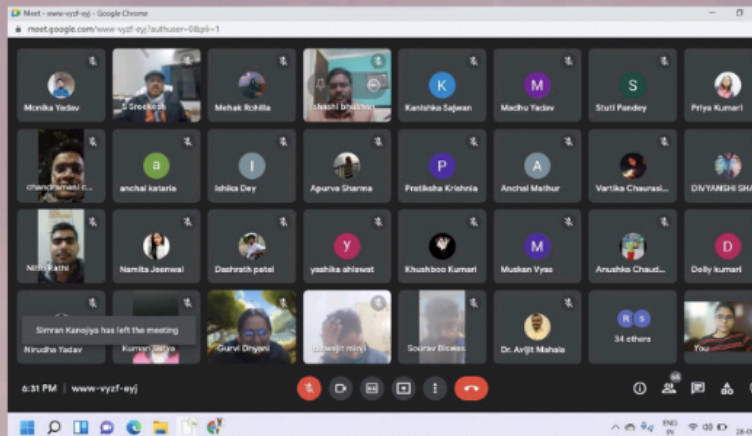

He started by introducing Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) and the various projects and programs. He explained the scope of travel and tourism, covering the stature of the tourism industry and ways through which students can take up travel and tourism as a career. and tourism sector. After delivering his lecture he solved the various queries that students had to make the field clearer to them. EVENT 2:- COASTAL EROSION AND ACCRETION : ASSESSMENT THROUGH GEOSPATIAL TECHNIQUES EVENT



Date & Day – 28 January 2022, Friday

Time – 05:00 pm

Venue – Google Meet

The Guest Speaker- DR. S. Sreekish, is an Associate Professor at the CSRD, SSS, Jawaharlal Nehru University.

Palak Verma welcomed all the students and teachers to the webinar and explained the main motive of the webinar, Monika welcomed DR. S.Sreekish to the webinar , Dr. Seema Sahdev (TIC, Department of Geography, Kalindi College) gives the inaugural message , Dr. Avijit Mahala (Associate Professor, Department of Geography) introduced the guest speaker . Then DR. S. Sreekish Sir starts the webinar.

DR. S. Sreekish is here to tell us about GIS and Geospatial techniques and how they are bringing a fresh perspective in the environmental studies.

The webinar had 3 sections in all: Why Coastal Erosion Studies, Coastal Landforms, Applications of Geo-spatial Techniques in Coastal Erosion & Accretion Studies.

First of all DR. S. Sreekish explained why the coastal erosion and accretion matters, through some graphs, diagrams and theory which contains length of shoreline under erosion, accretion & stable along the Indian coastline. Then he explained the 3 principle coastal processes: Erosion, Transportation & Deposition and explained them, that includes Beach profile, Wave action, Sea-cliff.

Later he explained the causes of coastal transportation, coastal landforms, coastal erosional landforms: cliffs, coastal depositional landforms, barrier island formation.

Then he explained the term Digital coastline Analysis from the example of Western coast of India, various images were shown describing the shorelines at different coastal locations, different databases and graphs were shown. Corona and orbview images of Ernakulam district, pattern of shoreline change, shoreline dynamics and coastal geology were explained through the images and graphs. Artificial Accretion of Ernakulam district, Munambam, Vypin island was explained.

At last the Erosion control measures were explained.

In the last the questionnaire session was held in which teachers as well as students asked their doubts to DR. S Sreekish.

Dr. Shashi Bhushan (Associate Professor, Department of Geography) expressed the vote of thanks to the speaker.

It was attended by over 100 students across several colleges.

The webinar came to an end at 6:45 p.m.

them in detail. A fun game was later conducted and the graduated students spoke to the

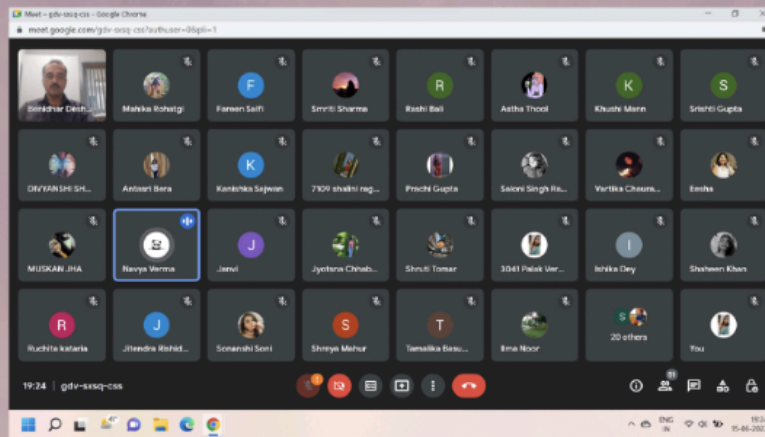
A fun segment of games was also conducted.

EVENT 4:- VALUE ADDED COURSE



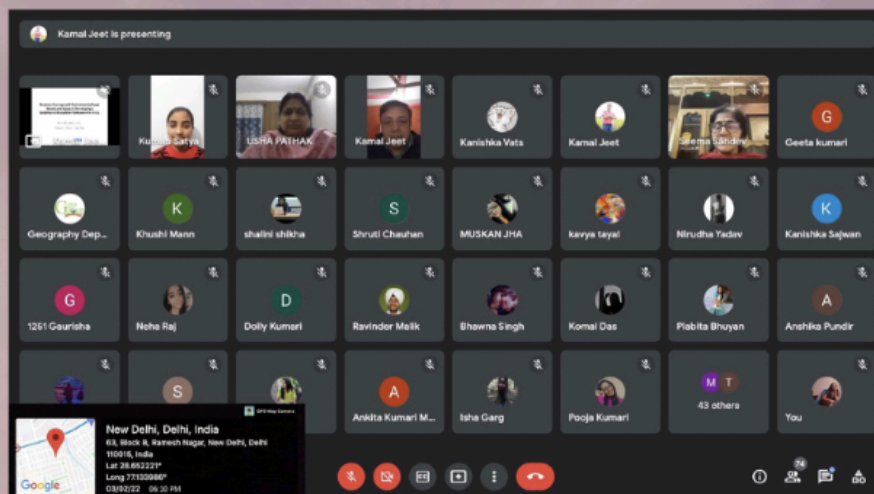
Value added course organized by geography department, the course coordinator was Dr. Seema Sahdev and course co-coordinator was Dr. Jitendra Rishideo. The course started on 15th June with four resource persons - Dr. Benidhar Deshmukh, Mr. Rohitash Kumar, Mr. Sourish Chatterjee, Dr. Sitendra Malik. This was a free of cost course with weekly tests and certificates after successful completion of the course. The course started with Dr. Benidhar Deshmukh with 1.5 hours classes every day from 15th June to 18th June.

He taught unit 1 (Geoinformatics: An introduction. Recent trends, geoinformatics in India) and unit 2 (Remote sensing-based land use: Land cover mapping for resource monitoring and management and sustainable development of natural resource). It was a very informative class with ppt's and notes given by sir. The test was taken on 16th and 18th respectively, which evaluated how the students were doing. The next resource person who taught us was Mr. Rohitash Kumar with 1.5 hours classes everyday from 19th June to 20th June. He taught us unit 3 (Natural resource mapping and change detection study using temporal satellites data). It was a practical class with discussion with the teacher and students. The resource person gave us a very detailed view on this unit. The test was taken on the 20th

The next resource person who taught us was Mr. Sourish Chatterjee with 1.5 classes every day from 21st June and 22nd June. He taught us unit 4 (Mapping of forest density and type, issues in forest management). This class gave us a detailed idea on how forest is being managed and more specifically in India. Ppt's and pdfs were given for us to study and the test of the same was taken on 22nd June.

The last resource person who taught us was Dr. Sitendra Malik with 1.5 hours classes every day from 23rd June and 30th June. He taught us unit 5 (Mapping urban land-use, transportation network and utility facility mapping), unit 6 (Multiple hazard mapping using satellite images and modelling risk in GIS), unit 7 (Utility-facility mapping for regional development analysis in GIS) and unit 8 (Application of geoinformatics for identification of waste disposal sites). This unit was very helpful to understand GIS and its different works. Sir also provided us with ppt's which were easily understandable and the class was also very understandable and easy to follow. The test was taken on 26th June and 30th June. The course ended with the resource person wishing good luck and a screenshot taken at the end of the class and daily attendance was also recorded. Many students successfully completed the course.

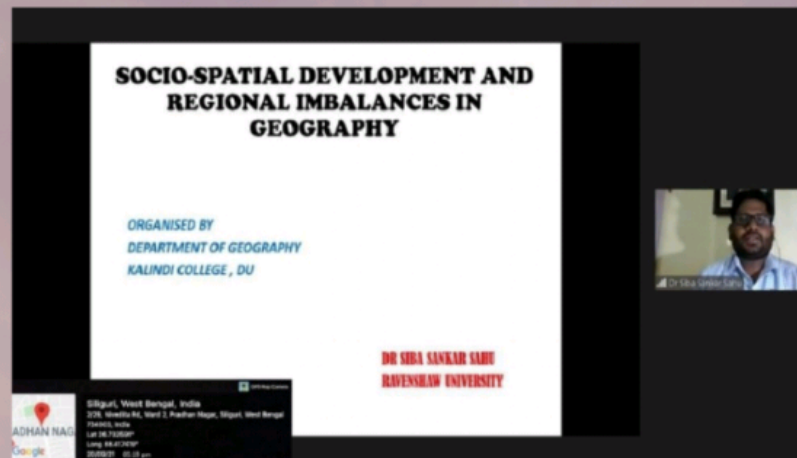

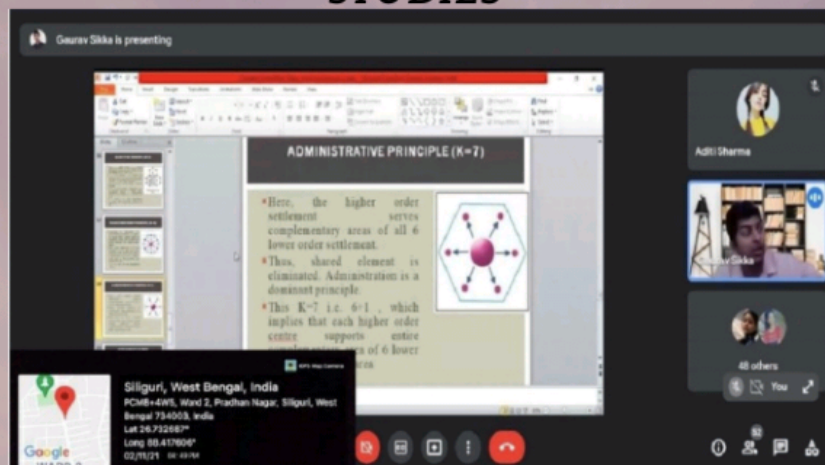

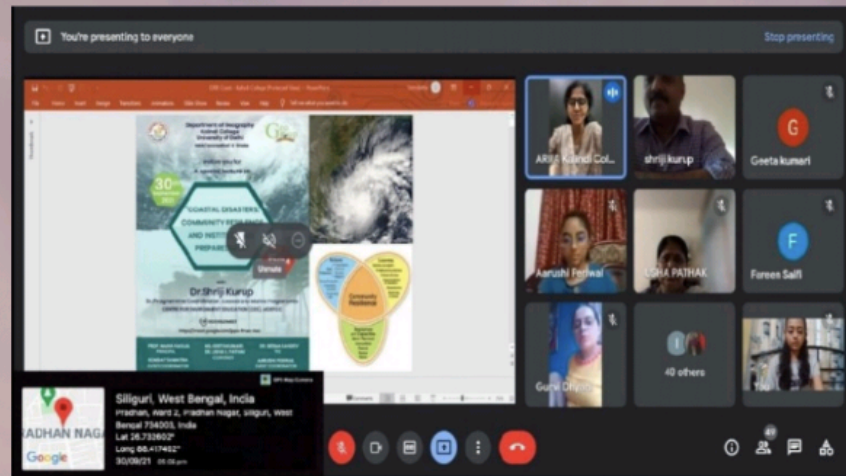
