यदि प्राचीन भारतीय समाज को समानता और सामंजस्य पर आधारित माना जाता है, तो ऋग्वेद के पुरुष सूक्त में वर्ण के उल्लेख को कैसे समझा जाना चाहिए ?

ऋग्वेद के पुरुष सूक्त में वर्ण का उल्लेख प्रतीकात्मक और कार्य-आधारित सामाजिक विभाजन के रूप में किया गया है, जिसका उद्देश्य समाज में विभिन्न भूमिकाओं और उत्तरदायित्वों के माध्यम से सामाजिक सामंजस्य को दर्शाना था, न कि जन्म-आधारित ऊँच-नीच या असमानता को स्थापित करना।

लेकिन सर, फिर मनुस्मृति में वर्ण से संबंधित नियमों की व्याख्या आधुनिक सामाजिक असमानताओं के संदर्भ में कैसे की जानी चाहिए?

मनुस्मृति एक विशिष्ट ऐतिहासिक और सामाजिक संदर्भ में रचित स्मृति ग्रंथ है, जो अपने समय की सामाजिक संरचना को प्रतिबिंबित करता है। इसे संपूर्ण भारतीय समाज का शाश्वत प्रतिनिधि नहीं माना जा सकता। अतः आधुनिक सामाजिक असमानताओं को सीधे मनुस्मृति से जोड़ना एक संदर्भ-विहीन आधुनिक व्याख्या है, न कि प्राचीन भारतीय समाज की मूल विचारधारा का प्रतिबिंब।

इन प्रश्नों का उद्देश्य किसी भी विचारधारा को ठेस पहुंचाना नहीं है।

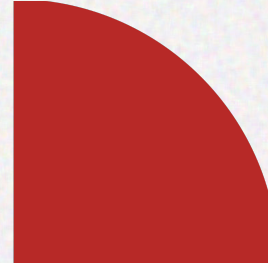
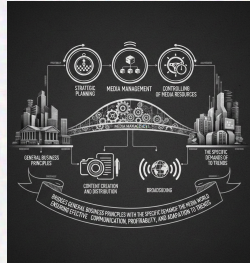

Or am I something worse?

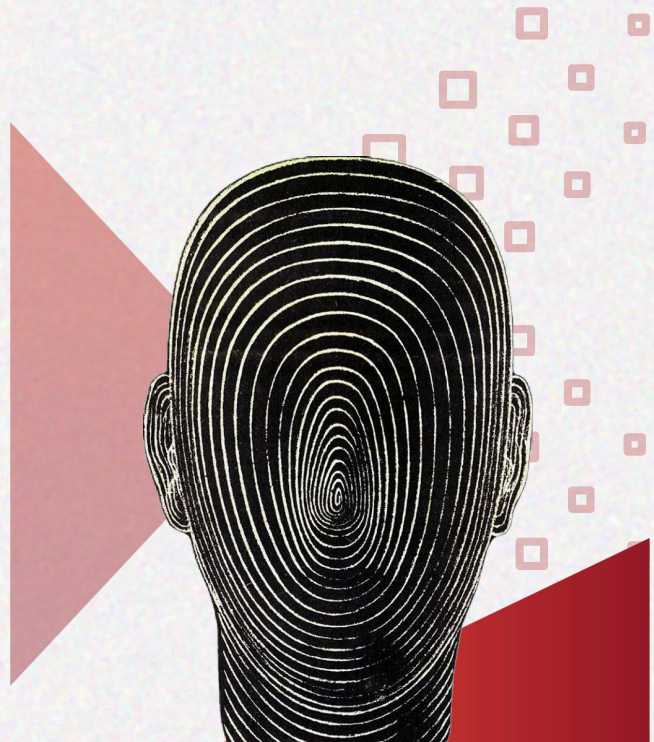

and birth our own devils in the dark.

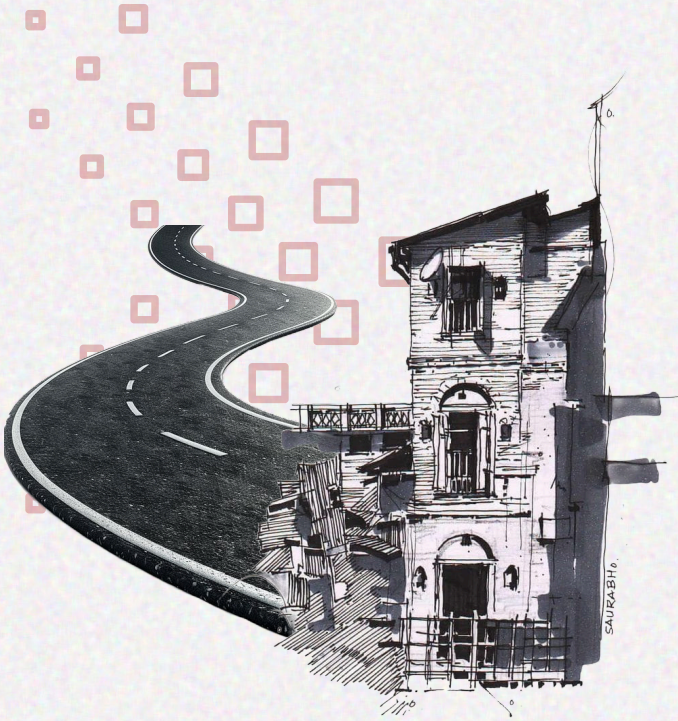
How to Earn Money As a Student Without Investment ?

बचपन अक्सर हँसी, खेल और बेफ़िक्र दिनों से जुड़ा होता है, लेकिन हर बच्चा ऐसा बचपन नहीं जी पाता। घर में झगड़े, माता-पिता की डाँट, स्कूल में होने वाली बुलिंग या ऑनलाइन ताने बच्चों पर ऐसी गहरी छाप छोड़ते हैं, जो बड़े होकर भी उनके साथ रहती है। इन चोटों की कोई आवाज़ नहीं होती, लेकिन उनका असर बेहद गहरा होता है। AIIMS के प्रोफेसर डॉ. राजेश सागर कहते हैं, “वयस्क मानसिक बीमारियों के 50% से अधिक मामलों की शुरुआत 14 साल की उम्र से पहले ही हो जाती है। ये वही साल हैं जब बच्चा दुनिया को समझना, दोस्ती करना और अपने आत्मविश्वास की नींव बनाना सीखता है। अगर यही नींव हिल जाए, तो पूरा जीवन प्रभावित होता है।”

कई संवेदनशील बच्चे छोटी-सी बात को भी दिल पर ले लेते हैं और चुपचाप अपने भीतर डर और तनाव दबाते रहते हैं।
