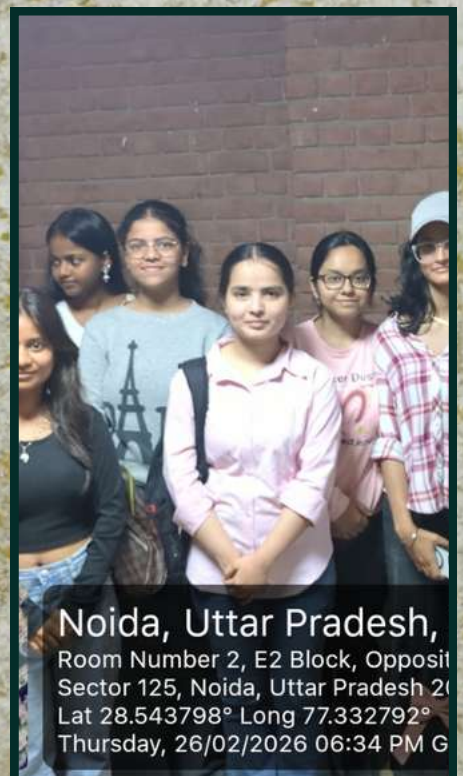

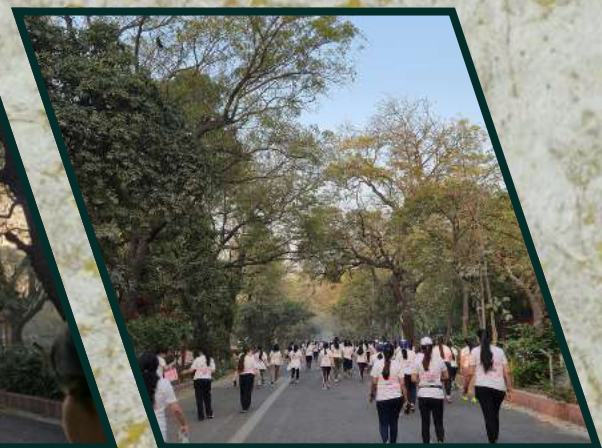


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PINKATHON

Day 7- 20th March, 2026

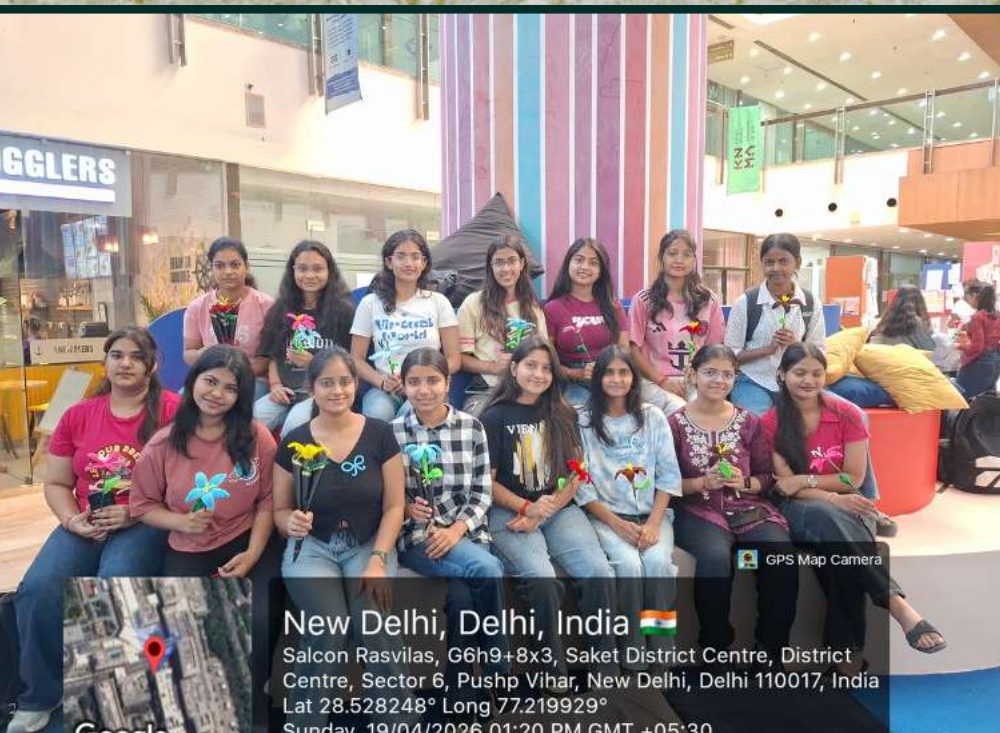
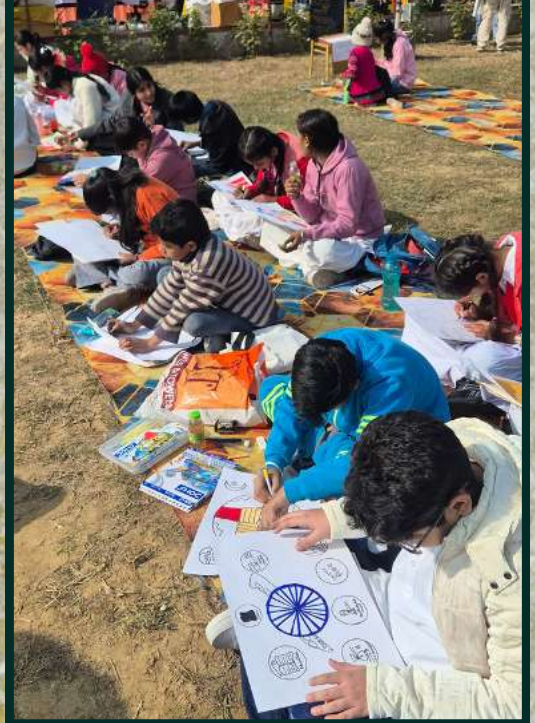
Theme- Annual Fest

Children's Day Event with TKC

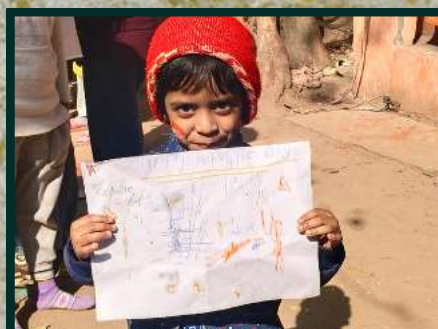

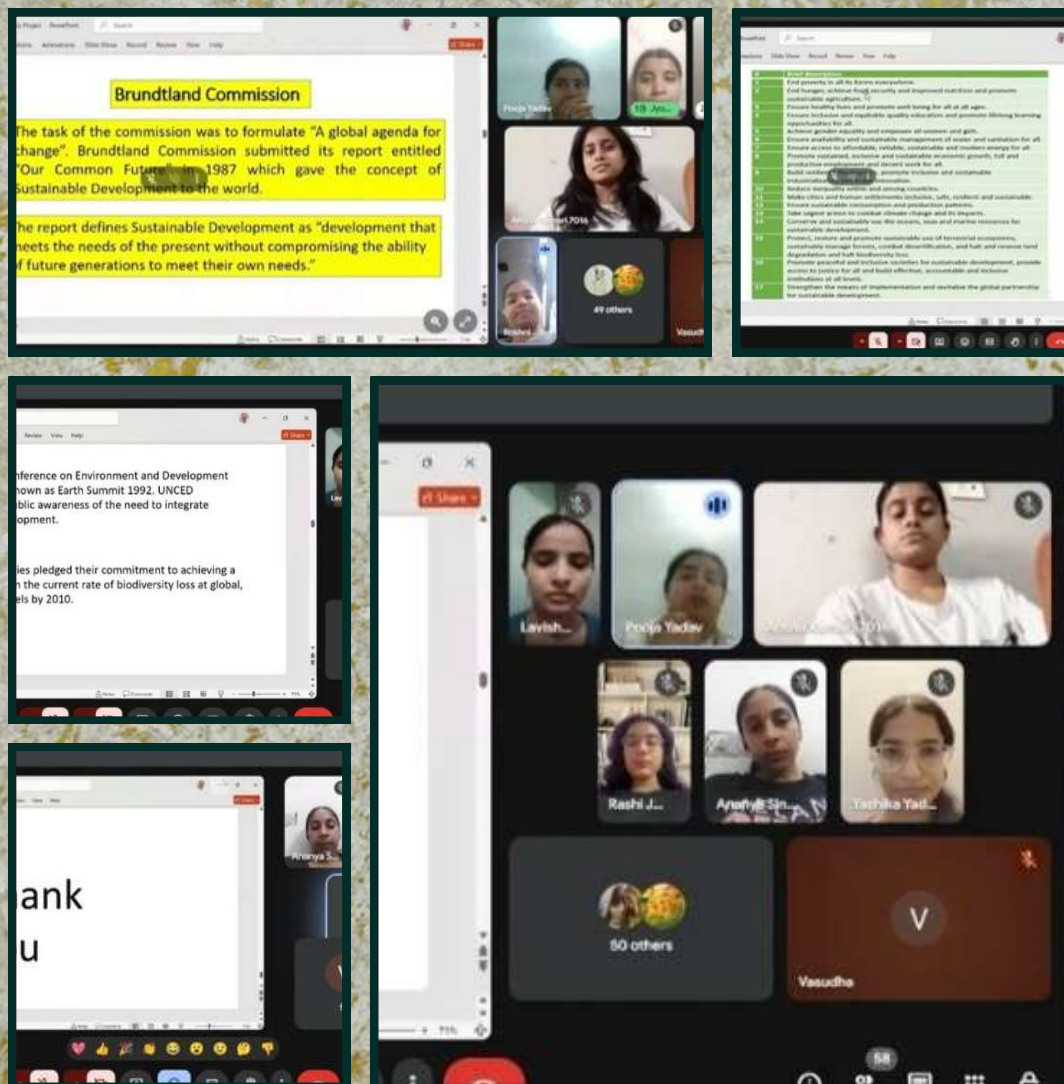
